

CHINA A fire at a residential building in central China killed seven people and injured 12 others, a local government said yesterday. The fire broke out late Saturday night in Wuhan city in the building's electric cable well, the Wuhan government's information office said on its microblog. The seven residents died after they inhaled a huge amount of smoke from the burning of the electric cables, the statement said.

CHINA A warehouse containing fireworks exploded in northern China yesterday, killing at least three people and injuring more than a dozen others, state media reported. The morning explosion happened in Ningjin county in Hebei province, which borders Beijing, and shattered nearby windows and even those of a flour factory about 1km away, the official Xinhua News Agency said. Photos on the news website 163. com appeared to show the warehouse's roof had blown off.

Casino full smoking ban approved, detailed discussion follows

HE full ban on smoking in casinos was approved on Friday at the Legislative Assembly (AL). However, some lawmakers argued that operators should be allowed to keep smoking lounges. Two lawmakers, Zheng Anting and Kou Hoi In, voted against it. After Friday's general approval, the bill will now undergo detailed discussion at one of the AL's Commissions.

Gaming operator SJM's managing director Angela Leong On Kei was one of the lawmakers who argued that casinos should be allowed to continue operating smoking lounges. "Isn't it possible to give our smoking customers an alternative? I hope the government rethinks the possibility of keeping the smoking lounges. If you believe the existing lounges do not fulfill the criteria, then we can still study stricter criteria to match the needs," she said. "Is it possible to create in these lounges an environment without even a whiff of smoke? I believe it's possible. If there is not enough ventilation we will work even better [to match the government's criteria]," Ms Leong ad-

According to some lawmakers, the ban could impact revenues and force gaming operators to fire or reduce the wages of up to 5,000 workers. Au Kam San was one of the lawmakers to voice an opposing view: "This full ban will perhaps harm ga-

ming operators. Of course they don't want to see this happen. Even some gaming workers are

worried. But casino employees must not be worried. This is the year of the gaming license review. I don't think any casino operator would dare to fire a high number of workers right now," he said.

Replying to the critical remarks, the Secretary for Social Affairs and Culture, Alexis Tam, rejected accusations that the smoking ban was too radical. Stating that the government is willing to improve the law, Mr Tam argued that Macau is being "quite permissive, compared to other regions like

Japan, South Korea, Thailand and Hong Kong. In fact, we are not the strictest place when it comes to anti-tobacco efforts."

Concerning the eventual negative impact of the ban on employment prospects, the secretary added the government plans to take measures to prevent any job losses. Alexis Tam also pledged to review the impact of the ban three years after it comes into effect.

After the plenary debate at the AL, Alexis Tam told journalists he is unsure whether the government will or will not take a step back on the smoking ban bill. He said that authorities remain open to proposals by the gaming industry. "We look forward to the gaming industry proposals. I can't say much here. How can I deny them if I haven't read them? We must be objective. I can't say anything since I have to see what their suggestions are. The industry posted many suggestions [at the AL debate], they say they can do it and we are open to them," the secretary said during an impromptu press conference.

GROUP CONCERNED OVER BAN

THE MACAU Responsible Gaming Association has responded to the AL's approval of an amendment to Macau's Tobacco Prevention and Control Law that completely bans smoking in casinos, including VIP areas. The group argues that the implementation of the measure will affect the gaming industry. According to the as-

sociation's director Song Vai Kit, alterations to the architecture of VIP areas should be considered. "For example, some dividing panels could be set up, or a certain distance could be determined between gaming facilities. Independent ventilation and independent air conditioning systems are a possibility too," Song told TDM.

ALLOWING customers to smoke in casinos "makes financial sense," according to a report published on Saturday by the website CalvinAyre.com, which specializes in gambling news.

Following the approval of Macau's smoking legislation amendment, the website revisited the case of Harrah's New Orleans. In May, the casino reported a 16 percent

revenue drop after the Orleans Parish imposed an indoor smoking ban in April. In June, casino revenue went up 10.9 percent in the state of Louisiana (where New Orleans is located) but Harrah's was again down 16 percent. A Harrah's spokesman cited by CalvinAyre said slots revenue was particularly hard-hit following the ban.

The report also mentions the Chilean case, noting that the country's 16 casinos suffered a 21 percent revenue decline after an indoor smoking ban was imposed in 2013. Figures released this month by the Chilean Gaming Control Board show that the casino industry has only just achieved the same revenue levels it enjoyed in the first five months of 2012, before the ban took effect.

"Small wonder then, that Macau's casino operators – already dealing with 13 straight months of falling revenue – are dreading the special administrative region's proposal to ban smoking in VIP rooms as well as the elimination of airport-style smoking lounges on the main gaming floor," the report notes, adding that analysts have suggested the ban could trim 10 percent off mass market revenue and 15 percent off the VIP business sector. 

I always like challenging myself. Working in a world-renowned architect studio would be a great opportunity to learn how these masters realize concepts into



NG Vai Meng expressed his satisfaction with the authorities' efforts to preserve the legacy of local culture over the years. The Cultural Affairs Bureau's president spoke vesterday at the opening ceremony for the celebrations of the listing of Macau's historical center as a UNESCO World Heritage site. Multiple prominent scholars have shared their insights into heritage preservation during an academic seminar since the event kicked-off.


"Actually we're happy indeed as it's an enormous honor to the people here, for Macau is a culturally historic center. After ten years of efforts, our world heritage sites are not only valued by ourselves but also other regions," the bureau head told media on the sidelines of the seminar.

"The concept of heritage preservation in that time was about protecting buildings. After years of efforts, the SAR government has gradually shifted the initial concept of preserving temples, churches and mansions to a cultural legacy inclusive of tangible and intangible properties," said Ng adding that such cultural resources would be advantageous in the region's self-development, given that much of Macau has remained intact from previous decades, as the city has never suffered massive warfare or political movements.

He also revealed that the heritage preservation law has empowered the government to combat illegal construction within historical districts and furthermore extolled the efforts as "fruitful." The bureau will soon launch a second round of public consultation on its heritage conservation and management framework.

"This one is much different from its past versions, which was an introduction to our management of the historic center. Based on some foundations, we have rolled out more detailed and concrete terms to fulfill the 10 YEARS AFTER UNESCO LISTING

requirements of the world heritage committee," he said.

As the society often criticizes the bureau's non-legal binding opinions as "futile" when controversial urban planning might compromise local heritage sites, Ung believes otherwise.

"Although the Cultural Affairs Bureau's opinions aren't legally restrictive, they are received as such by the urban planning committee or other public work departments. They become like certain regulations when it comes to implementation," said Ung, citing the authorities' pledge to construct two "landscape corridors" for the Penha Hill, that will not be obstructed in case high rises are allowed in the Reclamation Zone B.

Nonetheless, Prof. Michael Turner, UNESCO Chair in Urban Design and Conservation Studies, frowned upon the proposal, which he criticized for failing to take into account the whole picture of historic centers

"I am not happy about simply leaving corridors. I am not happy about it. You have to really convince me to make it work. I think that we should look at other alternatives, but

the alternatives should not be simply visual. Because the corridor idea focuses on monuments, it doesn't focus on the historic center," said Turner who stressed in his speech that sustainability is the key strategy in constructing a city's urban landscape, which includes the city at large instead of particular districts such as the buffer zones. The ICOMOS member also likened the heritage in visual form to an "iceberg" as much cultural significance actually lay beneath the surface. sites usually known to tourists. Prof. Turner said: "That's my idea: social inclusion. That's why the heritage is not stopped by the boundaries of the edge but includes all Macau. I'd take some of those ordinary buildings, the eight-story or ten-story building with bars and flower parks, this is part of the heritage. If I extend my mind to include this, then this is what social inclusion is about. That's why I said all of Macau is heritage. Forget world heritage."

Shan Jixiang, director of the Palace Museum at Beijing's Forbidden City, was also present at the seminar, introducing to the audience the central government's traffic control policy to cap the number of visitors to the extremely popular museum. **Staff reporter**



T. Rowe cuts Wynn Resorts stake, leaving founder top holder

T. ROWE Price Group Inc. cut its stake in Wynn Resorts Ltd. by more than half to 4.7 million shares, according to a regulatory filing Friday, leaving founder Stephen Wynn as the largest stockholder.

The Baltimore-based mutual fund manager was the largest investor in the casino operator as recently as April, with more than 10 million shares, and backed management in its ouster of board member Elaine Wynn, also a major investor in the company. The fund group's stake now totals 4.6 percent.

Wynn Resorts gets more than two-thirds of its revenue from Macau, a market that has been a yearlong slump as wealthy Chinese cut back on their gambling. Wynn Resorts and other U.S. casino operators have more than USD10 billion in projects under construction in Macau scheduled to open over the next two years.

The stock fell 1.2 percent to \$103.90 at the close in New York. Wynn Resorts has declined 30 percent this year.

Wynn, 73, and his ex-wife Elaine, also 73, each own just under 10 percent of the stock, with him holding about 500,000 more shares, according to data compiled by Bloomberg.

Stephane Ratel assists in GT Cup coordination

THE Grand Prix Committee revealed that the regulations for the FIA Formula 3 Intercontinental Cup and the FIA GT World Cup were adopted during the Federation Internationale de L'Automobile (FIA) World Motor Sport Council meeting on July 10.

In a statement issued yesterday, the Macau Grand Prix Committee said that the format of the SJM Macau GT Cup - FIA GT World Cup will include two free practice sessions followed by a 30-minute qualifying session on Friday. On Saturday, a 12-lap Qualifying Race will determine the grid positions for Sunday's 18-lap race.

Twenty-eight entries from a maximum of seven manufacturers will be invited to enter by the FIA GT World Cup Selection Com-




mittee, on which the Macau Grand Prix Committee is represented.

The president of the Automobile General Association Macau-China (AAMC), Chong Coc Veng said FIA and AAMC have selected the Stephane Ratel Organisation (SRO) to assist in

the Macau GT Cup coordination. Ratel is considered an instrumental figure in GT racing's global expansion.

Pre-entry registration for manufacturers is open until July 20th, while driver and team entries will close on September 15th. Entries will be announced by the FIA and the AAMC. Registration for the FIA Formula 3 Intercontinental Cup and the other races on the Macau Grand Prix program will also commence in August. The 62nd Macau Grand Prix will be held from November 19 to 22.

Hong Kong hostage to China rout makes stocks too cheap to ignore

S China's efforts to tame its stock market cause turbulence in Hong Kong, some investors are focusing on the markets' differences.

After tumbling the most since the financial crisis on July 8 amid a record surge in volatility, the Hang Seng Index rebounded Thursday to its biggest gain in three months. With the gauge near the cheapest versus global shares in more than a decade, Valkyria Kapital Ltd. is buying companies it says have been unfairly sucked into the mainland selloff. Close to half the Hang Seng Index, including companies from HSBC Holdings Plc to New World Development Co., trades below book value.

China's officials have unveiled market-boosting measures almost every night over the past two weeks to reverse the rout in the world's second-largest equity market. With about half of mainland stocks suspended from trading to shield themselves from the panic, sellers turned their attention to Hong Kong instead.

"I'm surprised by the extent of the negative reaction we've seen in the Hong Kong market," said Manishi Raychaudhuri, Asia Pacific equity strategist at BNP Paribas SA. "This is the right time to take a look at fundamentals and not get carried away by this avalanche of selling.

The Hang Seng Index climbed 2.1 percent on Friday, rebounding for a second day. It still

fell 4.5 percent last week, the most in more than a year. The Shanghai Composite Index posted a 5.2 percent weekly advance after the largest three -week selloff since 1992.

The mainland gauge was about 33 percent more expensive than the Hang Seng Index

on Thursday when measured by price to estimated earnings. The difference between Chinese shares listed in the city and in Shanghai was even bigger. The Hang Seng China Enterprises Index traded at 8.2 times projected profits, compared with 15.6 for the Shanghai measure.

More than 1,400 companies were halted on mainland exchanges, locking sellers out of half the market. Regulators late Wednesday banned maior stockholders from selling stakes in listed companies. The police are investigating more than 10 institutions and people on suspicion of "maliciously" shorting blue-chip equities, China Securities Journal reported Thursday.

"By effectively removing the

free activity in the mainland market, they've exported the weakness into the China Hong Kong market, which we are generally fans of," Michael Shaoul, chairman and chief executive officer at Marketfield Asset Management, said on Bloomberg Television. "It's a much more even playing field - a much more honest institutional type of marketplace - and unfortunately that's been really the victim of the ham-fistedness of the Chi-

nese authorities." While it was punished last week, Hong Kong didn't enjoy the same rally as Shanghai on the way up. The mainland gauge more than doubled after China cut interest rates in November through its peak, as the Hang Seng Index gained

just 16 percent.

LGT Group and AMP Capital Investors say Chinese shares listed in Hong Kong are attractive, while Valkyria Kapital sees opportunity in the city's broader market. CLP Holdings Ltd., an electricity supplier and Hong Kong & China Gas Co. were down at least 8.2 percent from their highs this year through Thursday. The MSCI Hong Kong Index of Hong Kong companies and Macau casinos dropped 9.5 percent from May 26 through Thursday.

"It's the same thing that happens with these overshooting modes - the correlation, everything, melts to one. What does CLP or Hong Kong Gas have to do with this?" said Niklas Hageback, who helps oversee about USD202 million at Valkyria. "I've never seen things this cheap. For a long-term investor this is fantastic.'

The Hang Seng Index last week traded at the lowest price-to-book ratio relative to the MSCI All-Country World Index since 2003. Mainland investors were net sellers through the Hong Kong- Shanghai stock link for eight days through Wednesday.

"When we look back to these days six months from now, a year from now, they will be proven to be a great buying opportunity," said Brett Mc-Gonegal, executive managing director at Reorient Group Ltd. "There's not a fundamental reason why things have been cut just across the board. These opportunities present themselves very rarely." **Bloomberg**

THE Guinea-Bissau government has launched an international tender to transfer management of the port of Bissau to private entities, the Secretary of State for Transport and Communications said last week.



After evading lawsuits, counterfeiter gets US green card

THE Chinese woman has a ▲ history of selling counterfeit luxury goods. She has been sued in the U.S. by eight luxury brands. She owes Chanel Inc. USD6.9 million for selling products online under its name.

None of it has stopped Xu Ting, a 45-year-old immigrant, from achieving a comfortable suburban life in San Diego with her husband and their 3-year-old son. Last year, she became a legal resident.

China is not the only country with a counterfeiting problem. Most fakes are made in China, but they are sold in America, where counterfeiting is rarely prosecuted as a crime. Lack of cooperation with China makes it easy for counterfeiters to move their money beyond reach — and hard to root out counterfeiting kingpins. As long as counterfeiters can stay out of jail and hold on to their profits — and consumers continue to buy — the trade in fakes will thrive.

"There's a million ways to game the system," said Dan Plane, an intellectual property lawyer in Hong Kong. "Probably the only thing that's going to stop her is when she passes away - probably on an island resort somewhere — or if she gets arrested."

So far, Xu Ting has simply refused to show up in court. She

has worked toward a graduate degree at San Diego State University, helped her family accumulate at least \$890,000 in bank accounts in China, and bought a \$585,000 house with her husband, public records and court cases show.

"The essential point for Chanel is really shutting down the counterfeiting operations which we did successfully," Chanel spokeswoman Kathrin Schurrer wrote in an email. Schurrer added that the legal process is ongoing and declined further comment, but did note that "California has a law prohibiting the civil seizure of a home if it is a primary residence."

In 2009, a Florida judge ruled against Xu Ting and shut down seven websites selling fake Louis Vuitton, Marc Jacobs and Celine.

In 2010, Gucci and other brands in France's Kering

group filed a lawsuit in New York federal court against Xu Ting, her future husband, and eight others who allegedly sold more than \$2 million worth of fake handbags and wallets online to U.S. customers.

Xu Ting's husband, Xu Lijun, has settled. A licensed civil engineer in California, he denied wrongdoing but agreed to let Gucci keep \$400,000 in seized counterfeiting proceeds and pay a \$7,500 fine.

His lawyer, Eric Siegle, said he was "a small-time nobody."

"The people they are arresting or suing here in the United States are low-level people," Siegle said. "If you can find where the money is going, you can get to the heart of the problem.

But Gucci couldn't find where the money went once it landed in China because Chinese banks refused to disclose account details.

"BOC cannot comply with such orders without violating Chinese law," the Bank of China said in an email.

The case is ongoing. Kering spokeswoman Charlotte Judet said Gucci would "vigorously enforce any judgment" it obtained.

Xu Ting declined multiple requests for comment.

A slight man in wire-rimmed glasses answered the door in San Diego's Rancho Penasquitos area and identified himself as Xu Lijun but declined com-

"After your colleague's visit, we communicated and she still did not want to do the interview," the family's lawyer in Beijing, Chen Peng, said.

In February 2014, Xu Ting got a green card, thanks to her husband's advanced degree or "extraordinary ability," according to a person familiar with the matter who spoke anonymously because immigration records are not public. Immigration authorities also have the Rancho Penasquitos address on record as her residence, the person said.

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services spokesman Christopher Bentley declined comment, citing privacy concerns.

Dan Kowalski, an immigration attorney and editor of Bender's Immigration Bulletin, said immigration officials may not have known about Xu Ting's legal problems but more likely didn't consider them a disqualification. Grounds for denying a green card range from committing a serious crime to having communicable disease but there's nothing about civil liabilities. A vaguer requirement of "good moral character" is more commonly applied for citizenship, not legal residence.

In the U.S., most counterfeiting prosecutions are civil cases brought by companies. Lawyers say criminal cases, which carry the possibility of jail time, are a more effective deterrent.

"A person is more likely to be struck by lightning than imprisoned for counterfeiting," said Geoffrey Potter, an intellectual property lawyer at New York's Patterson Belknap Webb & Tyler.

Justice Department spokesman Peter Carr said the government has done "a number of significant prosecutions."

"Large-scale commercial counterfeiting is one of the top enforcement priorities of the department's Intellectual Property Task Force," he said.

China is the largest source country for counterfeit goods seized in the U.S., and apparel and accessories are the largest category of merchandise. Luxury goods are typically made in Guangzhou and sent by container or courier like FedEx to the U.S. They may be sold in stores or flea markets but are usually hawked online.

"Unfortunately, once you shut one (website) down, they have 10 more ready to open up in a different name," said Bruce Foucart, director of the National Intellectual Property Rights Coordination Center, a multiagency group led by Immigration and Customs Enforcement. Foucart didn't know about Xu Ting.

Brand owners also bear responsibility.

"The biggest game changer for me would be if foreign companies took a more aggressive attitude toward enforcing their rights," said Mark Cohen, former intellectual property attaché at the U.S. embassy in Beijing. "At the end of the day, there may be an economic calculation about how much money it's worth to pursue these people." AP

Typhoon pounds Shanghai with heavy rains; 1.1 million evacuated

typhoon pounded the Chinese coast south of Shanghai on Saturday with strong winds and heavy rainfall, submerging roads, felling trees and forcing the evacuation of 1.1 million people.

Typhoon Chan-hom slammed ashore with winds of up to 160 kilometers per hour near Zhoushan, a city east of the port of Ningbo in Zhejiang province. It has dumped more than 100 millimeters of rain since late Friday — about a month's ave-

rage in less than 24 hours, China Central Television and the Xinhua News Agency reported.

No deaths or injuries had been reported by Saturday evening.

"It was so windy that the rain came in through the windows even though they were closed," Zhoushan resident Zhang Zhouqun, 53, manager of a logistics company, said in a telephone interview.

The storm felled 10-year-old trees in his neighborhood, stranded cars in 60-centimeter-deep water and swamped

CHAN-HOM WEAKENS AS IT HEADS FOR KOREAN PENINSULA

TYPHOON CHAN-HOM, which caused the evacuation of about a million people and the cancellation of hundreds of air flights in eastern China Saturday, weakened as it moved northeast along the East China ocean toward the Korean Peninsula. Chan-hom was moving at about 30 kilometers per hour at 5 a.m. local time yesterday, the China weather bureau said on its website. The top speed at the center of the typhoon had slowed to 35

meters per second yesterday from 45 meters per second Saturday and will continue to weaken, the weather bureau said. Gale-force winds measuring seven to eight will still blow along coastal Zhejiang, Shanghai, Jiangsu, and Shandong until 8:00 a.m. today, and some locations could expect winds of nine and ten force, the weather bureau said. In Shanghai, typhoon orange alert was lifted yesterday and subway-train service resumed.

half the fields, Zhang said. Police were out barring people from trying to drive. At the urging of local officials, Zhang's family had stocked up a few days' worth of groceries, he said.

Some 1.1 million people had been evacuated from coastal areas of Zhejiang and more than 46,000 in neighboring Jiangsu province ahead of the storm, Xinhua said. The provincial flood control bureau said 28,764 ships had been ordered back to port.

The national weather service said earlier the typhoon might be the strongest to strike China since the communist government took power in 1949. It initially was deemed a supertyphoon but was downgraded at midday Saturday to a strong typhoon and was weakening further as it moved inland.

Heavy downpours were reported in some areas, including the village of Lai'ao, which recorded more than 400 millimeters of rain, according to Xinhua.

More than 100 trains and 600 flights were canceled in the cities of Hangzhou, Ningbo, Wenzhou and Taizhou, according to Xinhua. Buses and passenger ferries also suspended service.

Earlier, Chan-hom caused 20 injuries as it moved over islands in southern Japan, Kyodo news agency reported.

The storm dumped rain on the northern Philippines and Taiwan, where several flights were suspended. The stock market and public offices were closed Friday in Taipei, Taiwan's capital.

Chan-hom is the second major storm to hit China this week, after Typhoon Linfa forced 56,000 people from their homes in the southern province of Guangdong, AP

Uighurs deported from Thailand wanted to join jihad, Xinhua says

CHINA'S official news agency Said that 109 ethnic Uighurs who Thailand deported to China amid international criticism that the refugees could face persecution had been on their way to Turkey, Syria or Iraq to help wage holy war.

On Thursday, Thai authorities sent back the Uighurs, who had been in Thailand for over a year and claimed to be Turkish, after determining they were Chinese. The repatriations were criticized by the U.N. refugee agency as "a flagrant violation of international law." Rights groups expressed fears that they could face torture. In Turkey's capital, Istanbul, protesters ransacked the Thai consulate to denounce the decision.

China's official Xinhua News Agency said late Saturday that the 109 illegal immigrants had been on their way "to join jihad," and that 13 of them had fled China after being implicated in terrorist activities. Another two had escaped detention, Xinhua said, citing the Ministry of Public Security.

Xinhua's report also claimed that a Chinese police investigation had uncovered several gangs recruiting people for jihad, and that Turkish diplomats in some

Southeast Asian countries had facilitated the illegal movement of people.

The Uighurs are a Turkic-speaking Muslim minority in China's far western region of Xinjiang. The group has complained of harsh cultural and religious suppression as well as economic marginalization under Chinese rule.

Beijing has accused Uighur separatists of terrorism in Xinjiang, where ethnic violence has left hundreds of people dead.

Many of the 109 had been radicalized by materials released by the World Uyghur Congress and the East Turkestan Islamic Movement, Xinhua said. The former is a Munich-based Uighur rights group, and China has designated the latter a terrorist organization.

In response to the report, Dilxat Raxit, World Uyghur Congress spokesman, said yesterday: "China is defending itself and shirking responsibility for Uighurs fleeing because of its policy of suppression. The so-called radicals are those who hope to flee China and live a stable and dignified life in a safe and free country."

Meanwhile, Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Hua Chunying on Saturday voiced China's "strong dissatisfaction with and opposition to" remarks by the U.S. State Department that it was deeply concerned about the protection of asylum-seekers in Thailand because of the case. AP

Beijing city gov't to move part of its functions to a suburb

BEIJING'S city government said yesterday that it is going to move part of its administrative functions out of the city center as part of a plan to better integrate the Chinese capital with its surrounding

The municipal government's Communist Party committee also agreed at a meeting Friday and Saturday to stick to its target to limit Beijing's population to 23 million, according to the government's information office microblog. Its population was 21.5 million at the end of 2014.

at the end of 2014.

The "subsidiary administrative center" will be in Tongzhou, a district in Beijing's eastern suburbs about a 40-minute car ride from downtown Beijing without heavy traffic, and will take shape by 2017.

The new center is part of a plan to integrate Beijing with neighboring Hebei, an industrial province from where much of the capital's

pollution wafts in, and the port city of Tianjin. Officials want to develop highquality resources such as hospitals and universities in the whole area, rather than have them concentrated in downtown Beijing.

Moving part of the municipal government and its services out of central Beijing and to neighboring regions will help ease traffic congestion and population growth. AP

HE Myanmar opposition party led by Nobel laureate Aung San Suu Kyi announced Saturday it will contest the general election on Nov. 8 despite misgivings about transparency, in an effort to challenge the ruling military-backed party.

"We will contest the election to continue implementing the democratic transition that has yet to be achieved," Suu Kyi told reporters in the capital, Naypyitaw.

Suu Kyi is still unable to run for president after lawmakers recently turned down efforts to amend the constitution. Her party boycotted the 2010 polls because it considered election rules to be unfair. It took part in by-elections in 2012 after changes were made, winning almost all seats it contested which nonetheless represented a small bloc in Parliament.

Myanmar was under army rule from 1962 until 2011, when the military-backed Union Solidarity and Development Party took power. President Thein Sein, a senior leader in the former military government, introduced surprising reforms, especially in the economy,

but their pace has slowed, and the military still is the ultimate power-holder.

Asked if the elections will be free and fair, Suu Kyi replied: "Not completely."

She said the main concern is the voter list, which she said contains "many, many errors. ... It means that the voter concerned will not be allowed to cast his or her vote on the day of the election and this is a grave concern for us."

Her party has repeatedly said the election cannot be free or fair if the constitution is not amended.

The constitution was enacted during military rule, and gives the army a dominant say in the administration of the country. One clause mandates that 25 percent of the seats in Parliament must be held by the military, ensuring it has veto power over constitutional amendments. Another clause has the effect of barring Suu Kyi from presidency.

Suu Kyi's party was on the cusp of taking power in 1990, when it won a landslide victory, two years after a pro-democracy uprising was crushed by the military, and Suu Kyi daughter of the country's independence hero Gen. Aung San

- became the country's most popular political figure.

They had won although she and senior colleagues were in detention, only to have the polls declared invalid by the army. Two decades of sharp repression followed.

A total of 498 seats for the lower and upper houses, 644 region and state parliament seats and 29 seats representing ethnic groups are up for grabs in November.

U.S. State Department spokesman Mark Toner said Wednesday that a credible vote will be an important step in Myanmar's democratic tran-

He said the U.S. was providing technical support to the election commission, political parties and civil society to ensure elections are "inclusive and transparent." But the influential leader of the U.S. Senate, Mitch McConnell, said the United States should not provide trade benefits to Myanmar until after November parliamentary elections indicate the state of political reform.

McConnell strongly criticized Myanmar's government for blocking constitutional changes last month. AP

SH spewing from a Avolcano on Indonesia's main island of Java sparked chaos for holidaymakers as airports closed and international airlines canceled flights to tourist hotspot Bali, stranding thousands.

Bali's Ngurah Rai airport reopened Saturday morning, while two airports on Java island were still closed. Another airport, on Lombok island, reopened late Friday.

Mount Raung in East Java province, about 150 kilometers from Bali's international airport, has been rumbling for several weeks. The level of activity increased in the past week and on Friday it blasted ash and debris 3,800 meters into the air.

Government volcanologist Gede Suantika said the eruption forced authorities to close five **INDONESIA**

airports due to the risks posed by volcanic ash. The Transport Ministry told airlines to avoid routes near the mountain. It said a decision about reopening other airports would be made

Suantika said lava and ash fall from the 3,332-meter-high mountain on Indonesia's most densely populated island also caused the government to urge people to stay away from a 3-kilometer-high danger zone around the volcano.

The evacuation of residents living near the volcano was still considered unnecessary, but authorities were urging people to wear masks.

Volcanic eruptions can cause significant and lengthy disruption to travel. A 2010 eruption

of Iceland's Eyjafjallajokul volcano produced an ash cloud that caused a week of international aviation chaos, with more than 100,000 flights canceled.

"Ash can clog engines and harm other parts of the aircraft," Barata said. He added that thousands of travelers were stranded when flights within Indonesia were already overbooked as tens of millions of the country's Muslims pour out of major cities to return to return to their villages during an annual mass exodus to celebrate the end of the Islamic holy month of Ramadan.

The volcano has proven particularly problematic for Australians, who flock to Bali during Australia's school holidays.

Dozens of flights be-

tween Australia and Bali's airport by Australian carriers Jetstar and Virgin Australia have been canceled over the past week, with the airlines citing safety concerns.

Both carriers said they are looking into adding extra flights between Australia and Bali when conditions improve to help clear the backlog.

At Bali's international airport, many travelers arrived not knowing about the eruption and flight cancellations. The airport blocked access to ticket counters, adding to the confusion.

Some tourists slept on benches or stood at flight information boards filled

with "postponed" and "delayed" notifications. Others complained of a lack of information about their delayed flights.

"The airline can't tell us if we're going to be here tonight or fly tomorrow or the next day," said Charmaine Scott, an Australian holidaymaker. "This is really difficult for us. We have to basically find some way to stay."

She said that she and her husband hadn't heard about the eruption and flight cancellations until they arrived at the airport on Friday morning.

The airport's closure affected 160 domestic flights and 117 international ones to and from Bali, said Trikora Rahardjo, general manager of Ngurah Rai airport. AP

As habitats vanish, migratory birds flock to Pyongyang's shores

TO the untrained eye, it's I just a lot of birds on an otherwise deserted stretch of muddy, flat coastline. But for ornithologists, North Korea's west coast is a little piece of paradise each spring — and both the birds and a dedicated group of birdwatchers travel a long way to get there.

While North Korea is wary of letting foreigners inside its borders, a recent trip by a New Zealand research team to the mudflats near Nampo, southwest of the capital, Pyongyang, underscores some tentative but significant progress by outside scientists to conduct small-scale research projects — as long as they don't rub up against sensitive topics and are seen as useful to North Korea itself.

Last year, for example, an international team of scientists was allowed to set up seismographs and other equipment to monitor ominous activity on Mount Paektu, a huge volcano that straddles North Korea's border with China.

In typical North Korean style, the New Zealand ornithologists were told not to take photos of the birds in some places. Their mobile phone and computer access was also partly restricted. But the researchers say that overall, the trip went smoothly.

"They took us where we needed to go," team member Keith Woodley, who is now back in New Zealand, told The Associated Press by phone.

"They evaluate the places we need to go and they make it happen. It's very good cooperation."

The trip in May was part of a four-year study by the Pukorokoro Miranda Shorebird Centre in New Zealand, which is where many of the birds end the summer portion of their journey. In three days of on-site bird-watching, the team counted approximately 20,000 migratory birds from as far off as Australia and South Asia.

Team members hope the project will shed light on the birds' migrations and generate international efforts to conserve their habitats.

North Korean officials share that hope, which dovetails with the authoritarian nation's efforts to promote itself as an eco-friendly, unspoiled land of natural attractions that will interest the one kind of foreigner it is trying hard to woo — the wealthy tourist.

"Many people from other countries are interested in this kind of study here," Nature Conservation Union researcher Pak Ung told an AP television news crew that was allowed to film the site. "I think if we can do a thorough study of migratory birds here, it will contribute to great progress in conservation of migratory birds, as well as overall ecological diversity, which is an international issue."

The birds being watched aren't exactly household names — bar-tailed godwits (Limosa Iapponica), great knots (Calidris Tenuirostris) and dunlins (Calidris Alpina).

But in scientific circles, the godwits are something of a

sensation.

"Godwits are amazing," said project member David Melville, a British citizen who has long lived in New Zealand. "Their flight from New Zealand to China is approximately 8,000 kilometers, nonstop for seven days, and then after a month they fly another 5,000 kilometers to Alaska to breed. On the return trip to New Zealand, they fly nonstop across the Pacific ocean, a trip of 11,000 kilometers, in about nine days."

To survive the journey northward, the birds need to spend a month to six weeks in a place where they can rest and replenish their strength, sometimes doubling their weight, from a lean 330 grams to a plump 660 grams or more, before starting on the final leg.

A godwit dubbed "E7" made international headlines in 2007 when, thanks to a tiny transmitter implanted in her abdomen, she was confirmed to have flown for seven days and nights without stopping to a feeding ground in China - a 10,200-kilometer flight. That was the longest nonstop flight by a land bird ever re-

When she flew back to New Zealand from Alaska, entirely over the open Pacific, without stopping for eight days and nights, she set another record distance, of 11,760 kilometers.

"Unlike seabirds like albatrosses, they can't land in the water. If they do they are finished," Woodley said. "We know that some must be doing 12,000 kilometers or more."

Rapid development on the coasts of China and South Korea may be leaving the birds with fewer places to take their mid-trip rest. That leaves the relatively untouched west coast of North Korea as one of the few places they can still find their favorite foods, small bits of seafood — mostly mollusks and crustaceans -

Woodley said godwits are listed as threatened and red knots are considered to be an endangered species.

The agreement for the New Zealand team to go bird watching in North Korea goes back to 2007. It was followed by a one-off bird-watching trip two years later. The four -year study project was approved last year, and that opened the way for the trip two months ago. The team plans to return next April.

This year's trip was the first of four formal visits that will end in 2018, but there's hope the visits will continue past that date, Melville said. AP


Disagreements emerge among creditors as EU summit cancelled

KEPTICAL European creditors raced yesterday to narrow differences both among themselves and with Athens, aiming to come up with a tentative agreement to stave off an immediate financial collapse in Greece that would reverberate across the continent.

Facing a self-imposed yesterday deadline, the European nations using the shared euro currency were still seeking more proof from Greek Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras that he could be fully trusted to enact wide-ranging economic reforms to safeguard Greece's future in the common currency.

Greece has asked Europe's bailout fund for a 53.5 billion -euro (USD59.5 billion) 3-year financial package but many officials in Brussels say the figu-

re will have to be much higher. This would be Greece's third bailout in five years.

Rumors of Franco-German discord over what was still expected from Greece swirled around the talks between finance ministers yesterday in Brussels. A French official, however, insisted there were no fundamental differences between President Francois Hollande and German Chancellor Angela Merkel, who were among the 19 eurozone leaders meeting later yesterday for a summit in Brussels.

"There is no fear of a rift and we will find strong cohesion," said the official, who asked to remain anonymous because of the sensitivity of the negotiations.

France is considered Greece's best friend and even helped Tsipras prepare the reform proposals that are his lifeline to international aid over the coming days or weeks. Germany, meanwhile, says Greece needs to do much more to get help or any debt relief.

Greece's economy is in freefall and the country faces big debt repayments in the coming weeks.

"We have lost so much time we cannot afford to lose time anymore," Italian Finance Minister Pier Carlo Padoan said as he arrived for talks yesterday. "We continue to work to establish the conditions to start negotiations, which is the real target. ... It is not about closing a deal."

Yet in a sign that a dramatic Greek exit from the euro would not happen yesterday, a full summit of the European Union's 28 leaders was cancelled. Instead, the eurozone's 19 leaders, including Tsipras, were meeting yesterday afternoon to assess the outcome of the finance ministers' talks and plot a further way ahead. AP

Top drug lord Joaquin 'El Chapo' Guzman escapes

TOP drug lord Joaquin L "El Chapo" Guzman has done what Mexican authorities promised would not happen again after his re-capture last year escaped for a second time from a maximum security

A manhunt began immediately late Saturday (yesterday, Macau time) for the head of the powerful Sinaloa Cartel, which has an international reach and is believed to control most of the major crossing points for drugs at the U.S. border with Mexico.

Associated Press journalists near the Altiplano prison, 90 kilometers west of Mexico City, said the roads were being heavily patrolled by Federal Police, who had also set up checkpoints. Flights were also suspended at Toluca airport near the penitentiary in the state of Mexico.

Guzman was last seen about 9 p.m. Saturday in the shower area of the Altiplano prison, according to a statement from the National Security Com-

mission issued early yesterday. After a time, he was lost by the prison's security camera surveillance network. Upon checking his cell, authorities found it empty.

Mexican officials had no further comment on Guzman's escape, but scheduled a press conference for yesterday morning.

Guzman's escape is a blow to the administration of President Enrique Pena Nieto, which has received plaudits for its aggressive approach to top drug lords. Since the government took office in late 2012, Mexican authorities have nabbed or killed six of them, including Guzman.

Guzman was caught by

authorities for the first time in Guatemala in 1993, extradited and sentenced to 20 years in prison on drugtrafficking related charges. He escaped from Puente Grande, another Mexican maximum-security prison in western Jalisco state, in 2001 with the help of prison guards. The lore says he escaped in a laundry cart, although there have been several versions of how he got away.

He was re-captured in February 2014 after eluding authorities for days across his home state of Sinaloa, for which the cartel is named. He was listed as 56 years old last year, though there are discrepancies in his birth date. AP

Srebrenica ceremonies marred by attack on Serbia's premier

crowd of furious Bosnian Muslims Ajumped over fences and attacked Serbia's prime minister with stones and water bottles on Saturday, marring the 20th anniversary commemorations of the Srebrenica massacre.

Aleksandar Vucic, a former ultranationalist during the Balkan wars but who is now a moderate with a pro -Western stance, escaped serious injury. He said he was hit in the face with a rock as the crowds chanted "Kill, Kill" and "Allahu akbar," the Arabic phrase for "God is great."

The scenes overshadowed what was supposed to be a day of reflection and remembrance for the 8,000 Muslim men and boys slaughtered at the hands of Serb forces in the eastern Bosnian town of Srebrenica. Two U.N. courts ruled that the killings constituted genocide.

Vucic is among the most hated individuals for Bosnian Muslims, with some viewing him in worse terms than late strongman Slobodan Milosevic. During the 1992-95 Bosnian war, Vucic was an ultranationalist politician in opposition to Milosevic, criticizing the Serb leader of leniency toward Bosnian Muslims.

Many Bosnian Muslims also still remember Vucic's incendiary statement during the Balkan wars that for every dead Serb, 100 Muslims should be killed. Some in the crowd held a banner with the quote to remind him

of his past.

Vucic's security detail rushed him away, trying to protect him with bags, umbrellas and their raised arms from the projectiles raining down. His guards shoved through the angry crowd before pushing the prime minister inside an armored vehicle.

"We were attacked from all sides. It was well organized and prepared," a visibly shaken Vucic said upon his quick return to Serbia. He blamed hooligan soccer groups from Serbia and Bosnia for initiating the attack.

He added: "Except for my glasses, I'm missing nothing else."

Vucic, who came to represent Serbia at the commemoration in an apparent gesture of reconciliation, said after the attack that, "Today we are talking more about a bunch of fools rather than about the innocent victims of Srebrenica." He added that his "arms of reconciliation remain stretched toward the Bosniaks." AP



1971 DEATH FOR MOROCCAN **REBEL LEADERS**

Ten army officers involved in an aborted coup in Morocco have been executed.

Four generals, five colonels and one major faced a firing squad without trial or court martial less than 72 hours after they had led a surprise attack.

About 250 rebels - mainly from the Ahermoumou cadet training school - stormed the royal palace at Sikharat where King Hassan II was hosting a grand reception for his 42nd birthday on Saturday.

Ten miles away there were successful assaults on Rabat radio, the Interior Ministry and the Army head-

Dissident soldiers had claimed to have seized power and killed the King. But the Moroccan news agency later confirmed he was unharmed as loyalist troops sealed off government buildings and patrolled Rabat's streets in tanks.

A total of 92 people were killed, including Belgian ambassador Marcel Dupret. The King's brother, Moulay Abdullah, was among the 133 injured.

The coup leaders were shot in the courtyard of a military barracks in Rabat this morning, witnessed by military officers, who spat on the corpses, and Moroccan journalists.

King Hassan was at the state funeral for his supporters killed at the summer palace in the two-and-ahalf hour gun battle there.

Among the victims were the Minister of Justice Muhammed Lazrak, the Minister of Tourism Ahmed Bahnini and the King's 80-year-old surgeon.

A further four generals and four colonels who had been loyal were also killed and the Moroccan authorities - under the temporary direction of General Muhammed Oufkir - are keen to stabilize the military as quickly as possible.

In a press conference today, the King identified the leaders of the coup and said the 1,400 rebels involved had been killed or rounded up.

He dismissed the challenge to his authority, saying, 'It was all very under-developed," and he pointed to foreign interference as 600 Moroccans had attempted to renew their passports in Cairo on the day of the attack.

IN CONTEXT

Many believed the rebels did not intend to kill the King but simply wanted to reform the political system.

General Muhammed Medbouh was widely believed to have led the coup and had spoken out against corruption. He was accidentally killed by his own forces.

Since inheriting the crown in 1961 King Hassan II had continued the pro-western, personal rule of his father. He was also a devout Muslim.

From 1946 to 1969 Morocco received more aid from the US than anywhere else in Africa - £304m.

There was a rising tide of Arab nationalism in the region, which had seen Egypt, Iraq, Yemen and Libya succumb to revolution in the past 20 years.

The King survived several assassination attempts after Mo- rocco gained independence from France in the early 1950s.

Djokovic OVAK beat Roger Federer for a second year in a row to win his third Wimbledon title. The top-seeded Serb overcame Federer - and a Centre Court crowd cheering for the seventime winner from Switzerland - 7-6 (7-1), 6-7 (10-12), 6-4, 6-3 to tie his coach Boris Becker with three titles at the All England Club. Djokovic now has nine grand slam titles.

Djokovic, 28, is the first man to successfully defend the title since Federer won five times in a row from 2003 to 2007. The men are now tied at 20-20 in a rivalry that started nine years ago on the clay of Monte Carlo.

In the first set yesterday, Djokovic saved two set points at 6-5 down with service winners and forced a tiebreak with an ace. Leading 3-1, the Serb came out on top after a long baseline rally. Serving at 6-1 down, Federer gifted the set with a double fault.

The second set went to a tiebreak again after Djokovic squandered a set point at 5-4 on a forehand error. The crowd gave Federer a standing ovation after the Swiss saved six more set points to win 12-10 on a big serve followed by two backhand volleys. Djokovic was furious, hitting his racket on his foot three times and shouting at his box during the changeo-

The top seed quickly recovered in the third set, breaking early on as he stood closer to **TENNIS**

the baseline to take the ball earlier. After a 15-minute rain delay at 3-2, Djokovic served out the third set to love with a smash.

The world No. 1 didn't have an easy run to the Wimbledon

title, coming back from two sets down in the fourth round against Kevin Anderson, who hit 71 winners, including 40 aces. Djokovic called the match, played over two days, "one of the most difficult" he's had at Wimbledon, and possibly in his career.

The 28-year-old is oldest man to reach nine grand slams. Federer, who turns 34 next month, won the ninth of his record 17 major titles at 25.

The French Open is still missing from Djokovic's quest for a career grand slam. He lost to Stan Wawrinka in the final last month after beating Rafael Nadal in the quarterfinals. The Spaniard beat him in the 2012 and 2014 finals. **Bloomberg**

Williams defeats Muguruza to complete 'Serena slam' of majors

SERENA Williams beat Garbine Muguruza in the Wimbledon final, making her the first player since 2003 to hold all four major tennis titles at once.

Her 6-4, 6-4 victory over the Spaniard on Centre Court was her fourth straight title, allowing her to repeat her self-styled "Serena slam" of holding all the major singles trophies at the same time - a feat she also achieved in 2002-03 when she beat her sister Venus for the titles.

Williams' triumph also puts her three-quarters of the way to completing the coveted grand slam of all four majors in one calendar year. Germany's Steffi Graf was the last player to do so,



in 1988. Her 21st major singles championship moves her within one of Graf's Open era record.

Williams settled down to take the first set after Muguruza took advantage of double faults to break in the opening game. The serve, often a weapon for Williams, let her down and the Spaniard smashed back the slower second serves. Williams was berating herself over the shot even on points that she

She ran off 5 straight games to win the first set and take a lead in the second, before Muguruza broke back. Williams won the match when Muguruza hit a forehand wide. Confusion over whether the shot would be reviewed meant Williams couldn't break out in celebration immediately.

At 33 years, 289 days Williams is the oldest woman to win a grand slam since tennis turned professional in 1968.

Since winning her fifth title at the All England Club in 2012, Wimbledon has been her least successful major for the top-ranked American. After crashing out of the third round last year, Williams rebounded by winning the U.S., Australian and French

Williams had to fight hard for the last two legs of the Serena slam. At Roland Garros, she struggled with flu and had to come back from a set down five times for the first time in any major. At Wimbledon, Williams was twice two points away from defeat in the third round against 59th-ranked Briton Heather Watson, and then had to beat three grand slam champions - Venus Williams, Victoria Azarenka and Maria Sharapova - to reach her 25th major championship match.

In the Wimbledon finals, she overcame a player who had handed her the most one-sided defeat in a major; a crushing 6-2, 6-2 defeat in the second round of last year's French Open.

The 21-year-old Muguruza had been the first Spanish woman in the Wimbledon finals since Conchita Martinez ended Martina Navratilova's quest for a tenth title in 1994. Seeded 20 at Wimbledon, she'll be ranked at a career-high No. 9 on the women's tour next week. Her defeat means two-time winner Petra Kvitova remains the only player - male or female - born in the 1990s to have won a grand slam. Bloomberg

MALAYSIA MUST OVERCOME LEGACY OF PATRONAGE POLITICS

Malaysian Prime Minister Najib Razak may very well be, as he insists, innocent of charges that nearly USD700 million in government-linked funds ended up in his personal accounts. But his handling of the scandal thus far has only underscored weaknesses in the Malaysian political system.

The accusations against Najib revolve around the finances of 1Malaysia Development Bhd. - a debt-ridden state investment company whose advisory board he chairs. In early July, the Wall Street Journal reported that hundreds of millions of dollars may have moved through agencies linked to 1MDB and landed in accounts controlled by the prime minister. Najib has alleged a political conspiracy to undermine him and vowed not to resign. He's threatened to sue the Journal, while Malaysian police have launched a probe into how reporters obtained the evidence for its story. The Journal has said it stands by its reporting.

Whatever the facts of the case, Najib inhabits a system that has long suffered from allegations of cronyism. His United Malays National Organization has dominated the government since independence in 1957, in part through gerrymandering and affirmative-action policies that favor the Malay majority. Having carefully cultivated the 191 division leaders who have the power to remove him as party leader, Najib can likely cling to his position regardless of what facts are revealed - or what voters may want. The opposition coalition was successfully fractured by the recent conviction of its leader, Anwar Ibrahim, on apparently spurious sodomy charges. Retrograde sedition laws and a docile domestic media further stifle dissent in Malaysia. Najib recently postponed internal UMNO elections until 2018, making a party coup even harder.

Four different official investigations into 1MDB had been announced before the Journal's report: by the government's auditor general, a parliamentary committee, the police and the central bank. But questions linger over how independent any of these can be. Najib's ruling coalition dominates the legislature. The police fall under the home minister's authority. And Najib, who is finance minister as well as prime minister, nominates the central bank governor. On Thursday, the head of the parliamentary committee reported that an interim report from the auditor general had found no suspicious activity at 1MDB, although the company had reportedly withheld some bank and investment documents from investigators.

A "special task force" announced last weekend, led by the attorney general, appears to be investigating with more vigor. It has removed documents and computers from the 1MDB offices and frozen six bank accounts associated with the case. (It hasn't named the banks or said to whom the accounts belong, except to note that the freeze orders didn't involve accounts allegedly held by Najib.) Still, its scope and authority are vague.

If the prime minister truly wants to clear his name, he should abandon his threats to sue the Journal and instead open his books to investigators - something he hasn't yet pledged to do or confirmed he's done. He should make way for a truly independent investigation of the charges against him - perhaps structured as a royal commission with wide-ranging powers.

More important for avoiding such scandals in the future is to eliminate the patronage politics that encourage corruption, and this will require far broader reform. Malaysia needs a thriving opposition and a freer media, as well as a far more powerful and independent anti-corruption agency. Stricter campaign funding rules would reduce the risk of vote-buying. Officials' personal finances should be made more transparent.

Najib has earned praise for his stewardship of the economy; Malaysia recently avoided a Fitch downgrade on the strength of its improving fiscal finances and its relatively healthy growth rates. The country's reputation, though, no less than Najib's, is suffering a grievous blow. Neither will be easily healed. **Bloomberg**

Cairo explosion destroys parts of Italian consulate

A blast rocked central Cairo on Saturday, destroyed parts of the Italian consulate, said Gamal Halawa, deputy head of Cairo's Civil Defense. The blast was caused by a car bomb, Al Arabiya television reported, citing a security official it didn't identify. Mina Erian, head of the Italian Club, which is located in the consulate's compound, said by phone that there were no casualties among the consulate's staff. An Egyptian national was wounded in the explosion, state-run Ahram Gate website reported.

"It was very loud, very frightening," Abdo El-Rashidy, a security guard at the consulate, said by phone. "The windows and doors of one side of the consulate were shattered." Attacks have increased in Egypt in the past month. A car bomb killed the country's top prosecutor on June 29. Two days later, militants affiliated with Islamic State in northern Sinai struck security forces, killing at least 20 soldiers before the army regained control.

David Chow's Cape Verde project green lighted

THE Minister of Tourism, Investment and Business Development of Cape Verde is due to visit China later this month to sign a contract for tourism investment with Macau businessman David Chow, reported Cape Verdean weekly newspaper A Semana.

The paper said that the minister, who is due to travel on 23 July, will sign the contract for the Cape Verde Integrated Resort & Casino, a luxury project being built on the islet of Santa Maria, near Praia, which will require an investment of about USD250 million.

The construction works

for this project, "which promises to be the investment that will radically change the face, life, and economy of Praia and the country" and

■ The project will require a USD250m investment

which is currently under public consultation, are due to start in 2016.

Last June, the Cape Verdean press reported the Macau businessman planned

to visit Cape Verde in early July, on the occasion of the festivities of Independence (5 July), "but only if the government had managed to conclude the environmental impact study."

At that time Minister Leonesa Fortes gave assurances that David Chow was still interested in the venture, which includes a luxury hotel, an international convention center, a marina and a bridge connecting the islet to the mainland, in addition to renewing the entire coastline in the Gamboa area, completely changing the face of that part of the Cape Verdean capital.
