UM's vast new campus runs 'similarly to a city'

AFTER one year of operation of the University of Macau (UM)'s new Hengqin campus, Rui Martins rejects allegations that students and staff are more isolated in their new surroundings.

"You can't even notice that you are outside Macau," UM's Vice-Rector (Research) says, rebutting accusations made by some on campus, who claim that the transport network and infrastructure remain insufficient.

Rui Martins says the fact that residents visit on weekends to enjoy the parks demonstrates that the space belongs to the city. He argues that the cam-


Designed by Chinese architect He Jingtang (who designed the emblematic Chinese pavilion for the Shanghai World Expo in 2010, along with several universities in China), the campus was deemed similar to others designed by the architect, namely Nanjing Audit University (NAU).

Martins: Academic freedom upheld

"It's only natural that some similarities should appear," bearing in mind the fact that He Jingtang has designed several campuses. However, the vice-rector says that the project features characteristics related to Macau and its history. He gives as examples the use of typical South China Lin'an roofs, European arches and Portuguese paving. "We [UM] managed to have the architect adapt his design, and I believe that the final result is suitable," Rui Martins says.

Twenty times bigger than the UM Taipa campus, the Hengqin infrastructure is ex-



pected to serve up to 13,000 students by 2021, almost 3,000 more than it hosts presently.

Rui Martins remarks that the campus is working similarly to a city that is growing gradually and steadily. The 10,000-student mark should be achieved in the 2016/2017 school year.

With the vast new campus, UM has entered a new era of residential college education. Presently, eight residential colleges accommodate 3,500 students, and four new colleges are expected to open.

Among those completing degrees at the university, 80 percent of the students are locals, and the rest are largely from mainland China. With the number of local students decreasing, UM expects to attract overseas students in regions and countries like Hong Kong, Taiwan, Malaysia, India and others.

The campus also hosts 360 scholars (out of a total of 557) and has the capacity to host 800. Rui Martins states that the board of professors is "increasingly qualified," although he admits that the salary cap imposed by the civil servants' regime hinders the hiring of reputed scholars.

According to present rules, a professor can earn a maximum of MOP86,900, a value that can only be surpassed in exceptional cases and after approval of the university board. According to Rui Martins, that may change this year after a new university regiment is approved. **MDT/Lusa**

HE University of Macau (UM) failed to better manage public resources when granting housing units to staff who already owned a home, a Commission of Audit report shows.

"UM's actions are a clear breaching of the government's social housing policy principle, while going against the principle of good management of public resources," it reads.

Through the report, the commission raised criticism over how UM has handled public funds, particularly when it has come to managing its staff housing system, as well as when it created a research institute in Zhuhai, and in regards to the University of Macau Development Foundation.

The commission found irregularities in UM's staff housing scheme, which allows a group of professionals, who work under specific duties, to be granted a housing unit without the need to pay rent. Data collected by CA shows that until May 2014, 217 UM employees holding Macau IDs were granted housing units, although 32 of them already owned a home in the city. Five of them actually owned two houses, the report stressed.

In response to the CA's report, the university said in a press release that it "follows the principle of spending public money properly to make sure that the allocation of resources can best serve the university's development objectives."

"In response to the staff housing system mentioned in the report, UM stresses that on-campus housing is not meant as a social benefit; it was designed to meet the needs of the university's development, and to facilitate the university's pursuit of academic excellence," UM clarified.

The university stressed that its housing system "is in line with the usual practice of higher education institutions worldwide," as it aims to improve the university's competitiveness in the market,

while also encouraging staff to stay on campus "so that they can have more time to interact with students."

The CA report also questions the university's actions in establishing the UMacau Research Institute Zhuhai, which was registered as a "private, non-business entity." According to the report, the legal framework used to create the institute ended up preventing it from applying for supporting funds by not meeting certain requirements.

The UM said that the institute was registered as a "private non -business entity" due to the lack of laws or regulations in mainland China governing non-profit organizations in Zhuhai established by governmental departments or public organizations from Macau.

Nevertheless, the university acknowledged that "some aspects of the establishment of the research institute may not have been handled very appropriately, so it submitted a report to the University Council in late 2014, and has signed an agreement with the research institute to legally make sure that UM has strict control and supervision over the research institute."

The report also criticized the legal framework behind the establishment of the University of Macau Development Foundation (UMDF), which was created in 2009 as a legal person (under private law). Therefore, UM itself is not part of this foundation, and does not have capacity to intervene or to supervise the foundation,

the CA report stressed.

In addition, the report shows that donations to the university can be given through the foundation, but that the entities do not have any legal relation.

The university said that it welcomes the CA's suggestions on the UMDF. UM also says that it will ponder "the possibility of adopting the suggestions that the UMDF be established by UM as the founder, in accordance with the Civil Code, or that the UMDF should be established by a selfgoverning body through [respective] legislation."

The university concluded by stating that "the rights and interests of the university have not suffered any damage."

The Secretary for Social Affairs and Culture, Alexis Tam, said vesterday that he would be requesting that UM clarify the issues mentioned in the report. He recalled that as the university is a public entity, it needs to abide by the law and regulations, and therefore cannot waste public money, as reported on Radio Macau. CP

IACM to roll out one-off wholesaling

Other opinions detailed in the consultation report include the suggestion that the government should further regulate fresh food prices in the wholesale market. The Civic and Municipal Affairs Bureau's executive committee president, Alex Vong, said that the Bureau has also received opinions saying that businesses cannot operate in the wholesale market due to a lack of space. He said that, after discussion with the industry, the government is considering rolling out a oneoff wholesaling mechanism. The mechanism would allow businesses that want to participate in wholesaling in Macau, but do not own a stall in the wholesale market, to have their fresh produce quarantined like other regular wholesalers. Vong believes that this will increase the supply of vegetables to Macau, and eventually lower their prices. The president stressed that the same quarantine procedure would be implemented on both one-off and regular wholesalers. They are also required to make their transaction within the wholesale market. In addition, Vong predicts that the construction of the new threestory-tall wholesale market will finish in 2017, and will attract new wholesalers to join the market.

Gov't flags expansion of Consumer Council authority

THE Macau government's inter-departmental task group, responsible for reviewing local consumer protection legislation, has released a consultation conclusion report. The group has found that the majority of opinions support the further empowerment of the Consumer Council by allowing it to collect and release business information through future legislation. However, the officials did not specify the scope of the consumer watchdog's new powers.

The task group was formed by the Legal Affairs Bureau, the Civic and Municipal Affairs Bureau and the Consumer Council. The consultation took place between June 12 and August 12 last year, and received 543 opinions and suggestions.

The majority of opinions express agreement with the idea of legislating against various illegal trading behaviors, such as the abuse of market ascendancy and price collusion. The report also indicates overwhelming support for the protection of consumers'



right to information by giving the Consumer Council the authority to acquire business information from enterprises.

The report says that the public generally realize that the abuse of market ascendancy is motivated by the acquisition of unjustified economic benefits. Subsequently, the public also recognize that this behavior will strangle market competition, which will lead to fewer consumption choices and higher prices. Therefore, the report has proposed that such behaviors be penalized with a relatively large fine. The report also says that a detailed regulation will be produced that will help businesses to understand the boundaries of future legislation.

The report also called for legislation to monitor price collusion. It suggested that, like the abuse of market ascendancy, price collusion should be penalized with a relatively large fine.

Moreover, the report mentioned that a majority of the collected opinions agreed with bestowing on the Consumer Council the power to collect data regarding the consumption of goods and services, such as the mechanism for determining their prices. However, the report said that the Council should only publish this data in a way that will allow consumers to discover the general trend of the market, instead of disclosing the wholesaling or procuring prices set by individual businesses.

During a press conference yesterday, the Consumer Council's executive committee acting president, Chan Hon Seng, revealed that some opinions the authorities collected during the consultation period have described the Council as a "toothless tiger." Mr Chan said that the Council wants to take up the role of umpire in the future, and will "resolutely penalize" any rule-breaching parties. Nevertheless, he stressed that Macau's law still maintains a free market principle, and that the authorities can only intervene in a moderate manner.

Furthermore, when asked about the time frame for legislation or amendments as proposed by the report, the Legal Affairs Bureau director, Liu Dexue, only promised to launch the legislative procedure "as soon as possible." The officials also failed to give any details on what new powers the Consumer Council will be given.

Over 31,000 non-resident workers were forced to leave Macau for a period of six months, data collected by the Public Security Police (PSP) shows. A significant number of these non-resident workers left Macau over the past two years, since a new law governing the recruitment of imported labor came into force in 2010.

Between April 2010 and January this year, 31,012 non-resident workers were not allowed to work in Macau for a period of six months. The measure was applied to 12,285 non-resi-



dent workers last year, and to 10,060 in 2013.

The law on imported labor allows the Macau government to refuse to issue a new stay permit to non-locals for a period of six months if the non-resident worker's labor contract was terminated. In order for the non-resident worker to change jobs, for instance, he/she is required to leave Macau for six months.

The law was amended in 2013 to allow non-resident workers to stay in Macau when they change employer, but only if they keep the same job description.

"It's a huge number. Given the fact that there are several exceptions to the rule allowed by the law, we can only conclude that

either those people were all dismissed with just cause or their resolved they handled their employment contracts without just cause," a legal expert who wished to remain anonymous said.

The number of non-residents being refused a new stay permit in Macau has increased: 1,106 people were not allowed to work here for six months during the first eight months of 2010; in the following two years, 2,745 and 4,816 people were also denied a new stay permit for a period of six months. **MDT/Lusa**

Public housing residents concerned with possible gas leakage

THE residents of public housing project Edificio da Alameda da Tranquilidade have voiced their concerns over the safety of their building's gas pipelines.

According to a report by MDT yesterday, residents have already found that the central gas pipeline of their building shows signs of erosion, having already had a leak at the end of last year. While the authorities have already suspended gas supply to units that showed a genuine risk of gas leakage, some proprietors think that these troubles were only the tip of the iceberg.

Information suggested that residents started noticing the pipeline issue at the end of 2011, when they first moved into the building. They claimed that the authorities assured them that the pipelines could last for 30 years. However, during an annual checkup in September last year, the gas supplier found that there were leakages in the pipes, and the authorities found the situation to be worse than expected when they dug up the pipelines. Residents were concerned that they may fall victim to gas leakages at any moment.

Although the authorities have proposed the installation of new pipelines and positioning new gas meters on the balcony of the apartments, most of the project's residents have objected to the proposal because they think it would reduce the room available for residents.

In reply to Macau Daily Times, the Housing Bureau said that it will call a proprietors' meeting at the beginning of March to discuss the reinstallation of pipelines. It has also notified the gas supplier to prepare for the construction, and to continue maintenance and repair on the current pipeline system.

NO CONSENSUS ON SIN FONG GARDEN DEMOLITION

PROPRIETORS OF the endangered Sin Fong Garden building held a meeting yesterday, during which a representative of the group, João Vong Kuok Fai, proposed that the building should be demolished and rebuilt despite the fact that they are still unable to acquire consent from the owners of an apartment and a shop. Vong said that if those two property owners decided to oppose the reconstruction, the project would then be suspended and the issue would be decided in court. He also warned that the cost of reconstruction will continue to increase if Sin Fong's residents keep stalling the decision.

INTERVIEW | TOP RANK PRODUCER BRAD JACOBS

'We found an incredible home with wonderful people in Macau'

 $F_{\rm cau's}^{\rm ROM}$ zero to seven, Macau's Cotai Arena has staged an array of high-profile boxing events that were expected to be authentic Las Vegas-like experiences. In less than two years, the city has grown into a globally recognized base for professional boxing, building up several Chinese boxers in the meantime.

The Times spoke with Brad Jacobs, event producer and matchmaker at Top Rank, ahead of the promoter's eighth boxing event in Macau - the upcoming world title fight, Showdown At Sands, featuring China's flag-bearer Zou Shiming.

Macau Daily Times – Can you tell us what your production team did in order to recreate the Vegas-like ambience at the Cotai Arena?

Brad Jacobs – Our goal was not only to match the big fight atmosphere in Las Vegas, but to create an in-arena experience that was second to none anywhere in the world. We brought in our world-class team of specialists [in lighting, audio and video]. Our overall vision was to create an exciting, entertaining and visually pleasing environment for our fans, and I feel very strongly that we have met and exceeded that goal.

MDT - Do you need to make adjustments to the show, in order to accommodate the Chinese and **Asian audience?**

BJ – Our objective is to entertain anyone who happens to be in the arena on a particular night, and, of course, our production staff will feature videos, music and lighting elements that cater to a local **The objective** elements that cater to a local audience. For the two Manny Pacquiao events, we did add some more video elements to the presentation, since they were higher-profile events on a global basis.

across the world, which is to feature local, regional or hometown boxers who the fans follow, and to put them in entertaining bouts that are also learning experiences for the fighters. Hopefully, the boxers are successful and move towards the top of the business, like Zou Shiming is doing by fighting for a world title on March 7.

MDT – It seems that Zou is not as convincing to Western fans as he is to his Chinese fan base. Why is that?

BJ – Boxing fans in general are very opinionated and have an intense interest in many up and coming prospects. They have seen Shiming on national television in the US [aired on HBO] for every one of his fights, so they are formulating opinions etc. It is unfair to compare Zou or [Ik] Yang to already experienced US or European pros who have had 30 to 40 fights. In actuality, Shiming – and, to a certain extent, Yang – have really come a very long way in a very short period of time. Fans globally will come to be big fans of any Chinese boxer who they feel is entertaining and skillful.

MDT – Why did you choose Ruenroeng and Zou for the upcoming matchup? Some people have predicted Zou's victory as 'definite'. Do you agree?

BJ – There is nothing definite once the bell rings, especially in a world title fight, and specifically when the challenger has only six professional bouts under his belt. There are only four recognized world champions [IBF, WBA, WBC and WBO] in the Flyweight division; and [with] Amnat, as IBF World Champion, willing to fight the number-four contender Shiming in Macau; that's the primary reason we made this match. They have an extensive background fighting each other in the amateur ranks, and Amnat holds a win over Shiming, so anyone who savs that this is an easy fight [to pick] must not know their backgrounds and history.

Macau is alive and well, solely based on two people: Ed Tracy, CEO of Sands China [Venetian], and Zou Shiming [Gold Medalist-China]. Mr Tracy recognized the potential popularity of Shiming as an attraction, and that the sport had great potential in Macau. (...) Ed has proven to be 100-percent right regarding the success of boxing in the region. Several incredible things have transpired over the last two years of Top Rank promoting events at The Venetian, but most notable has been the building of Shiming, Rex Tso of Hong Kong, KK Ng of Macau and others as local attractions that the fans want to follow. The other [incredible achievement] was to stage two monumental boxing events featuring superstar Manny Pacquiao, with those events starting at 8 o'clock in the morning and still selling out to a standing-room-only crowd each time. I don't see this as Top Rank not choosing to go to the Philippines or Singapore or any other destination; rather, we found an incredible home with wonderful people in Macau, and the formula is working well here.

MDT – Boxing has always followed the money, which makes for a perfect combination with casinos. With Macau's gaming revenue plunging, do you think that this decline will affect the boxing shows that take place here? Or do you think perhaps boxing can come to Macau's rescue?

BJ – I think if anything, boxing will help, and maintain its success in Macau. In turn, we can help (...) The Venetian maintain its position in the industry in Macau. One of the major advantages that The Venetian has over the other properties in town is that they have a beautiful arena to which they bring significant and important events. Boxing happens to be one of those events that attracts a large audience who simultaneously like to take advantage of the world-class casino, spas and shopping that The Venetian has to offer. So, I feel strongly that Top Rank events will continue to work well as high-profile events for The Venetian to host.

MDT - What are the things that you look into when choosing fighters for a Macau card?

BJ – Although I haven't been in the role of matchmaker for many years, I can tell you that the objective is to make the most entertaining fight for the fans as possible. This is a very difficult job and takes a keen eye for talent and experience. The formula is pretty much the same

HSBC list shows names from Bowie to drug lords used secrecy

HE private-banking unit of HSBC Holdings Plc made significant profits for years handling secret accounts for an array of criminals, from drug cartels and arms dealers to tax evaders and fugitive diamond merchants, according to a report released Sunday by an international news organization.

HSBC is among a handful of banks to face criminal prosecution in recent years for its role in a Swiss banking system that allowed depositors to conceal their identities, and in many cases dodge taxes or launder illgotten cash. The report, prepared by the Washington-based International Consortium of Investigative Journalists, revealed for the first time the massive sweep of HS-BC's private-banking arm as of 2007, when it controlled USD100 billion in assets and served a swath of wealthy depositors from the elite to the illicit.

The report is based on a list of HSBC clients from around that time that a onetime employee took from the bank and turned over to European officials, sparking

tax investigations from Argentina to France, Belgium and Greece. While some of the list's names have emerged before, Sunday's report drew from a more comprehensive list of accounts associated with more than 100,000 people and legal entities from more than 200 nations.

Depositors included royal families and convicted cocaine dealers, ambassadors and terror suspects, entertainers and elected officials, corporate executives and athletes. To these and other clients, the bank actively promoted its accounts as an efficient way to hide assets from tax collectors, according to the report.

HSBC, in a written response to the report, said its compliance efforts had been insufficient. It pointed out that the bank had undergone "a radical transformation" since 2007 and now enforced far more stringent reporting requirements.

The report said the bank held deposits for controversial figures such as the political operative for the late Haitian President Jean-Claude "Baby Doc" Duvalier, who was accused of embezzling hundreds of millions before fleeing his country, as well as fugitives like diamond dealers Mozes Victor Konig and Kenneth Lee Akselrod, whose names appear on the wanted list run by Interpol, the international police agency.

Among many entertainers who held accounts, according to the report, was rock star David Bowie, a Swiss citizen. It didn't accuse him of wrongdoing. A spokesman for Bowie didn't respond to e-mails seeking comment.

The accounts also attracted depositors eager to shield their money from creditors, ex-spouses, political opponents and lawenforcement agencies. **Bloomberg**

Angola plans to receive 4.6m tourists by 2020

ANGOLA'S Ministry of Hotels and Tourism wants the country to receive over 4.6 million tourists by 2020, in view of the increase in Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and the diversification of the economy, the Minister said Friday.

Peter Mutinde, speaking in Lobito during the opening ceremony of the new Hotel Terminus, noted that the Ministry intends to increase the number of jobs by over a million, by opening more establishments connected to this sector of the economy.

The minister said the Ministry of Hotels and Tourism plans to contribute USD3.1 billion to the country's GDP in the same period, by exploiting the potential of the country, according to Angolan news agency Angop.

He said the government was gathering all the conditions necessary for tourism, starting with economic stabilization, construction of roads, bridges, airports and railways, for sustainable development of the sector, based on the diversification of sources of revenue for the country.

"At least 84 new hotels were built in Angola between 2008 and 2012, allowing the addition of 4780 rooms. In 2008 the country had 61 hotels and 2822 rooms and currently has 145 hotels and 7602 rooms," he said.

The country's hotels and related facilities last year welcomed 1.15 million guests, an increase of 170,560 compared to 2012, according to the statistical bulletin for the Angolan hotel and tourism market. **MDT/Macauhub**

Cape Verdean central bank wants more lending to the economy

THE Bank of Cape Werde wants commercial banks operating in the archipelago this year to supply more credit to the economy, thus contributing to the growth of gross domestic product (GDP), the governor of the central bank said Friday.

At a meeting with representatives of commercial banks, Governor João Serra said he was not satisfied with the level of credit to the economy and said he was concerned about "practically residual" growth in credit in recent years, which in the past year was actually negative.

This lack of credit occurs alongside excess liquidity at all commercial banks, and the governor noted the high level of bad debts, "with ratios that require some caution," (18 percent).

Cited by weekly newspaper A Semana, Serra said,

however, he was optimistic and that he expected greater balance between more credit to the economy and the stabilization or even reduction, of bad debts.

The chairman of Cape Verde's Caixa Económica bank, Emanuel Miranda,

noted some of the challenges facing commercial banking, namely the reduction of the State's role in the economy along with more "support" by banks to the private sector.

According to Miranda, the great challenge to granting credit related to the manufacturing sector, given the weaknesses of the Cape Verdean business community and suggested that the banking sector "could perhaps create special units to list opportunities and then help prepare the projects." MDT/Macauhub





A week away from the Chinese lunar new year, Xu Jun frets over the idea of homecoming.

Xu, a 32-year-old whitecollar working in Beijing, said while he misses his loved ones in central China's Hubei Province, the "nightmare scenario" of having to deal with nagging relatives and attend classmates' "show-off reunion parties" freaks him out.

"I am unmarried and have no career worth boasting about, which is why I hesitate to buy a ticket home," Xu said. "And I hate the idea of giving expensive presents and money away as gifts to my relatives."

China kicked off its annual travel rush, known as "Chunyun", last week, with hundreds of millions heading home to celebrate the new year, but an increasingly large number of Chinese are pondering whether or not to make the homecoming. This group, dubbed the "home-fear tribe", are put off by family and societal pressure.

In a recent online poll titled "Why you choose not to go home this year" on a forum for Dongguan City, in south China's Guangdong Province, 37.5 percent of respondents said they "feel ashamed" when going back because they do not have a "decent" job. Dongguan is known as the "Factory of the World" and has a huge number of workers in its manufacturing sector.

Others cited "economic pressure", "forced blind dating" and "unattainable tickets" as the major factors that hold them back.

Experts attribute the phenomenon to a range of factors including generational differences in values, peer pressure and growing indifference towards traditional culture.

While workers struggling in big cities crave the place they call home to relax and to alleviate their sense of loneliness, family pressures are often keeping them in a life adrift.

Hu Xiaoqing, a Shanghai worker from east China's Jiangxi Province, recently took to online social media tool We-Chat to take jabs at his "annoying relatives" for setting him up on blind dates.

will no longer be relatives," Hu wrote.

More than 1,000 km away, Li Guohua in Dongguan felt similar sentiments. Li has chosen not to head home to Hubei Province this year because his two brothers have already bought "big houses" and "fancy cars", while Li, who graduated four years ago, has just changed his job and is earning a mere 2,500 yuan (USD400) a month while on his probation period.

"It would be so embarrassing if they knew my current situation," Li told the Yangcheng Evening News. "I would rather stay here to avoid all that."

Many workers interviewed by Xinhua told of their home-

their children return for family gatherings. Fan Meirong, whose son works in Beijing, said a family reunion would be incomplete without her child.

She said her son is usually busy throughout the year, so she wants to use the new year opportunity to just talk to him and help him relax, which "will bring us closer".

"It does not matter if my son is doing a great job or not," Fan said. "All that matters is that the three of us get together and spend the lunar year happily."

One of the factors that created the "home-fear tribe" is growing value differences between parents and children, according to Liu Qi, associate professor of sociology at East China Normal University.

"Chinese parents tend to be traditional in values and often demand their children follow their orders, but the younger generation are increasingly having ideas of their own," Liu said. "The value differences are causing some hesitation among children when it's time to go home."

The academic said that peer pressure is also keeping people from returning to their hometowns.


"Growing up in similar backgrounds but ending up in contrasting situations will definitely generate anxiety among these workers, because we all hate unfavorable comparisons," Liu told Xinhua.

Qiu Zeqi, a sociology professor with Peking University, said the "home-fear tribe" should learn to reconsider what defines success, and try to strike a balance between career and family relations.

Xi plans to make 1st state visit to US

A top Chinese diplomat has said President Xi Jinping plans to make his first state visit to the U.S. later this year, Chinese state media reported yesterday.

The official China Daily newspaper quoted China's ambassador to the U.S. Cui Tiankai as saying Chinese and U.S. officials are discussing the visit. Cui told Chinese reporters Sunday that no date had been determined yet. U.S. National Security Advisor Susan Rice said Friday that the U.S. has invited both Xi and Japanese President Shinzo Abe for state visits.

Xi last met with U.S. President Barack Obama in November after an Asian-Pacific Economic Cooperation meeting in Beijing. The two also met in Rancho Mirage, California, during a more informal visit to the U.S. in June 2013.

The U.S. and China have been working together on a range of high-profile issues, including pledging in November to cut back on their emissions of greenhouse gases blamed for climate change. The world's biggest economies have also clashed diplomatically on several fronts such as accusations over cyber-espionage and Chinese actions asserting its territorial claims in the East and South China seas. **AP**

Liu paid Zhou Bin 12 million yuan (\$1.92 million) for an Aba, Sichuan-based tourism company, more than double its worth, to maintain a relationship with him, the South China Morning Post reported, citing unidentified people. Authorities convict man of 1996 crime for which teen was executed

THE parents of a man L executed for murder and rape and then posthumously exonerated 18 years later watched yesterday as a court in northern China convicted and sentenced another man for those crimes, according to state media.

The Hohhot Intermediate People's Court in Inner

Huugjilt, who went by one name like many ethnic Mongolians, was executed for the crime soon afterward, and cleared only last December.

Three days after his exoneration, state media announced that the police officer who had been in charge of Huugjilt's case and promoted for his handling of it had now been charged with torture to coerce confession, dereliction of duty and taking bribes. Xinhua reported that the parents of Huugjilt were in the courtroom yesterday. They have been awarded state compensation of 2.06 million yuan (USD335,000) for their son's death, funeral expenses, mental damages and restrictions on his freedom before his conviction, according to state media reports. Zhao, 42, also received prison sentences and fines yesterday for separate crimes of robbery and theft, the court said. AP

AFGHANISTAN Officials: IS commander killed in drone strike



Afghan officials say a senior Islamic State commander has been killed in a drone strike in the southern Helmand province. The deputy provincial governor says the commander, identified as Abdul Rauf, was killed along with four other militants when a drone-fired missile struck their car. Afghanistan's intelligence service issued a statement saying the suspected Islamic State commander was among six people killed in the strike, which it said was carried out by Afghan forces. The Islamic State group, which controls a third of Syria and Iraq, has a small but growing presence in parts of Afghanistan, officials and tribal sources told The Associated Press last month. They said a man known as Mullah Abdul Rauf was actively recruiting fighters for the group.

Shark kills Japanese surfer in second Australia attack in 2 days



A Japanese surfer was mauled to death by a shark yesterday in the second attack off Australia's east coast in two days, prompting authorities to close beaches. The man, who hasn't been named by authorities, was pulled from the sea by other surfers just before 10 a.m. at Shelly Beach on the northern coast of New South Wales, police said in a statement. He lost both his legs in the attack, the Daily Mail newspaper reported, citing a local cafe owner. The incident comes just one day after a 35-year-old surfer was bitten on his back and buttocks by a shark at Seven Mile Beach, about 30 kilometers further up the coast. Beaches along a 15 kilometer stretch of coastline, from South Ballina to Lennox Head, have been closed amid concern a rogue shark responsible for both attacks is cruising the area. Officers are trying to get in touch with the dead surfer's family through the Japanese consulate, the state police's media unit said.

AUSTRALIA Abbott weakened after surviving party challenge

USTRALIA'S beleaguered Prime Minister Tony Abbott emerged politically wounded after withstanding a leadership challenge from within his own party yesterday, with many analysts doubting he can survive to lead his conservative government to next year's elections.

The polarizing leader's grip on power has slipped since last month when he drew widespread criticism for making Queen Elizabeth II's 93-year-old husband, Prince Philip, an Australian knight on Australia's national day. Many lead a more consultative and collegial administration.

"This has been a very chastening experience, a very chastening experience," Abbott told reporters." It's not often that something like this happens 16 or 17 months into the life of a government."

He would not confirm or deny reports that he had asked his colleagues for six more months to lift his coalition's opinion polling.

The vote occurred before Parliament convened yesterday for the first time this year. The opposition center-left Labor Party used it to attack Abbott's leadership, reminding him of his words in 2012 when the former Prime Minister Julia Gillard fended off her rival Kevin Rudd in a similar ballot of lawmakers 71-31. At that time, Abbott questioned whether she had a mandate to continue ruling when a third of her parliamentary colleagues "expressed their lack of confidence in her today." Abbott's government has seen its approval ratings slide since last May, when the government's first annual budget was widely criticized as being toughest on the poor and most vulnerable. Norman Abjorensen, an Australian National University political scientist, described the likelihood of Abbott surviving as prime minister until the next election as "fairly slim." The revolt by more than a third of the 102 Liberal lawmakers would ensure that the public focused on his leadership rather than his government's policy messages, Abjorensen said.

"He's been badly wounded, probably mortally wounded," he said. "Today has made him really a political corpse waiting to be cut down."

But Nick Economou, a Monash University political science professor, believed Abbott could potentially turn his government's fortunes around in six months, saying people tend to underestimate him.

Communications Minister Malcolm Turnbull, who led the party in opposition until he lost by a single vote to the more conservative Abbott in a 2009 leadership ballot, has been touted as the favorite to replace the prime minister if there is another challenge. After yesterday's party vote, online betting agency sportsbet.com.au continued to rate Turnbull as the favorite to lead the government to the 2016 election. Yesterday's challenge came halfway through Abbott's first 3-year term as prime minister. His party has never dumped a first-term prime minister. An opinion poll published in The Australian newspaper yesterday showed that Abbott's popularity had reached its lowest point in his five years as party leader, with only 24 percent of respondents satisfied with his performance while 68 percent were dissatisfied. The poll was based on a nationwide random telephone survey over the weekend of 1,178 voters. It had a margin of error of 3 percentage points. AP

saw it as an insult to worthy Australians.


Abbott, in office less than a year-and -a-half, survived a move by disgruntled Liberal Party members calling for a secret ballot to decide who would be prime minister. They voted 61-39 to reject the motion.

Experts say Abbott needed a stronger show of support from his colleagues to ward off potential future challenges if the government continues to endure sagging approval ratings. He would not survive another blunder, said Chris Kenny, a political commentator and former conservative government staffer.

"He's one dumb knighthood away from oblivion," Kenny told Sky News television.

Abbott described the vote as a political near-death experience, and promised government colleagues he would

Sam Smith wins 4 Grammys, Beck takes home album of the year

SAM Smith was the king of the Grammys, taking home three of the top four awards, including song and record of the year for "Stay With Me," and best new artist, while Beck won album of the year.

Smith, along with Beyoncé, Pharrell and Ed Sheeran, lost album of the year to Beck's "Morning Phase," which also won best rock album Sunday night (yesterday morning, Macau time).

"I want to thank the man who this record is about ... Thank you so much for breaking my heart because I have four Grammys," said Smith, who also won best pop vocal album for "In the Lonely Hour."

Kanye West, who famously interrupted Taylor Swift when she beat Beyoncé at the MTV Video Music Awards, almost walked onstage when Prince announced Beck's name. Some in the audience seemed shocked, from Pharrell to Questlove.

Beck's album debuted at No. 3 on the Billboard 200 albums chart and sold about 300,000 units.

Pharrell and Rosanne Cash walked away with three awards each. Pharrell won best pop solo performance for a live version of "Happy," released in 2013. He also won best music video for the song and best urban contemporary album for "G I R L," beating Beyoncé.

"I am going to moonwalk my way off the stage right now," said Pharrell, wearing a blazer

and shorts.

Pharrell's performance of "Happy" was dramatic with background dancers in black, musicians in yellow and a choir in white.

When the chorus was supposed to come in, Lang Lang played the piano skillfully. Hans Zimmer also played the guitar.

"Thank you, God," Pharrell, in a bell-boy hat, said at the end of the performance.

Rihanna gave an impressive vocal performance of "FourFi-

veSeconds" with Paul McCartney to her right and Kanye West to her left. Her hair was slicked back, and she rocked a black suit like her co-stars.

Katy Perry, in all white, sang the ballad "By the Grace of God" after a woman who had been abused talked about getting help and moving on with her life. A video of President Barack Obama appeared before she spoke, and he encouraged artists to help out.

"It's on us, all of us, to create a culture where violence isn't tolerated," he said.

Another serious moment came with Prince, who earned a standing ovation when he walked onstage to introduce album of the year.

"Albums — you remember those? They still matter. Like books and black lives, they still matter."

Madonna, dressed as a matador, performed "Living for Love" atop a platform surrounded by a plethora of background dancers wearing bull masks. A choir did most of the singing, while Madonna danced and the audience at the Staples Center clapped in unison. She ascended into the air as the performance finished.

West performed on a nearly pitch-black stage, with a light glowing from under his feet (he also sported the new sneakers he designed). He sang the new song about his late mother, "Only One."

Annie Lennox was a powerhouse when she sang "I Put A Spell On You" and joined Hozier for "Take Me to Church," nominated for song off the year.

Beyonce won best R&B song and R&B performance for "Drunk In Love" and surround sound album for "Beyoncé."

"This has been such an incredible year," she said, thanking her "beloved husband" and "my daughter who is watching."

In one of 23 performances, AC/DC kicked off the show with a performance of their latest single, "Rock or Bust," and then transitioned into the classic "Highway to Hell." It earned a rousing applause from Pharrell, Lady Gaga and Katy Perry, who wore devil horns.

Cash led the pre-show with three Grammys, while Eminem, Kendrick Lamar, Chick Corea and the "Frozen" soundtrack earned two awards apiece.

"Reagan was president last time I won a Grammy," said Cash, who won best American roots performance, American roots song and Americana album. "I just showed up for work for 35 years and this is what happened." **AP**

ERMANY sounded a cautious note over prospects for peace talks on Ukraine, while the government in Kiev claimed more Russian troops entered the conflict zone and Russian President Vladimir Putin blamed the crisis on the 010 U.S.

Chances are open for a breakthrough in the yearlong conflict as preparations take place for a summit of the leaders of Ukraine, Russia, Germany and France in Minsk, Belarus, on Feb. 11, though "we don't know if this is going to work," German Foreign Ministry spokesman Martin Schaefer told reporters in Berlin yesterday.

There's "still heavy lifting to do" and "no guarantee" of success, German Foreign Minister Frank-Walter Steinmeier told reporters before a meeting of European Union foreign ministers in Brussels yesterday. "We hope that the open points can be clarified to the point that a Minsk meeting is genuinely promising and can take first steps toward a cease-fire."

The diplomatic effort comes as the U.S. and some European allies consider supplying arms to Ukrainian forces, while German Chancellor Angela Merkel warned of a deepening conflict that can't be won militarily. A breakdown of negotiations would also strain trans-Atlantic unity in dealing with Russia, as Europe's con-

sensus on economic sanctions shows signs of fraying.

Some 1,500 Russian army troops with combat equipment including Grad multiple-launch rocket systems and artillery vehicles crossed the border into the conflict zone in eastern Ukraine on Feb. 7-8, Ukrainian military spokesman Andriv Lysenko told reporters in Kiev yesterday. Russian regular troops went in the direc-

tion of Luhansk and the embattled town of Debaltseve, he said.

The confrontation in Ukraine was "not caused by the Russian Federation" and an "immediate" cease-fire is needed, Putin said in an interview with Egyptian daily Al-Ahram published ahead of his visit to Cairo yesterday. The crisis "emerged in response to the attempts of the U.S. and its

Western allies who considered themselves 'winners' of the Cold War to impose their will everywhere," he said.

"We have seen how NATO's infrastructure was moving closer and closer toward Russia's borders and how Russian interests were being ignored," Putin told the paper.



1952 INDIA PASSES FIRST TEST **OF DEMOCRACY**

The Congress Party of India, led by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, has won an outright victory in the country's first general election.

The party has won 249 of the 489 seats contested in the Lower House, and even with 133 results yet to be declared it is clear that the Congress Party will control the next Parliament.

The victory has earned Pandit Nehru a further five -year term in office. He has led the interim government since 1947, when power passed from British to Indian hands, but this makes him India's first prime minister to be elected by universal suffrage.

The elections are widely seen as a test for India's ability to succeed as a democracy following independence from Britain two years ago.

They are the first to be held under the new constitution, drawn up with the British parliamentary system as a model.

There were fears that extremist groups would use the opportunity to whip up inter-ethnic tensions, but to everyone's relief voting has so far gone peacefully. The polling operation is on a massive scale.

There are 176 million people eligible to vote, although only 15% can read or write.

Symbols are being used on ballot papers for each of the parties and independent candidates, so that those who cannot read know where to cast their vote. Voters are not even required to mark their ballot papers - they simply have to put them into a box

marked with the symbol of their favoured candidate. About 18,000 candidates are running for 4,412 seats: 497 in the Lok Sabha, or lower house of parlia-

ment, and the rest in state government. Although the Congress Party, which has been inextricably linked with the drive for independence, has secured an absolute majority in the parliamentary elections, it suffered some unexpected setbacks in state elections.

In three southern states in particular - Madras, Hyderabad and Travancore-Cochin - the party failed to win an outright majority in the face of strong support for the Communist Party.

The result has caused some concern in the Congress Party. The states do not have to follow central government policies, so the Communist Party's strength there could potentially cause the government serious difficulties.

However, two of the most feared militant parties the Hindu Mahasabha, and the separatist Sikh Akali Party - did so badly that both parties are expected to collapse following the elections.

Neil Portnow, the recording academy's president, said neither Rihanna nor Brown was consulted before the segment aired.

N CONTEXT

The Communist Party of India (CPI) continued to be a thorn in the government's side for some years, particularly in the southern states.

In 1957 it was elected to rule the state government of Kerala (formerly Travancore-Cochin and neighbouring Malabar), only to have the government dismissed and President's Rule declared in 1959.

The CPI is now split into several splinter groups. Although it still has support in Kerala and in some other states, its share of the parliamentary vote has more than halved.

Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru governed the country until his death in 1964, and remains a towering figure in independent India's early political history.

The Congress Party, largely led by Nehru family members, continued in an almost unbroken run of power until 1989. Following a decisive victory in the 1996 elections, the Hindu nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) emerged as the strongest party and formed a government under its moderate leader, Atal Behari Vajpayee.]

But in 2004, the Congress Party once again returned to power under former Finance Minister, Manmohan Singh.

HE killing of more than 20 soccer fans outside a Cairo stadium in a melee with security forces has revived scrutiny of police tactics in Egypt less than a month after a woman was shot dead during the dispersal of a peaceful protest marking the anniversary of the 2011 uprising.

The violence late Sunday, which prompted the Cabinet to suspend the national football league indefinitely, came three years after Egypt witnessed one of the deadliest soccer riots in the sport's history, and dealt a further blow to the military-backed government's attempt to project an image of stability after four years of political turmoil.

The Cabinet announced the suspension of the national league late Sunday after riot police clashed with hundreds of soccer fans and fired tear gas to clear a narrow corridor leading to the Air Defense stadium in an eastern Cairo suburb, setting off a deadly stampede.

Egypt last suspended the league in 2012 after 74 fans were killed in rioting that broke out following a match in the Suez Canal city of Port Said. That violence sparked outrage at the police and the transitional military council that had assumed power following the 2011 overthrow of President Hosni Mubarak.

Fans have only recently been allowed back in stadiums, but authorities continue to limit the number who can attend.

Egypt's public prosecutor has ordered an investigation of the violence.

Yesterday, pro-government media and the Interior Ministry, which is in charge of the police, sought to deflect blame from the security forces. The president of Zamalek,

lawyer Mortada Mansour, told a private TV station that police did not open fire on the club's fans, as was widely reported on social media, and that Sunday's violence was "orchestrated" to foil upcoming parliamentary elections. Prominent pro-government commentator Ahmed Moussa warned against calling the victims "martyrs," saying they attempted to break the law. "Thugs cannot be martyrs," he said late Sunday on television.

Mansour is a staunch supporter of President Abdel-Fattah el-Sissi, the former army chief who has waged a sweeping crackdown on dissent since he led the 2013 overthrow of Islamist President Mohammed Morsi, Egypt's first freely elected leader.

Authorities say Sunday's violence began when hundreds of hard-core Zamalek fans known as Ultras White Knights tried to force their way into the stadium to attend the soccer match without tickets.

On their Facebook page, the White Knights said authorities only opened one narrow, barbed-wire door to let them in. They said that led to pushing and shoving, and that police responded with tear gas and birdshot.

One fan, who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity out of fear of being targeted by security forces, said the stampede was caused by police, who fired tear gas at the tightly packed crowd.

"Those who fell down could not get back up again," the man said. Another witness, who asked that he only be identified by his first name Mohammed, said police responded with large amounts of tear gas after fans pelted them with rocks.

"When the players' bus approached the stadium, fans cut the road off, sat on the ground to prevent it from entering the stadium and showed the players images of the dead fans" on their cellphones, he said.

"Then, police again fired tear gas, the crowd dispersed and the bus went through."

Tarek Titto, a political activist who is close to the White Knights, said that when he visited Cairo's main morgue late Sunday the families of the dead were being asked to sign declarations that their loved ones died of suffocation during a stampede.

"You go to attend a soccer match, you return a body in a morgue," he said, adding that he expected the White Knights would retaliate somehow.

The White Knights and other soccer fans were at the forefront of the protests that gripped Egypt during and after the 2011 uprising that toppled Mubarak. The police have cracked down hard on demonstrations since Morsi's overthrow, and both secular and Islamist activists have been jailed for violating a draconian law regulating protests that was passed in 2013.

Shaimaa el-Sabbagh, a 32-year -old mother of a small boy, was shot dead while taking part in a peaceful Jan. 24 march marking the fourth anniversary of the 2011 uprising. Photos and video clips that have been widely distributed online show police pointing rifles at her direction as the sound of gunfire rings out and she falls on the ground.

Widely circulated images of her bleeding out of her mouth and being carried by a male colleague shocked many Egyptians. The chief prosecutor has ordered that her death be thoroughly investigated and el-Sissi last week called on Interior Minister Mohammed Ibrahim to find her killers.

The most violent episode involving police was the dispersal of massive pro-Morsi protest camps in August 2013, when hundreds of protesters were killed in a matter of hours.

Sunday's match, pitting Zamalek against ENPPI, two Cairo-based teams, kicked off more than an hour behind schedule. Zamalek is leading the league, with ENPPI three points behind in second place. The teams drew 1-1.

Fans attending the match in the stadium were apparently aware of the clashes and fatalities outside.

They chanted: "We either win retribution for them or die like they did." **AP**

The match at Bata Stadium had finished o-o after 120 minutes. The Ivorians, who have lost two shootouts in finals in the last decade, failed

to convert their first two penalties, but a string of must-score shots hit the target, including goals from Yaya and Kolo Toure and Salomon Kalou.

"When sometimes you win with your club, it's quite amazing," said Yaya Toure, who won the Premier League with Manchester City last season. "But with your country, it's unbelievable."

The Ivory Coast, which won its only other title in 1992 also on penalties against Ghana, played this time without Chelsea striker Didier Drogba, who has retired from international soccer. But the team still had Man City teammates Wilfried Bony and Yaya Toure, a four-time African player of the year. Bony took the Ivory

an injury, was taken off just before the shootout. Gyan missed a penalty in the 2010 World Cup quarterfinals and then again in the 2012 African Cup semifinals.

"I have nothing to say. The Ivorians are happy because they won a cup," Gyan said. "I don't have anything to say right now. It's past and gone." Barry made a surprising start in goal for the Ivorians in Sunday's final. He was the goalkeeper between the posts in 2012 when the team lost to Zambia in a shootout in the final, but he started this time in pla-

In 2012, Renard coached Zambia to the title, beating Ghana in the semifinals and Ivory Coast in the final.

"Without the manager we would have won nothing," Toure said. "He made things difficult for me. He told me if I didn't run he'd kick me out. He's fantastic." **AP**

BE WEST-COAST AMERICAN, OR EAST-COAST CHINESE

A very senior journalist at the Financial Times once said to me: "Be American." The person meant be positive. Don't fear failure. Don't worry about setbacks. Have the courage to look to the future and push the envelope to exceed the limits of your ability.

I have refined that advice to: "Be west-coast American", or even: "Be east-coast Chinese". These are the regions where some of the most innovative technology businesses are based, as they are run by bold people who often defy convention and want to change the world.

Consequently, they are also the regions where some long-term fund managers think investors should buy stocks because these are revolutionary companies that are changing the way we live.

As Apple (based in Cupertino, California) has shown most dramatically, with the astonishing rise of its share price in the past decade and its record quarterly earnings at the end of 2014, the best long-term investment returns are produced by these groups.

On the west coast of America there are also the technology giants of Amazon, Facebook and Google as well as Tesla Motors, manufacturer of electric cars, and Illumina, which provides technology for sequencing the human genome that could ultimately eradicate disease.

On the east coast of China, there is Tencent, the mass media, internet and mobile phone services provider, Alibaba, the ecommerce giant, and Baidu, the search company.

In the case of the Chinese groups, there are question marks. Alibaba, for example, is facing a class-action suit in the US over allegations it failed to disclose important information ahead of its initial public offering.

But, in the long run, founder Jack Ma may have a point when he says that such scrutiny will only help to make the company stronger as it is exposed to the stricter norms of western markets.

James Anderson, head of global equities at Baillie Gifford, the fund house, says: "You could argue that the centre of the investment world is in the middle of the Pacific Ocean — between the east coast of China and the west coast of America. These places are where the companies that are changing the world are based. They are the ones with a strategic competitive advantage because of their technological innovation and long-term orientation."

Significantly, he does not hold any stocks based on the east coast of America. Despite the boom in technology start-ups in New York, Mr Anderson still thinks the US city and London, where financials and big oil groups dominate, are places that largely circulate money rather than create wealth. He adds that Shanghai, despite its location on the vibrant Chinese east-coast, is similar to New York and London.

In Europe, he thinks the place most similar to the US west coast and Chinese east coast, which has been a magnet for "terrific technology" companies is Berlin. Examples of these include Rocket, the



Mexico judge orders release of cartel 'Queen of the Pacific'

A Mexican federal judge threw out a five-year, money-laundering sentence for Sandra Avila Beltran, ordering the immediate release of the "Queen of the Pacific" for her alleged role as a liaison between Mexican and Colombian drug cartels. A statement issued by the Attorney General's Office said the judge ruled that Avila already had been tried for the same crime in Mexico and the United States.

The ruling brings to an end a saga that began in 2007, when Avila was arrested while sipping coffee in a Mexico City diner. Her case is widely known in Mexico because Avila is the niece of Miguel Angel Felix Gallardo, "the godfather" of Mexican drug smuggling who is serving a 40year sentence for trafficking and the murder of U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration agent Enrique Camarena in 1985.


Prosecutors alleged Avila spent more than a decade working her way to the top of Mexico's drug trade. They said her romance with Colombian Juan Diego Espinoza Ramirez brought together Mexico's powerful Sinaloa cartel with Colombia's Norte del Valle cartel.

Avila was tried in connection with the seizure of more than nine tons of U.S. -bound cocaine on a vessel in Mexico's western port of Manzanillo and acquitted in December 2010. A Mexican appeals court upheld the verdict in 2011.

But she remained jailed while Mexican courts decided on a U.S. extradition request, which judges granted in 2012. Avila also faced charges stemming from several seizures in Chicago in 2001 that amounted to 100 kilograms of cocaine.

A 2004 indictment in the Southern District of Florida did not specify Beltran's role in the drug-dealing case. In a plea deal in Miami in 2013, she pleaded guilty to a lesser count of being an accessory after the fact in an organization that included Espinosa Ramirez, who pleaded guilty in 2009 to cocaine trafficking charges.

She was sentenced to time served and returned to Mexico, where she was sentenced on the money-laundering conviction last year. **AP**
