



VER 1,400 Pearl Horizon flat-owners gathered outside the Polytec Asset's headquarters on Sunday. The group froze traffic around a nearby roundabout in a desperate attempt to protest against the authorities' decision to recover the land.

The chaos unfolded at around noon on the day marking the 16th year since the region's return to Chinese sovereignty. "2018, I want my flat ready. 2018, I want my flat ready," chanted the protesters en masse, holding placards bearing various slogans. Aside from expressing opposition against the revocation of the land concession, they demanded a direct dialogue with the relevant high-level government officials.

Shortly later, the crowd of protesters forced a shutdown of the area after some of them spilled onto the road. At least 25 vehicles were seen driving slowly around the roundabout to assist with the paralyzing effort.

CE vows to further diversify the region's economy

THIEF Executive Chui Sai On has pledged to push forward with efforts to combine the gaming and non-gaming industries at a time when diversified economic and regional collabo-

ration is highly emphasized. The CE's pledge came at a reception on Sunday marking the 16th year after Macau's return to China, which he was attending prior to a trip to Beijing on Monday.

"In the coming year, the development of Macau will still be affected by the complicated and ever-changing external environment. We believe opportunities always come with challenges," he said in an address.

"We are pleased that China's Thirteenth Five-Year Plan clearly states the aim development of Macau will still be affected by the complicated and everchanging external environment.

of fully leveraging Macau's unique advantages, coupled with elevating Macau's posi-



tion and functions in national economic development, and opening up policy," he continued.

The Chief Executive believes that the local government's own version of the five-year plan, which was announced last month, would complement the central government's blueprint in highlighting its strategy of "one belt, one road."

"Through top-level planning and supportive coordination, it helps Macau to realize better growth and integrate with the country's overall development," he expressed.

On the sidelines of the ceremony, Chui told media it was evident that, over the past two years, the "added values of the non-gaming elements in sever major industries were undeniably encouraging."

His statement points to the industries of architecture, finance, hotels, retail and catering.

Furthermore, he stressed that the offerings at the resort complexes that should emerge in the future must

be predominantly non-gaming. "We also have applied a ratio of nine to one [of non-gaming to gaming elements] for the new integrated resorts. Ninety percent has to be non-gaming elements," he said.

Chui also said that, in the next two years, the authorities would continue their commitment to pushing for a more diversified economy.

He said: "We're also confident that given the integration of the two sides, the government would be inclined to support adequate diversity, and small and mediumsized enterprises."

Speaking of the gaming earnings in the next year, Chu remained confident about the outlook of the casinos and stressed that "there would be a surplus."



Authorities well prepared for new maritime sovereignty rule

THE Macau Customs ■ Service (SA) has started to enforce new measures after the central government granted the region sovereignty over the 85-square-kilometer nautical area off the region's coast.

Beijing's bestowal officially came into effect on Sunday, and Chief Executive Chui Sai On highlighted the importance of the measure during his speech at the ceremonies marking the 16th anniversary of the MSAR's establishment.

"Given the significance of the central government's supportive measures, we must ensure that the waters under the Macau SAR's jurisdiction can be properly administered and appropriately used to effectively expedite adequate economic diversification and facilitate Macau's sustainable development," Chui clai-



med in his address.

However, the local government still has to

seek confirmation from Beijing over any future reclamation. It was made clear that no gaming-related establishment would be allowed to be built on reclaimed land in the

Under the new rule, the parcel of land connecting the northern checkpoint and Zhuhai goes to the local authorities' administrative sovereignty. Furthermore, part of the Canal Dos Patos, a waterway separating the mainland from the north of the Macau Peninsula, would also come under local control.

The administrable water area stretches down part of the waterway lying to the west of the Macau Peninsula's inner harbor, all the way down alongside Taipa and Coloane before it turns eastwards, covering a large portion of the sea off the region's eastern coast.

In a bid to make a prompt response within half an hour possible in

the waters surrounding the region, the SA has activated its new command center and three operation bases.

According to an SA statement issued yesterday, officers have also been briefed about the add-on equipment and gear inside the center before they set out for patrol on Sun-

The new facility takes in audio, video and radar signals from along the coastal areas of the region and nearby waters around the clock. The customs' patrol vessels will also perform duties at the behest of the personnel from the center.

Together with the other three bases, the Customs personnel are reportedly capable of responding in 30 minutes to any contingency within the waters that is being managed by local authorities, the statement said. **AU**

CCAC to release report on 16 idle land parcels

Commission Against Corruption (CCAC) Commissioner André Cheong Weng Chon has hinted that the report of an inquiry into the 16 land parcels that are exempt from recovery by authorities would be made public next week, following half a year of work. The report has already reached the region's leader for his consideration, he revealed. The official decision to let go of the land parcels, which had previously been slated for reclamation by authorities, came last June. However, it shortly triggered public opposition, which prompted the chief executive's order of an inquiry. The report was scheduled to be ready last month, but the commissioner apologized for the belated release, citing the substantial amount of information being considered as a reason. Meanwhile, to the CCAC head revealed that the probe into the defunct cracker factory, which was embroiled in a land swap scandal, is expected to be completed after next year's Chinese Lunar New Year.

Lessons from Leong on surviving Macau's gambling downturn

has characters like billionaire tycoons Sheldon Adelson and Steve Wynn. In the world's largest gambling market of Macau, there's Angela Leong.

A lawmaker, business executive and mother-of-five, Leong has been a prominent figure in the former Portuguese colony since meeting her spouse, 94-year-old casino baron Stanley Ho, about three decades ago. In a recent interview, the 54-year-old shared her approach to adversities, the most recent of which is a 18-month-long slump in Macau's gaming revenue that, she says, must be met by the government with faster infrastructure completion.

Her motto, which she learned from Ho: "pee with eyes wide open." Speaking in her native Cantonese, Leong repeats a saying that's not in regular use in the southern Chinese dialect, let alone easily translated into English. "It means, you know someone is going to trip you up, and you pretend you don't notice and let it go," says Leong, who is executive director of SJM Holdings Ltd., Asia's largest casino company.

"Let's be very direct," she continues, her voice raspy from a respiratory infection. "You come and interview me today. If your article isn't in line with my views, I'll let it go." But there won't be another interview, she said on Oct. 26.

Success for Leong, the mother of the youngest five of Ho's 17 children, hasn't come easily. The former dancer successfully fended off a messy family dispute in 2011 that was mounted by women Ho also regards as wives, and his children.

"She can be quite feisty," says Allan Zeman, a Hong Kongbased businessman and vice chairman of Wynn Macau Ltd., who has known Leong socially for 20 years. "She absolutely says what's on her mind, no matter who she's with, no matter where she is. That's what gains her respect from most people. She's not afraid."

That forthrightness comes through when outlining the changes Leong says Macau's government needs to make to facilitate the city's economic recovery: faster decision-making and better infrastructure planning.

"I'm not afraid of criticism," she said. "I do what I believe

is right." Leong joined a dance troupe in the southern Chinese province of Guangdong and traveled in 1982 to Macau, where she met Ho four years later through his brother, then taking a dance class she was teaching at the time. By then, the daughter of a Chinese army officer already owned several apartments, according to a report in the Wall Street Journal in April 2011. And by the early 1990s, Leong was spearheading property deals for Ho's business in Guangdong, according to the report.

"Ho got her started, but she was able to take it to another level," Zeman said. "She's a very good entrepreneur. She's done a lot of things on her own."

Today, she owns more than 30 apartments in Macau, according to a document filed in 2013 by Leong, who reported her assets as required as a legislator there.

In Hong Kong, Leong is chairwoman of Master Land (HK) Ltd., owner of the 21-story BOC Group Life Assurance Tower whose value more than doubled to HK\$2 billion since its purchase seven years ago, according to data from Centaline Property Agency Ltd. Local newspaper Ming Pao reported that Leong also owns the retail and office development Entertainment Building in the heart of the city's financial district whose value has appreciated more than five-fold to as much as HK\$14 billion since it was bought in 2005, Centaline said. Leong's office declined to comment on her assets.

Her investments also span from a local canidrome operator to massage services. She's also a vice chairwoman of Macau Jockey Club, head of a gaming promoter association, chairs a local dance and sports association, and is involved in local charities.

Leong, whom Ho called his "fourth wife," emerged as a win-

ner when the elderly Ho split his fortune among his family members. Today, she controls a \$315 million interest with a 8.1 percent stake in SJM Holdings, which owns 20 out of Macau's 36 casinos, the most for one company in the city.

SJM shares have fallen 57 percent in Hong Kong trading this year, compared with the 7.8

A member of China's top political advisory body, she also owns a 6.86 percent stake in SJM's unlisted parent, Sociedade de Turismo e Diversoes de Macau SA, a company whose

assets include hotels, real estate, financial services and infrastructure development.

That fortune is being shaken by President Xi Jinping's anti-corruption crackdown and a slowing Chinese economy, which are keeping away the high rollers whose wagers generate more than half Macau's casino revenue. It's the city's worst downturn since authorities in the Special Administrative Region ended Ho's four decadeold gambling monopoly in 2001 by opening up the market to competitors such as Wynn Resorts Ltd. and Adelson's Las Vegas Sands Corp.

Not dismayed, Leong says she continues to enjoy the support and advice of wheelchair-bound Ho, whom she describes as an "enlightener, friend and a mentor" and who has said that Macau's casinos have been developing too fast. "I wouldn't be where I am today without his help," she said.

Before dashing to her next appointment, Leong reflects on her busy schedule that she says has meant wearing the same pair of dark blue, loose-fitting trousers two days in a row.

"You have to manage your time well, you have to work hard," Leong says. **Bloomberg**

Packer fans speculation of Crown bid by resigning from board

Angus Whitley

JAMES Packer stepped down as a director of Crown Resorts Ltd., intensifying speculation he's closer to bidding for the company or some of its assets.

The billionaire's closely held investment vehicle, which controls Crown, has talked to private-equity firms and pension funds about a possible joint offer for some Crown assets, Bloomberg News reported last week. Packer is considering teaming up with a partner to take Crown private, the Australian newspaper reported yesterday.

Standing aside at Crown, just months after he stepped down as chairman, gives Packer the freedom to mount a bid while distancing himself from the board's response. Following last week's reports, his investment company said it had held talks with third parties about its stake in Crown.

"He's giving himself the op-

tion to do something," said Sam Fimis, a wealth adviser at Patersons Securities Ltd. in Melbourne. "Whether it's his intention or not, he's sending a clear message to the market."

Crown shares advanced as much as 6.4 percent in Sydney trading as Packer said in a statement the company remains his "biggest professional prio-

rity." The shares ended 4.1 percent higher at A\$12.08, taking the company's market value to A\$8.8 billion (USD6.3 billion). Before news emerged of a potential deal involving Packer, the stock had fallen 33 percent from a February high.

"We have so much more to deliver for shareholders," Packer said in the statement released by Crown to the stock exchange. Crown "represents the vast majority of my net wealth," he said.

Packer's Consolidated Press Holdings Pty owns about 53 percent of Crown. In turn, Crown owns 34 percent of Nasdaq- listed Melco Crown Entertainment Ltd., which runs casinos in Macau.

Crown's earnings - and Packer's fortune - have been dented by a MSAR government crackdown on illicit money flows and a China-wide campaign against corruption that deterred VIP players.

Consolidated Press said last week that a deal "of the nature speculated in the media" hadn't been proposed to Crown. A full buyout of Crown may be too costly, Deutsche Bank AG said in a report last week. Another option for Packer's investment company is to buy Crown's stake in Melco Crown for about A\$4.1 billion to make Crown's valuation more transparent, Deutsche Bank said

Melco Crown in October opened the Hollywood-themed \$3.2 billion Studio City resort in Macau that features a giant Ferris wheel and virtual Batman ride. Packer will remain co-chairman of Melco Crown, as well as co-chairman of Alon, Crown's Las Vegas casino project.

In yesterday's statement, Packer said he'll focus on the casino projects in Sydney, Melbourne and Las Vegas, where Crown either owns or is building major resorts, Crown said in its statement. Crown already runs casinos in Melbourne and Perth. **Bloomberg**

Spain's Mireia Lalaguna Royo wins Miss World title

SPAIN'S Mireia Lalaguna Royo was named the winner of the Miss World 2015 competition in the southern Chinese island resort of Sanya, an event dogged by controversy over China's refusal to allow Canada's entrant to attend.

Sofia Nikitchuk of Russia was the runner-up and Indonesia's Maria Harfanti took third place in the Saturday night final following a lengthy competition featuring 114 women.

Each had won the right to represent their country in a series of local and regional competi-

The victory marked the first-ever win for a Spanish contestant. "I think this is a good decision, because Miss World is not looking for our body, they are looking for a soul," said Lalaguna, a 23-year-old model from Barcelona with a degree in pharmacology who plans to pursue a master's degree in nutrition. She placed first in the competition's top model contest and appeared to impress the judges with her public

"I think it's important that they don't want to see only our bodies, they are looking for moral things," she said.

Not present was Miss Canada, Chinese-born Anastasia Lin, who had been prevented from boarding her connecting flight

to Sanya from Hong Kong last month after China refused her a visa.

Lin is an outspoken critic of Chinese religious policy and a follower of the Falun Gong meditation practice, which was outlawed by China in 1999.

She said that after she won the Canadian title, Chinese security agents visited her father, who still lives in China, in an apparent attempt to intimidate her into silence.

China has hosted the competition seven times, starting in 2003, as part of its attempts

to project a more modern, outgoing image. However, the controversy over Lin's attendance illustrates the authoritarian

communist government's determination to do so on its own terms, regardless of the cost to the country's reputation.

Neither Beijing nor the London-based Miss World Organization has commented on the controversy.

It was the second consecutive year that outside events intruded on the competition. Last year's contest in London was marred by the murder the month before of Miss Honduras and her sister in that country.

The first Miss World contest was held 64 years ago in Britain. AP

$\mathbf{B}^{\mathbf{EIJING}}$ was enveloped in eye-watering, throat-irritating smog on Saturday as the second red alert of the month went into effect in the Chinese capital, forcing many cars off the roads and restricting factory production.

A wave of smog settled over the notoriously polluted city of 22.5 million overnight and is forecast to last into Tuesday because of a lack of strong winds.

Smog red alerts, the most serious in a four-tier warning system, are triggered when high pollution levels are forecast to last more than 72 hours.

Levels of PM2.5, the tiniest and deadliest airborne particles, rose to as high as 331 in some parts of Beijing on Saturday and are predicted to top 500 in the coming days more than 20 times the level considered safe by the World Health Organization.

As a result of the red alert, schools were ordered closed and half the city's cars forced off the roads each day. Barbecue grills and other outdoor smoke sources have been banned and factory production res-

While some balked at the inconveniences, most Beijingers appeared to support the measures after a lengthy stretch when the government was seen as largely ignoring the smog problem.

"I think (the government) is doing a better job than before," Beijing resident Ma Yunan said. "In previous times, the government would not issue red alerts even

when the haze was very serious. Now they are publishing alerts beforehand for us to get ourselves prepared and the alerts are accompanied with some measures."

Although the smog warning system was launched two years ago, Beijing had not issued a red alert until Dec. 7, drawing accusations that it was ignoring serious bouts of smog to avoid the economic costs

The smog in Beijing is largely blamed on coal burning power plants, industrial pollution and the booming number of vehicles. The city's geography worsens the problem because mountains on three sides trap smog, and cold winter air presses down on it to keep it from clearing.

While waiting for promised plans to cut coal pollution to take effect, residents of Beijing and other polluted cities in northern China adapt by wearing face masks and equipping their homes with air filters.

China, the world's biggest carbon emitter, plans to reduce hazardous emissions from coal-fired power plants by 50 percent over the next five years, and says its overall emissions will peak by about 2030 before starting to decline.

Scientific studies attribute 1.4 million premature deaths per year to China's smog, or almost 4,000 per day. AP

Authority names and shames 5 tourists over bad behavior

THINA'S tourism authority named and shamed another five tourists for bad behavior and says it is working with airlines on a possible flying ban. Those added to the list of "uncivilized behavior" by tourists include two women and a man who brawled after one woman's seat was bumped during boarding of a flight from Cambodia to the western city of Chengdu.

The three were forcibly removed from the plane under captain's orders and the flight was delayed for one hour, the China National Tourism Administration said.

Another man was listed after he was arrested in Japan for assaulting a convenience store clerk whom he accused of disrespecting his wife. The last was a woman who attacked her tour guide with hot tea after learning the price of her son's ticket to a western China scenic site was not included in the package.

Their names and a description of their alleged misbehavior were entered onto the administration's list and will remain there for one to three years.

Over that period, they can be refused service by travel agents, airlines, hotels and scenic sites.

In a further step, the administration said it was working with major Chinese airlines on "enacting definite restrictive measures" against those on the list, which currently includes 16 names in total.

The government has grown concerned about the negative impact on China's image stemming from numerous incidents of bad behavior by Chinese tourists at home and abroad, ranging from fighting with air crews to defacing cultural artifacts.

Social media platforms have spread descriptions and video clips of the incidents, prompting widespread derision among the public and occasional online campaigns to identify the perpetrators.

Rising incomes, relaxed regulations and cheap flights have permitted record numbers of Chinese to travel in recent years. Among other frequent complaints are line-cutting, smoking where banned, littering and fouling public toilets. AP

ESCUERS searched yesterday for 85 missing people a day after the collapse of a mountain of excavated soil and construction waste that had been piled up over two years in China's manufacturing center of Shenzhen.

Authorities said the landslide buried or damaged 33 buildings in the industrial park in Shenzhen, a city near Hong Kong that makes products used around the world ranging from cellphones to cars.

Residents blamed the government while officials cited human error, with one ministry saying, "The pile was too big, the pile was too steep."

The landslide Sunday covered an area of 380,000 square meters (450,000 square yards) with silt 10 meters (33 feet) deep, authorities said. At least 16 people were hospitalized, including children, the official Xinhua News Agency said.

The Shenzhen government said seven trapped people had been rescued and 85 others remained missing yesterday evening. Earlier in the day it had said 91 people were missing and seven rescued, but it gave no explanation for the change in the missing. No deaths had been reported.

The landslide is the fourth major disaster to strike China in a year following a deadly New Year's Eve stampede in Shanghai, the capsizing of a cruise ship in the Yangtze River and a massive explosion at a chemicals warehouse in Tianjin on the coast near Beijing.

Human error has been suspected or confirmed in all three previous disasters, pointing to an often callous attitude toward safety in China despite the threat of harsh penalties.

In Sunday's landslide, the Ministry of Land and Resources said a steep man-made mountain of dirt, cement chunks and other construction waste had been piled up against a 100-meter (330-foot) -high hill over the past two years.

Heavy rains in the region saturated the soil, making it heavy and unstable, and ultimately causing it to collapse with massive force.

"The pile was too big, the pile was too steep, leading to instability and collapse," the ministry

said, adding that the original, natural hill remained intact.

Some residents blamed government negligence.

"If the government had taken proper measures in the first place, we would not have had this problem," said Chen Chengli.

Chen's neighbor, Yi Jimin, said the disaster wasn't an act of na-

"Heavy rains and a collapse of a mountain are natural disasters, but this wasn't a natural disaster, this was man-made," Yi said.

Aerial photos from the microblog of the Public Security Ministry's Firefighting Bureau showed the area awash in a sea of red mud, with buildings either knocked on their side or collapsed entirely.

Posts on the microblog said the mud had filled many of the buildings, leaving the "room of survival extremely small."

Cellphone camera video of the disaster on state broadcaster CCTV showed a massive wall of debris slamming into the buildings and sending up huge plumes of dust.

A man who runs a store selling cigarettes and alcohol less than a kilometer (a half mile) from the site said local residents had known that the pile of soil was dangerous and feared something bad would happen.

"We heard a sound like an explosion and then all we saw was smoke," said the man, who gave only his surname, Dong. "We knew what had happened immediately."

The Ministry of Land and Resources said it had dispatched personnel to help guard against a second collapse.

The damaged buildings included 14 factories, two office buildings, one cafeteria, three dormitories and 13 sheds or workshops, Shenzhen Deputy Mayor Liu Qingsheng said at a news conference.

The Shenzhen government said 600 people had been relocated.

Nearly 3,000 people were involved in the rescue efforts, aided by 151 cranes, backhoes and other construction equipment, along with rescue dogs and specialized life-detecting equipment.

CCTV said President Xi Jinping and Premier Li Keqiang issued orders to make rescuing those trapped the top priority.

The initial landslide sparked an explosion in a gas pipeline owned by PetroChina, the country's top oil and gas producer. By yesterday morning, the fire was extinguished and a temporary section of pipe was being laid.

Three decades of headlong economic growth have been catching up with China in terms of safety and damage to the environment. Many of the country's major cities suffer from chronic air pollution. A four-day smog red alert continued in Beijing yesterday, forcing schools to close, factories to curtail production and half the city's cars off the roads. AP

Wal-Mart looks to China for new US marketing chief

WAL-MART is turning to its marketing chief in China to shape how it relays its message to shoppers in the U.S. The world's largest retailer named Tonv Rogers as chief marketing officer for the U.S. Friday.

He will report to Greg Foran, president and CEO of Wal-Mart's U.S. division starting in mid-January. Rogers, a 10-year-veteran at the company, has been the head of marketing and social media in China for two years.

Rogers succeeds longtime marketing chief Stephen Quinn, who retires next month. Wal-Mart has also beefed up its marketing muscle by hiring former Target marketing executive Michael Francis as consultant. Fran-

cis is best known for his nearly 30-year career at Target, where he helped create the discounter's cheap-chic image through whimsical advertising.

Wal-Mart Stores Inc., in a shift, is focusing on higher-income shoppers where it sees more growth. But it's still a tricky feat. The Bentonville. Arkansas-based company announced in October that annual profit could fall as much as 12 percent for its fiscal 2017 as it invests heavily online and in

its stores. The retailer is facing increasing competition from online players Amazon.com and from dollar-store chains.

Prior to moving to China, Rogers worked for eight years in the Wal -Mart's marketing division. Before joining Wal -Mart, Rogers spent several years with Pepsi-Co's Frito-Lay division. **AP**

HAILAND'S government said yesterday it is not ignoring the slavery and forced labor in its lucrative shrimp industry that was highlighted in an Associated Press investigation published last week.

Government spokesman Sansern Kaewkamnerd, flanked by police, navy and other officials, held a news conference specifically to address issues raised by the AP story. The report has elicited widespread reactions around the world, including from major food companies in the U.S., Europe and Australia that buy Thai seafood.

Sansern said the government was already aware of slavery in the industry before the AP report was released Dec. 14.

"The report said that government officials ignore (this matter) ... This is not the truth," he said. "Authorities found it first," he said, adding that the Thai government wants the shrimp industry to have "proper working conditions according to international laws."

Thailand is one of the world's biggest shrimp providers and its seafood export industry is estimated to bring in about \$7 billion annually.

The AP report revealed the widespread use of undocumented migrant laborers, many from neighboring Myanmar. Many of these laborers end up being tricked or sold into shrimp-peeling sheds where they are forced to work 16-hour days with no time off and little or no pay for sometimes years at a time.

Many workers are held under debt bondage, forced to repay money the company gave to the agents who sold them. Some end up locked inside. Others are allowed to go out, but only if they leave their children or spouse behind as a guarantee against running away.

Thai government says it's not ignoring shrimp sheds slavery

At the news conference yesterday government officials did not deny the existence of forced labor. But they disputed parts of the story, especially the AP's assertion that police took bribes and turned a blind eye to the practices in the industry.

"This is not true," Sansern said without elaborating.

The AP stood by its report, part of a series of investigations this year into slavery in the fishing industry in the region. More than 2,000 trapped fishermen were freed earlier this year from an island in Indonesia as a result of the AP's work. The reports also have led to a dozen arrests, millions of dollars' worth of seizures and proposals for new federal laws.

"We stand firmly behind our reporters' coverage, which has been scrupulous, thorough and fair," said Paul Colford, an AP vice president and director of media relations. "Their stories exposing the enslavement of workers in the Southeast Asian fishing industry have been a source of great pride throughout The Associated Press."

The AP focused last week's story on a shrimp shed southwest of Bangkok in Samut Sakhon, the heart of the country's shrimp processing industry. The shed was raided last month after a worker escaped. But while several undocumented workers were detained, no one with the company was arrested on human-trafficking charges, and the shed reopened days later.

Police in Bangkok have since ordered local authorities to re -investigate the shed for human trafficking. Arrests have been made, the shed has been closed and Samut Sakhon police have held a meeting to explain human-trafficking laws to shed

The story noted that the government has recently passed laws to crack down on abusive employers, but also revealed gaps in those efforts, with some former slaves saying police sold them to agents to be trafficked again.

Sansern also took issue with the AP's statement that human

trafficking "has helped turn Thailand into one of the world's biggest shrimp providers."

The AP report also pinpointed the case of a man and his pregnant wife from Myanmar who had been trapped with nearly 100 other Burmese migrants, including children who worked alongside them. Among them was a girl so small she had to stand on a stool to reach the peeling tables.

Sansern said there might be five or 10 people like that couple, "but they don't represent all 3 million migrant workers that Thailand looks after."

Sansern said pictures showing children seated with parents at the work table reflects "Asian lifestyle" and not necessarily child labor. But he added that this needs to change and said authorities are now allocating space for children away from the work area.

Kornchai Klayklueng, the head of the anti-human trafficking wing of the police, told the same news conference that "a number of things, including the report about debt-bound laborers, interest us, and we are looking into it and will prosecute" the culprits.

A day after the AP report, Thiraphong Chansiri, the president of Thai Union, one of the world's biggest seafood exporters, expressed frustration and promised change. He said the AP investigation should be a "wake -up call" to the industry. Many exporters have bought shrimp from, or outsourced peeling work to, smaller operators who have less oversight. AP

80 missing, 3 dead as big waves sink boat

ESCUERS have pul-Red out 39 survivors and three dead from a passenger boat that sank in central Indonesia after being buffeted by high waves, and resumed efforts yesterday to reach scores of others still missing.

The fiberglass ferry was on its way from Kolaka in Southeast Sulawesi province crossing the Gulf of Bone to Siwa town in South Sulawesi province, when it was overwhelmed by waves more than 3 meters (10 feet) high during stormy wea-

ther Saturday, said Roki Asikin, head of the search and rescue agency in Makassar, the capital of South Sulawesi.

The boat was carrying 110 passengers and 12 crew members, Asikin said. The passengers included 14 children.

Operational chief of the local search rescue agency Ivan Ahmad Rizki Titus said the National Search and Rescue Agency was deploying a helicopter and boats, while the navy was sending in warships to join the rescue efforts. He added that a CN-235 aircraft of the air force joined the search Sunday. Earlier, six rescue boats and ships were dispatched after they received a distress call from the crew, who reported that the vessel was starting to take on water about 21 kilometers southeast of

Siwa port, Asikin said. Fishermen found four people who had been on the boat, including a woman and a child. They told authorities that the boat sank hours after being hit by high waves.

Thirty-five other survivors and three bodies were found later Sunday, said Transportation Ministry spokesman Julius Barata. He said all of the survivors were taken to hospitals.

The search for the 80 people still missing was called off at nightfall Sunday and resumed yesterday morning.

Television video showed dozens of family members anxiously waiting for their loved ones at the Siwa port.

The acting chief of the Kolaka port authority, Muhammad Yunus, said the Marina boat was seaworthy when it left for the estimated six-hour voyage. Indonesian boat accidents have killed hundreds of people in recent years. AP

strong showing Sunday by a pair of upstart parties in Spain's general election upended the country's traditional two-party system, with the ruling Popular Party winning the most votes but falling far short of a parliamentary majority and at risk of being booted from power.

Days or weeks of negotiations will be needed to determine who will govern Spain, with the new far-left Podemos and business-friendly Ciudadanos parties producing shockwaves because of strong support from voters weary of high unemployment, a seemingly endless string of official corruption cases and disgust over the country's political status quo.

If forced out of government, Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy and his Popular Party would become the third European victims this year of a voter backlash against austerity following elections in Greece and Portugal seen as ballot box rebellions against unpopular tax hikes and spending cuts invoked during the eurozone's debt crisis.

In past Spanish elections, the Popular Party and the main opposition Socialists were the established powerhouses and only needed support from tiny parties to get a majority in parliament when they didn't win one from voters.

But Podemos came in a strong third place and Ciudadanos took fourth in their first election fielding national candidates — setting up a period of uncertainty as parties negotiate with each other to see which ones may be able to form a governing alliance.

"Spain is not going to be the same anymore and we are very happy," said a jubilant Pablo Iglesias, the pony-tailed leader of Podemos. With 99.9 percent of the vote counted, the Popular Party won 123 seats in the 350-member lower house of Parliament far below the 186-seat majority it won four years ago after beating the Socialists in a landslide. The Socialist Party received 90 seats, while Podemos and allies won 69 and Ciudadanos got 40.

Analysts said the outcome will make it extremely difficult for the Popular Party to form a coalition or get voted into parliament as a minority government because it does not get enough seats by allying only with Ciudadanos, its closest possible ideological partner.

The Popular Party would also need support from parties that won 17 seats in the northeastern Catalonia region and are seeking independence from Spain or want more regional financial power and feel **GENERAL ELECTION**

alienated by Rajoy's firm rejection of their causes.

And Spain has never had a so called "grand coalition" that would bring the Popular Party and the Socialists together. Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy told cheering supporters shortly after midnight yesterday that he would try to form a government but didn't provide any details of how he might accomplish that

"This party is still the No. 1 force in Spain," Rajoy declared. But Socialist leader Pedro Sanchez said the result clearly shows "Spain wants a move to the left," adding that he and his party are ready for talks that could lead to a governing ac-

The Socialists could try to team up with Podemos and

Ciudadanos in a three-way "coalition of losers" similar to an electoral outcome that happened in neighboring Portugal last month. Also possible for the Socialists is a deal with Podemos plus smaller regional parties that won just a few seats each — not requiring the support of Ciudadanos.

"It looks like a Socialist government," said Federico Santi, a London-based analyst with the Eurasia Group political risk consultancy.

"Reaching a deal between the Socialists, Ciudadanos and Podemos is not going to be straightforward. ... But if the alternative is leaving the country without a government, the pressure will be on the parties."

Podemos and Ciudadanos both gained strength by portraying the Popular Party and the Socialists as out-of-touch behemoths run by politicians who care more about maintaining their own power than citizens' needs.

Miguel Redondo, a 19-year -old Madrid university student, said he voted for Podemos because "it's the party that best understands the difficulties that young people are going through" in a nation where joblessness for people under 25 is more than double the country's overall 21 percent unemployment rate.

Spain's 36.5 million registered voters elected representatives

to the lower house of parliament and to the Senate, which has less legislative power. Voting was brisk with lines outside some polling stations and voter participation of 73.2 percent, up from 68.9 percent in the 2011 election.

Francisco Herrera, a 43-year -old porter in Madrid, said he was disappointed with Rajoy's leadership, but voted for the Popular Party because it "defends the economy and the type of government that suits us right now."

The nation's devastating economic crisis, non-stop corruption scandals and a separatist drive in the northeastern region of Catalonia have dominated Spanish politics over the past four years. Rajoy has boasted about his handling of the economy, done his best to skirt the corruption minefield and has vowed to halt the independence push.

administration's His ggest success has been in pulling Spain back from an economic abyss in 2012 and returning the economy to steady growth, but the jobless rate has come down slowly and salaries for people entering the workforce are 30 percent lower than they were in 2008. This fueled claims by Ciudadanos and Podemos that the Socialists plunged Spain into an economic crisis and the Popular Party failed to fix the problem.

Rajoy's party adopted unpopular austerity measures and labor and financial reforms that are credited with creating jobs but blamed for damaging the country's social welfare system. Although Spain's economy is now one of the fastest-growing in the 28-nation European Union, its unemployment rate is the second-highest in the EU after Greece.

Rajoy's administration has also been hurt by his U-turn on a promise not to raise taxes and by cuts to national health care and public education. And many Spaniards are angry about what they perceive as the impunity of politicians and business leaders amid incessant corruption cases.

The question of independence for economically and politically powerful Catalonia has divided that region and soured political ties with the rest of Spain. Rajoy vowed to quash what is seen as the biggest threat to Spanish unity in recent decades. Other parties favor negotiations to devolve more power to Catalonia, and Podemos wants to let Catalan separatists hold a secession referendum.

Rajoy, 60, championed conservative social policies, siding with the Roman Catholic Church against abortion. But he raised questions about his future as the Popular Party leader by including his deputy, 44-year -old Soraya Saenz de Santamaria, on campaign posters.

Sanchez, a 43-year-old former university economics professor, was unknown to most Spaniards until he was elected leader last year of the

Iglesias, 37, and his party want to break the mold of Spanish politics. Podemos, or We Can in English, was born from massive Madrid street protests in 2011 that drew mainly young Spaniards weary of corruption.

Ciudadanos, which means Citizens, has the media-savvy Albert Rivera as its leader. At 36, he was the youngest candidate, and his party featured moderate, business-friendly policies plus a pledge to crack down on corruption.

After voting in a Barcelona suburb, Rivera said the election marks the start of a new era especially for young Spaniards like himself, born after the nation's 1939-1975 dictatorship.

"Those of us who didn't experience the first democratic transition are experiencing a second one," Rivera said. AP

Journalists and members of the public were kept well away from the heavily guarded Skibo Castle near Dornoch in Sutherland. Among those on the star-studded guest list were Sting, dressed in a kilt, and his wife Trudie Styler. They introduced the couple two

The actress Gwyneth Paltrow was maid of honor and two best-men were nightclub owner Piers Adam and film producer Matthew Vaughn. Also invited were actor Rupert Everett and fashion designers Stella McCartney and Donatella Versace.

Madonna, aged 42, married Mr Ritchie, who is ten years her junior, in a ceremony steeped in the groom's Scottish heritage. Mr Ritchie wore a kilt in the Hunting Mackintosh tartan and his bride's white Gothic-style dress was adorned with a sash of the same tartan. The bride was given away by her father, Tony Ciccone, and watched by her four-year-old daughter Lourdes.

A Church of Scotland minister, the Rev Susan Brown, who had baptized the couple's four-month old son Rocco yesterday in Dornoch Cathedral, presided. Then guests were treated to a smoked salmon and haggis champagne reception followed by a ceilidh - a traditional party with singing, dancing and Scottish music. Mr and Mrs Ritchie are expected to spend their honeymoon in Sting's Grade 1 listed Tudor mansion in Wiltshire.

Yesterday hundreds of people came to Dornoch Cathedral to get a glimpse of Madonna and child as they arrived for the christening of Rocco. 

Brazil striker Neymar, who overcame a recent groin injury, supplied the cross which Suarez headed home in the 68th for his second, making it five goals in two matches for the Uruguay forward.

Barcelona is the first club to lift the trophy in its modern format three times, following triumphs in 2009 and 2011.

"We came to be No. 1 in the world and we achieved our goal," said Suarez. "I felt very strong with Neymar and Messi and we were able to win quite easily."

It was the second time Messi had found himself at the center of controversy this week. He missed Thursday's 3-o semi-

final win over Guangzhou due to apparent renal colic, amid suspicions he had been simply rested for the final.

"Three days ago he was injured but he had a strong will to play in this match,"Barcelona coach Luis Enrique said after watching his team lift the trophy.

"We had our game plan and that was something we achieved until the Messi goal," said River Plate coach Marcelo Gallardo. "We played against the great players of Barcelona - Messi, Neymar and Suarez — and they are able to do what they want."

Earlier Sunday, Douglas came off the bench to score twice and inspire Japan's Sanfrecce Hiroshima to a comefrom-behind 2-1 win over Chinese rival Guangzhou in the third-place game at the Club World Cup.

The Brazilian striker scored 21 times this season for the Japanese champions but only came on midway through the second half for Hisato Sato, who squandered a hat trick of first-half chances.

Douglas took only three minutes to get on the score sheet, nodding home a simple 70thminute equalizer.

When teammate Takuma Asano headed against the bar in the 83rd, Douglas was quickest to react, rising high to head home the looped rebound.

Guangzhou opened the scoring with the fastest goal of the tournament — a third-minute header by former Tottenham midfielder Paulinho.

FIFA ethics court bans Blatter, Platini for 8 years

CEPP Blatter and Mi-Schel Platini were each banned for eight years by the FIFA ethics committee yesterday in a stunning removal of world soccer's most powerful leaders.

FIFA President Blatter and his one-time protege Platini were kicked out of the sport for conflict of interest and disloyalty to FIFA in a USD2 million payment deal that is also the subject of a criminal investigation in Switzerland.

Blatter's FIFA career is ending in disgrace after more than 17 years as president and 40 years in total with the scandal-hit governing body.

Platini's bid to succeed his former mentor in the Feb. 26 presidential election is now likely over, though both are expected to appeal at the FIFA appeals committee and the Court of Arbitration for Sport.

Blatter has suggested he could pursue a lengthier appeal to Switzerland's highest court, the federal tribunal, which can intervene if legal process was abused. Ethics judges decided

broke FIFA Code of Ethics rules on conflicts of interest, breach of loyalty and offering or receiving gifts.

Both denied wrongdoing in 2011 when Platini took \$2 million of FIFA money approved by Blatter as uncontracted salary for work as a presidential adviser from 1999-2002.

Blatter was fined 50,000

Swiss francs (\$50,250) and Platini, a FIFA vice president and head of European soccer's governing body UEFA, was fined 80,000 Swiss francs (\$80,400).

"Neither in his written statement nor in his personal hearing was Mr. Blatter able to demonstrate another legal basis for this payment," the judges said. "By failing to place FIFA's interests first and abstain from doing anything which could be contrary to FIFA's interests, Mr. Blatter violated his fiduciary duty to

"His (Blatter's) assertion of an oral agreement was determined as not convincing and was rejected by the chamber.'

Platini, the judges said, "failed to act with complete credibility and integrity, showing unawareness of the importance of his duties and concomitant obligations and responsibilities."

Blatter and Platini both have strong motivation to fight the bans in fast-track appeal cases. Blatter, who turns 80 in March, wants a FIFA swansong by hosting the election congress in Zurich and being made honorary president by the 209 member federations.

The 60-year-old Platini wants to clear his name, pass a FIFA integrity check and be declared an official candidate in the election he had been favored to win.

Platini's campaign has stalled since being quizzed on Sept. 25 in a Swiss federal investigation of suspected criminal mismanagement at FIFA.

Switzerland's attorney general has opened proceedings criminal against Blatter for the suspected "disloyal payment" of FIFA money to Platini and selling undervalued World Cup TV rights for the Caribbean.

Platini's status in the criminal case is "between a



witness and an accused person," attorney general Michael Lauber said in October.

In recent media interviews, both men have said Platini asked Blatter for a salary of 1 million Swiss francs. He got a contract for 300,000 Swiss francs annually, in line with FI-FA's then-wage structure, plus a "gentleman's agreement" to get the rest later. Swiss law obliged FIFA only to pay the deferred money within five years.

Platini was paid in February 2011, just before Blatter began campaigning for re-election against Mohamed bin Hammam of Qatar. Platini's UEFA urged its members weeks before the June 2011 poll to back Blatter, who was elected unopposed when Bin Hammam was implicated in bribery.

Few FIFA officials knew of the Platini payment which emerged during a wider Swiss probe of the governing body's business affairs, including suspected money laundering in the 2018 and 2022 World Cup bidding contests. **AP**

TOURISM! WHICH TOURISM?

Last October, the government set up a committee to help advance the transformation of Macau into a "World Centre for Tourism and Leisure" (WCTL).

The information was released in an Executive Order published on October 28 in the territory's Official Gazette (BO).

The "task force" includes ten high-official representatives and is chaired by the Chief Executive himself. It was named the Committee for Development of the World Centre for Tourism and Leisure and, according to the same document, is "responsible for drafting a blueprint plan for tourism development for the next five years."

The Committee's "modus operandi" includes conducting research and advising on policies to help transform the territory into this "wanted"

It additionally stated that the new body would simultaneously set up a mechanism to review the plan annually.

The Executive Order also states that "the chairman of the Committee may invite experts in different fields, and representatives from the public and private sectors, to join the works of the Committee or its meetings whenever deemed necessary." It may also give powers to the CE's office to "provide administrative, technical and logistic support."

Even if these topics do not raise many questions or doubts, there are, in fact, two very big questions in my head: what does "World Centre for Tourism and Leisure" mean? And what is missing from Macau that would make it a

I don't think I am shocking anyone by saying that I consider Macau to be a fully-fledged world city where residents mix with foreigners, with a name established and recognized worldwide, which also plays a significant role both in this area of the globe and in the world. Saying this, I think we have the "World Centre" part sorted

Let's focus on the missing bit: "Tourism and Leisure". So what is the biggest economic sector in Macau? I do not think that there is any doubt on that matter, with the gaming tourist-related activities having been responsible for a total contribution of 87.6 percent of the territory's GDP (MOP422,038 billion) in 2014, according to the annual report from the World Travel & Tourism Council titled Travel & Tourism Economic Impact, Macau 2015. The same report forecasts that this economic sector will grow by another 3.3 percent in 2015, and by 4 percent in 2025 to MOP643,131.0 million, by which time it will represent 89.6 percent of the GDP.

This takes me back to my second question, but with a different approach. If we are apparently already a WCTL, maybe what we want is not to be a WCTL but to be it in a different way. If this is the case, what kind of tourism are we talking about? Or more, what kind of tourism are we aiming for?

Honestly, I do not have any clear idea, or can even forecast, what kind of "blueprint plan drafted for the tourism development for the next five years" that this new Committee can make. And when will they be able to present it?

Based on my experiences in life and what nature shows us through what we call the "second law of thermodynamics", all things tend to entropy, to a kind of balance or even distribution. That law is also based on two premises: "dynamics" and "time".

So what, in my opinion, should be the role of a government? Simple, to be a kind of "catalyst" for this (physical and chemical) reaction.

Instead, the latest developments seem to put the Macau government in the role of "designer" of Macau society, trying to control all variables to play in our (their) favor.

SIBERIAN CITY BACKS CAT FOR MAYOR

Tired of the dog-eat-dog politics in their Russian city, the residents of Barnaul say they want a cat to be their next mayor.

The Siberian city of 650,000 people, which lies 2,900 kilometers east of Moscow, is to get a new mayor next week when a commission comprising the city council and the regional governor choose from among six candidates.

But none of the six appear to spark much affection among Barnaul's residents. An informal online poll asking residents to express their preferences among the six and a Siamese cat named Barsik showed the feline nabbing more than 90 percent of the vote.

Adelson sees Macau 'at or near' bottom of gambling downturn

AS Vegas casino billio-**L** naire Sheldon Adelson said he expects Macau's economy and hard-hit casino industry, in the midst of an 18-month downturn, to start recovering next year.

"I think we are either at the bottom or near the bottom and then will turn around in the near future, certainly within 2016," Adelson, the chairman of Sands China Ltd., said at a press conference in Macau where the casino operator is opening a 400-room St. Regis hotel.

Macau's casino industry has been on a downward spiral since mid-2014 as China's anti-corruption campaign keeps high rollers at bay and a slowing Chinese economy hurts gambling. mass-market Operators are bracing for an expected 32 percent decline in gross gaming revenue this year before the hoped-for rebound in 2016.

Sands China shares have plunged 32 percent so far this year, against the benchmark Hang Seng Index's 7.8 percent drop. "I do agree with him that the worst is probably behind us and we could see some moderate recovery in 2016," said Richard Huang, an analyst at Nomura Holdings Inc. "That said, the pace of recovery is likely to be moderate as the market still faces multiple macro

headwinds like decelerating growth in Chinese economy.'

Sands China, the biggest foreign operator in Macau with four casinos, plans to open its fifth, the USD2.7 billion Parisian Macao, in nine to 10 months, Adelson said. The Cotai Strip project, featuring a halfsize Eiffel Tower replica, is hoping to get government approval for 250 new gambling tables, he said.

"We should have enough tables - we have asked for 450 but nobody is getting what they hope for," said the 82-year-old tycoon. "We are hoping to get treated fairly which I'm quite confident the Macau government will do with us."

Adelson, who has an estimated net worth of USD22 billion according to the

Bloomberg Billionaires Index, added in an interview that he hopes Sands China will stand to benefit from its contributions to Macau when its 20-year gaming concession comes up for renewal after expiring in 2022.

"Right from the very beginning we've done exactly what the government wanted us to do - and people say we helped change the face of Macau," Adelson said. "If that's the case, we should be getting at least what everybody else is getting to be fair, and hopefully we get something extra."

The key is to building a relationship based on trust with the government, said Sands China president Wilfred Wong during the same interview. The casino operator hired the industry outsider on Nov. 1, breaking a tradition of having non-Chinese executives helm its operations as it braces for stricter policies and as gambling-concession renewals loom.

"No relationship is given, no relationship is forever," said Wong, a 15-year veteran of China's top lawmaking body the National People's Congress. "You just need to prove to another party that you're doing what you promised and create the trust among each other, I think that's the only way to cultivate relationships." Bloomberg

Former triad boss assaulted in HK

businessman who is suspected of being Aa former triad boss was attacked and injured by another man in the lobby of the Peninsula Hotel in Tsim Sha Tsui on Sunday. Alleged former triad boss Kwok Wing Hung, who is nicknamed "Shanghai Tsai [Boy]," was having afternoon tea at the Peninsula Hotel when a man punched him in the face, reports the South China Morning Post (SCMP).

According to Apple Daily, the attacker had been able to approach the mysterious businessman despite the presence of Kwok's four bodyguards. Kwok managed to evade the thrust of the attack, but suffered a minor injury to his eyelid.

Kwok Wing Hung is rumored to have been forced to exit the VIP gaming room business in Macau because of mounting gambling debts, and has become a controversial figure in recent years since his alleged connections with lawmakers were scrutinized by Hong Kong media in the run-up to the SAR's 2012 Chief Executive elections.

Kwok was rushed to the Hong Kong Sanatorium & Hospital on Sunday while hotel security staff notified the police of the incident. The police investigators reviewing the video footage were able to identify the victim as the former leader of the Wo Shing Wo triad group.

Emerging from the hospital yesterday morning, Kwok told the media that he was not seriously injured.

The SCMP reports Kwok as having joked: "Someone said [I was] killed. You see - I'm in good shape [...] just bumped into a table corner. You see how handsome [I am]."
