

'ChinAware' porcelain design exhibition opens

THE exhibition "ChinAwa-re" by Portuguese artist Bruno Carvalho was launched last week at Casa Garden, and features ceramics representing traditional Chinese themes.

Funded by the Orient Foundation, the project was inspired by the possibility of a reflective awareness of contemporary China, and the materialization of its social and cultural implications through traditional Chinese porcelain.

Carvalho designed and developed the project in Jingdezhen, the capital of Chinese imperial porcelain, stressing to the Times that he had no use for his translator during his twomonth stay in the city.

"The idea is to try to leave another territory and another culture," he said. "I'm actually surprised by the openness of the Chinese people, the way they work, they way they find solutions was a surprise."

The artist admitted that he encountered difficulties due to the limited time he was given, language barriers and having to work without a studio workspace, however he suggested that in-

teracting with the Chinese community and culture was the most interesting challenge for him.

"I become much more interested," he said. "I never thought I'd come to China so this was an opportunity. It's a huge story and culture [...] this is my way to give feedback from my experience."

The ChinAware exhibition consists of four projects comprising a total of 20 porcelain objects, created in 34 existing forms that were produced and marketed in small factories in Jingdezhen. The exhibition is also complemented by photographs and socio-cultural framing videos, which were the source of the creative process.

Institution of People's Alliance celebrates eighth anniversary

THE Macau Institution of ■ People's Alliance held a ceremony last week to celebrate its eighth anniversary.

Lionel Leong, Secretary for Economy and Finance, and Raimundo do Rosário, Secretary for Transport and Public Works, together with other governmental officials and lawmakers, offered their congratulations to the group for its anniversary.

Si Ka Lon, lawmaker and chairman of the association, pointed out during the ceremony that the "government should do a good job with the Taipa section of the Light Rail Transit (LRT) and should also solve the problems with the Urban Renewal Council (CRU).'

The LRT was originally slated to commence operations this year, but due to the delayed construction, it is likely to be operational by

2019. The newly established CRU has 27 members and 21 of them must be members of the public. However, the more than half of the 21 are from the commercial sector. Local people fear that an over-representation of

commercial interests could transform the CRU into a champion of developers' causes.

Regarding the city's fiveyear plan, Lon urged the government to establish "a strong and powerful system of leadership and cooperation" in order to achieve the goals set out in the plan. "Cross-department cooperation must see major breakthroughs," declared Si.

Chan Tek Seng, president of the association, also delivered a speech at the event. He noted that the group has more than 20,000 members, and that its cumulative number of services exceeds one million. "The association will insist on loving the country, on loving Macau, and on supporting the government's policies," revealed Chan.

Established in 2008, the organization has a large number of members. It also owns two medical centers, and runs more than 60 house-owner committees and seven special committees, which provide services such as medical care and youth support.

Man accused of sexually abusing own children

41-year-old Portuguese man Ahas been arrested following charges of alleged child abuse. The man has been accused of sexually abusing his young children, a nine-year-old boy and a sevenyear-old girl.

The man was detained last week after the mother of the victims reported the alleged abuse to the police. A judge ordered his pre-trial detention.

According to reports, the suspect initiated the abuse as early as 2011, also the year in which he divorced his wife. After spending time alone with the father, the children exhibited signs of distress to their mother. She then referred the victims to a psychologist who raised the possibility of the abuse.

The Education and Youth Affairs Bureau has reacted to the case expressing "shock" and condemnation. The bureau added that it "will provide all necessary assistance to the children and the family."

HE Gaming Inspection and Coordination Bureau (DICJ) has announced a ban on proxy voting at VIP tables through mobile phones. The regulator told GGRAsia that as of today VIP operations will only accept bets from gamblers who are physically present on the premises.

The move is being seen as a new blow to a VIP sector that has been besieged in recent years by Beijing's anti-corruption policy, which has resulted in large numbers of Mainland VIP gamers avoiding travel to the MSAR.

The announcement was foreshadowed by hints of the policy change on Thursday from Wynn Macau Chairman, Steve Wynn, and Chief Executive of MGM China, Grant Bowie.

In separate conference calls on Thursday, the two gaming executives told analysts that the move was likely to be on the way.

During a call with MGM investors, Grant Bowie said, "On proxy betting, I think it seems [that there] is going to be a government announcement in the next few days to clarify the situation."

"Whatever happens in the notion of proxy, it will probably be yet another continuation of pressure for the junkets themselves, but it probably is not going to be that significant for any of the [casino] operators, certainly, not that significant for us," the gaming executive added.

Wynn representatives agreed that the exposure of the new arrangement would have an "insignificant" effect on the company.

The ban comes at a time when casino operators in Macau are increasingly moving away from their dependence on the VIP gaming segment, and looking toward mass gaming and nongaming divisions to make up the shortfall.

VIP gaming accounted for as little as 54.1 percent of overall

profits during the first quarter of 2016, down by 19.3 percent year-on-year in terms of gaming revenue. This, however, marked significant improvement over the 42 percent fall between the first quarter of 2014 and the first quarter of 2015.

Sterne Agee analyst David Bain echoed the sentiments of the two gaming executives, agreeing that the effect of the new policy would be minimal, since phone betting only accounts for between five and ten percent of VIP revenue. The impact on casinos "should be fairly minor given thin VIP margins," he said.

According to gaming lawyers in Macau, proxy betting can create complications with the "know your customer" protocol, which is encouraged under international best practices for tackling the threat of money laundering.

Separately, the Secretary for Economy and Finance, Lionel Leong, has reported that the mid-term review of the city's gaming industry is close to completion and is likely to be disclosed to the public this week, according to a statement from the Government Information Bureau.

The review will outline the achievements of the city's six gaming concessionaires, their involvement in the communi-

ty and the extent of their nongaming offerings. It will also examine the welfare of employees and what opportunities have been offered to them regarding vertical or horizontal mobility.

In comments to the media, the secretary stressed that the government would continue to allow growth in the num-

ber of new-to-market gaming tables of no more than three percent annually, up until the beginning of 2023. This will be the guiding principle for the government's assessments of new applications for gaming tables, he explained.

'BETS AT THE TABLE'

A REPRESENTATIVE of Sands China's public relations team told the Times: "Sands China Ltd. has noticed recent news about the possibility of new policies against proxy betting. Sands China prohibits the use of electronic devices at gaming tables and only accepts bets from patrons at the table."

Wynn reports Q1 revenue decline

WYNN Resorts Ltd last week released their financial results for the first quarter of 2016, ending March 31, showing a significant year-on-year decline in Macau operations, which was slightly offset by an increase in revenue from Las Vegas operations.

According to a statement from the company, net revenues for the first quarter of 2016 were USD997.7 million, down

from USD1.09 billion in the first quarter of 2015. The decline was led by a 13.8 percent (pct) decrease from the Macau side of the business, partially offset by a 0.7 pct increase from Las Vegas operations.

Adjusted Property EBI-TDA was USD300.3 million for the first quarter of 2016, a 7 pct decrease from USD323 million in the first quarter of 2015. The net revenue for Macau operations was down to USD608.2 million in the first quarter, a decrease from USD705.4 million a year earlier. Adjusted Property EBIDTA in the first quarter amounted to USD191.2 million, down 9.9 pct from USD212.3 million in the same period in 2015.

Table games turnover in the VIP segment for Macau totaled USD13.47 billion for the

first quarter of 2016, a 21.4 pct decrease from USD17.13 billion a year earlier.

Meanwhile, the average number of VIP tables decreased to 189 units in the first quarter of 2016, from 252 units in the first quarter of 2015.

In terms of the massmarket segment, income from gaming tables measured USD1.21 billion in the first quarter, down 5.6pct from the equiva-



lent period in 2014. Table games winnings in the mass market decreased 11.5 pct to USD247.5 million. As a percentage the mass market tables games winnings were at 20.5pct, below the 21.8 pct experienced in the first quarter of 2015. **DB**



Exclusive bus lane trial went smoothly



The exclusive bus lane, running from Barra to Doca Lam Mau. commenced operations on a trial basis on Saturday.

Authorities felt that test ran smoothly in spite of the approximately 250 unauthorized vehicles that drove on bus lane by mistake, according to a report by Macao Daily News. The police did not issue tickets to the drivers, only warnings. The Transport Bureau reminded the public that cameras have been placed along the bus lane, and that unauthorized driving through it can result in a fine of MOP600.

Secondary checkpoint system planned

Security forces in Macau have announced that they want to install an independent computer system to reduce the reliance on a single system for immigration clearance. They say that an additional system would lessen the impact of a system malfunction. Last month, the passenger clearance system at Macau's immigration border checkpoints crashed and was not operational for around two hours, leading to significant delays for travellers. According to a statement from the Government Information Bureau last week, a backup system has been designed for immigration services and was tested at the beginning of the year. It was not in operation at the time of the crash, though the statement did not clarify why this was the case.

Association says same-sex couples excluded from domestic violence bill

RAINBOW of Macau, Macau's first pro-LGBT and sexual minority advocacy group, criticized the local government for allegedly failing to include same-sex relationships in the scope of domestic violence legislation due to the "controversy" of same sex partners being considered as "family mem-

Speaking as Rainbow of Macau's spokesperson in a press conference yesterday, Jason Chao expressed his worry that as the government is planning to "openly justify" discrimination, it may send a "harmful" message to the local community that discrimination on the grounds of sexual orientation is acceptable.

The concerned group claimed that the United Nations Committee Against Torture issued its concluding observations in December 2015, which stated that the SAR government should protect victims of domestic violence without discrimination.

"It is the Macau government's obligation under in-

ternational law to accord equal protection to persons in same-sex relationships against domestic violence,' the association noted.

Meanwhile, local authorities have claimed that the Social Welfare Institute would also provide domestic violence-related services to people involved in same-sex relationships regardless of their specific inclusion in the law.

"We highly question this kind of response. [...] If the domestic violence bill excludes same-sex couples, we don't think that such victims

who are in same-sex romantic relationships can be effectively protected," stressed Chao.

The group also implied that it should be much easier for the bill to include persons in same-sex relationships, as the latest version of the bill specifies that the relationship between predator and victim be defined as "relatives and its equivalents."

Hence, the scope is no longer narrowly defined as "family members" as in the previous version of bill.

"An intimate relationship does not depend on marriage registration nor does it necessarily develop into marriage," argued spokesperson for the group. "The deprivation of samesex partners of the same protection is hardly justifiable."

Chao said that the group would continue to engage with the international treaty bodies and as well as to apply pressure on the government, especially before the final reading of the bill on May 20.

"Rainbow of Macau regrets that the Macau government is knowingly enacting a discriminatory law that is against the superiority of international law," Chao said.

Chao told the Times that the SAR government is probably "too conservative" and may fear that the inclusion of same-sex couples in the bill would imply an intention by the SAR to legalize same sex marriage. Staff reporter

AL rejects extradition treaty in surprise move



According to Ho lat Seng, the proposal "has technical problems"

THE Legislative Assembly ▲ (AL) has rejected a government proposal for the extradition of wanted fugitives between Macau, Hong Kong and mainland China, after the Secretary for Administration and Justice hinted earlier this year that the multilateral deal was near completion.

The unprecedented decision was explained by the AL as being the reaction by the body to technical problems in the draft legislation.

AL president Ho Iat Seng told Radio Macau that the proposal "has technical problems" and has therefore been sent back to the government for review. He added that the two branches of government "are engaging in dialogue" to try to overcome the

issues, but would not disclose the areas in which the technical problems were identified.

Earlier this year the Secretary for Administration and Justice, Sonia Chan, said that she expected the draft law to be passed soon, though she noted that there was no fixed timeline for the legislation and that difficulties persisted due to differences between the three territories' legal systems.

The extradition treaty has sparked controversy due to the legislation's proposed retroactive effect, which would allow individuals who were already convicted before the passing of the law to be surrendered as long as the rulings against them remain valid.

In addition, the proposal backed by the Chief Executive, Chui Sai On, in December allows for the extradition of people wanted by China for crimes against national security, even though there is no equivalent crime in Macau.

Groups critical of the government have raised their concerns that this may violate international extradition principles and that it could potentially invalidate Basic Law guarantees. **DB**



Consultation on AL **Election Law kicks off**

THE government on Saturday launched a 30-day public consultation on revisions to the Legislative Assembly (AL) Election Law. The consultation period will last until the end of June 5.

The Secretary for Administration and Justice, Sónia Chan, said on Friday during a press conference that the revisions are aiming to ensure "the maintenance of a just, fair and open environment for elections to that body."

The revision proposes, among other aspects, the introduction of a scheme to monitor campaign expenses and the introduction of a ban on elected members of the Legislative Assembly holding any political position in a foreign country. The latter proposal is being seen as a way to prevent cases such as that of Pereira Coutinho, who was a candidate in latest legislative elections in Portugal while also being a lawmaker in Macau.

The revision also covers enhanced management of electoral affairs, including the appointment of the members of the relevant Electoral Affairs Commission,

well in advance of each election; the appointment of a body to handle minor cases of rule infringement; and the imposition of regulations regarding campaign advertising in newspapers and on websites.

According to Sonia Chan, the suggested revisions "were based on the government's observation of the fifth Legislative Assembly Election; the findings of a report on the election; and suggestions from the Commission Against Corruption and the Public Prosecutions Office."

HE New Macau Association (ANM) is calling for the resignation of Chui Sai On amid claims of the Chief Executive's "poor integrity and alleged involvement in corruption," after news broke of the Jinan University donation controversy.

Last week the Macau Foundation announced that it was donating RMB100 million to Jinan University to coincide with the institution's 110th anniversary.

Controversy ensued following the implication that Chui's double role as the president of the Council of Trustees of the Macau Foundation and his time serving as Vice Chairman of Jinan University Council would, as ANM put it, make him "undoubtedly involved in [a] conflict of interest."

ANM is now calling for the resignation of Chui over the RMB100 million donation and ensuing claim that the agreement could be considered a case of corruption.

They are also demanding that the donation be withdrawn and that the enactment of a law to regulate the use of public funds be made to prevent future instances of alleged corruption.

"It is widely speculated that Chui agreed to the funneling of Macau public money to Jinan

Donation to Jinan University stirs controversy

University in the name of 'donation'," reads an ANM statement. "We find these tricks that abuse the public resources of Macau intolerable."

A petition has been submitted to the government calling for their response to the three demands within 48 hours. According to New Macau, as of last night the petition had gathered over 2,000 signatures.

The association has given the

government until the end of today to respond.

In the absence of a response from the government, ANM is ominously threatening to "consider taking further actions to safeguard the proper use of public money and to demand Chui step down."

The Government Spokesperson Office issued a statement over the weekend justifying the donation. They explained that the MSAR maintains strong links with the mainland and wants to give back to the "motherland" through contributions to its educational development. The office says that such donations are an obligation of Macau.

The statement assured the public that financing these new facilities at Jinan University would in no way affect the finances available to local tertiary institutions.

However, ANM President Scott Chiang said in a TDM telephone interview that the "donation lacked transparency in [light] of all the cut-backs [to the] local budget and other support to local

universities."

The Spokesperson Office also claimed that the financing may indirectly benefit Macau since "there are many locals that were educated at Jinan University." As many as 30 percent of overseas students receiving scholarships from Jinan University are locals from Macau, it added.

According to the Macau Foundation, approximately 300 Macau students are admitted to Jinan University each year.

"Supporting the development of Jinan University is in fact a long-term investment in the training of talented local people, so it will eventually benefit Macau," another statement from the Macau Foundation reads, echoing the words of the Government Spokesperson Office.

The Macau Foundation further stressed that Jinan University had not been the only institution to benefit from public funding from Macau. Others, such as Peking University, Qinghua University, and Renmin University, have also received funding in recent years.

This most recent donation, however, represents the single largest donation to the university since 1978 when the school reopened, according to a report by Macao Daily News.

A proportion of the funds will be dedicated to the construction of two dormitories for students from Macau and Hong Kong.

The Government Spokesperson Office concluded its statement with an appeal for the "rational treatment of the issue in order for us to show commitment to the development of education in mainland [China] and in Macau."

ONG Kong's embattled retailers are finally getting a break. After mainland tourist arrivals plunged last year as policy makers devalued the yuan, foreign-exchange moves may now encourage shoppers back to the city by making alternatives such as Japan and Malaysia more expensive. China's central bank has this year kept the yuan closely linked to the U.S. currency, and therefore the greenback-pegged Hong Kong dollar, while allowing it to drop 11.1 percent against the yen and 6.7 percent versus the ringgit.

"It will help perhaps put a floor in terms of retail sales," said Sandy Mehta, chief executive officer of Hong Kong-based advisory firm Value Investment Principals Ltd. The U.S. dollar's slump this year will bring some respite to retailers, "but further weakness will be needed to have more of an impact and turn the tide."

The glimmer of hope comes amid a particularly gloomy period for the city's shops as a slowdown in the Chinese economy, President Xi Jinping's crackdown on corruption and increasing competition from Macau take a toll on tourist spending. Hong Kong retail sales tumbled 12.5 percent in the first quarter as visitor arrivals fell, the government said on Thursday, extending 2015's slump that's prompted a wave of luxury store closures.

There are some signs of improvement for retailers. Visitors from China for the first day of what is locally known as the "Golden Week" May Day holiday jumped 14 percent from a year earlier to more than 200,000 people, the South China Morning Post reported, citing Immigration Department

day said its same store sales in Hong Kong and Macau grew 1 percent on year during the holiday. The company's shares jumped 4.6 percent after the report, paring their slide this year to 5.3 percent.

Hong Kong's benchmark Hang Seng Index fell 1.7 percent on Friday, while Sa Sa dropped 0.8 percent.

China's currency has been moving in virtual lockstep with the weakening dollar versus major peers this year, providing policy makers with a veneer of stability and exporters with a boost to earnings. The yuan has fallen 0.1 percent against the greenback in 2016, and strengthened 0.1 percent versus Hong Kong's dollar. In comparison, an index that measures the Chinese currency's performance against the exchange rates of 13 trading partners has dropped 4.5 percent to the lowest since 2014.

"It does help to provide a little bit of relief from an exchange perspective," said Tai Hui, Hong Kong-based chief Asia market strategist at JPMorgan Asset Management. "However, the performance issue with Hong Kong's tourism industry is not only the currency issue. But it's also the fact that Chinese tourists, which are often the bulk of Hong Kong tourists, have more choices."

Chinese visitors flocked to Japan in recent years as the declining yen made it cheaper to buy everything from rice cookers to toilet seats. Tourists from China made up 5 million of the record 19.7 million people who went to the country in 2015, according to the Japan National Tourism Organization.

Relaxed visa rules, frequent flights and short journey times favor Japan, South Korea and Thailand for Chinese travelers, who make up about 10 percent of global tourism, according to Bloomberg Intelligence. Australia and Russia have also gained in popularity. The Hong Kong Tourism Board estimates that the number of tourists from the mainland will drop 3.2 percent for the year and their average spending will shrink 4 percent.

Group of donors suspend aid to Mozambique

THE group of 14 countries and organizations providing direct support to the Mozambique Budget has decided to suspend aid to the country following the disclosure of debts omitted from the public accounts, said Wednesday in Maputo the President of the Republic of Portugal.

Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa said that the suspension was decided "for the purpose of clarification," and was not definitive, adding that talks on the subject had already begun.

The Portuguese President was speaking at a joint press conference with Mozambican President Filipe Nyusi after a meeting between the two heads of state at the presidential palace of Mozambique in Maputo.

Rebelo de Sousa reiterated that the decision by donor countries and agencies was related to clarifying the real extent of public debt and also "the need to stabilise the operation of the institutions and the country in economic and financial terms."

The President of Mozambique, Filipe Nyusi, said he believed the decision to suspend direct aid to the state budget was a temporary measure to make room for clarification of Mozambican public debt.

Cited by daily newspaper Notícias, Nyusi said he understood the programme support partners' fears, "as they do not feel comfortable to continue to send money as the issue of debt is not properly understood."

"I believe that there is no donor that wants to sacrifice the Mozambicans, as the measures that are being taken are aimed at creating a state of sustainability," said Nyusi, adding that the most important is whether the debt is sustainable. MDT/Macauhub

CHINA DONATES USD 16M

CHINA HAS donated USD16 million to Mozambique under an economic and technical cooperation agreement signed Wednesday in Maputo by representatives of the two countries, Mozambican daily newspaper Notícias reported. The deputy

minister of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation, Nyeleti Mondlane, said the signed document "is the Chinese government's contribution to the Mozambican government's efforts to further the objective of economic and social development."

Disney lifts veil in sneak preview of USD5.5b Shanghai park

WALT Disney Co. employees and guests received a sneak preview of Shanghai Disneyland over the weekend, as the world's largest entertainment company gets set for next month's official opening of its first theme park in mainland China.

A trial run for the USD5.5 billion Shanghai Disney kicked off on Saturday. Guests are limited to the resort's employees, partners and stakeholders, who can try out some attractions, entertainment and dining on selected dates over a six-week period.

Lines had formed by 10 a.m. outside shops and restaurants in the non-ticketed area, where the World Disney store opened to the public. Wang Xingmiao, a retiree who has never traveled outside of China, is among thousands who came to the site even though he wasn't on the guest list.

"It opens the eyes of old people and young people to see something like this," the 78-year-old said outside the World Disney store. "It shows the importance of China that something like this comes to us and we don't have to go out to see it."

Such trials are a key preopening step for all Walt Disney Parks and Resorts destinations and major attractions around the world. The Chinese resort, located in Shanghai's Pudong district, officially opens June 16.

The highly anticipated Chinese park, Disney's sixth worldwide, comes as the company shocked investors on April 4 when it announced Chief Executive Officer Robert Iger's top lieutenant Thomas Staggs was departing the company in September, leaving the CEO without an obvious successor. A 26-year-company veteran, Staggs had supervised major expansions such as the Shanghai resort and spearheaded acquisitions for the Burbank, Californiabased company.

Iger met with Chinese President Xi Jinping on Thursday in Beijing, in which Xi cited Disney as an example of expanded cooperation between

"What the Walt Disney Company has been able to achieve in China, I think, is a perfect example of cooperation, but it also came after years of understanding, years of building up a deep respect for one another and appreciation for each other's interests," Iger said in remarks to Xi at the meeting.

The CEO has called Shanghai Disneyland the company's greatest opportunity since Walt Disney bought land in Florida in the 1960s. He's counting on 330 million Chinese living within a three-hour train or car trip of Shanghai to fill the resort, which boasts two hotels and the largest castle it has built.

Tickets for the Shanghai park, three times the size of Hong Kong Disneyland, are priced at 499 yuan (\$77) for peak periods such as weekends and summer holidays, and 370 yuan at other times.

Disney is planning a three-day event to mark the opening of its newest park next month, which will include a red carpet premiere of its Lion King Broadway show, the first time the production will be performed in Mandarin. The company has been on a recruiting drive to staff up the park, which Iger said last year would employ about 10,000 workers.

LA's Getty Center recreates Cave Temples of Dunhuang

FOR a thousand years China's Cave Temples of Dunhuang were a popular traveler's rest stop, marketplace and religious shrine on the fabled Silk Road. Now they are coming to Los Angeles, both in spirit and reality.

In an exhibition curators say is unprecedented, three full-scale, hand-painted replica caves have been erected on The Getty Center museum's hilltop campus overlooking LA.

Nearby, in an adjacent gallery, the museum has assembled more than 40 spectacularly preserved and priceless artifacts taken from one of the caves, and in still another gallery visitors can take a 3-D virtual reality tour of on an actual cave in China, this one filled with life-size sculptures of the Buddha and his entourage.

"We're trying to help the public understand what this place is, where it is and why it's important," Tim Whalen, director of the Getty Conservation Institute, said during a recent tour of "Cave Temples of Dunhuang: Buddhist Art on the Silk Road," which opened Saturday.

"By any standard," he added, "Dunhuang is one of the most important heritage places in the world."

Indeed, along with the Great Wall and the Forbidden City, Dunhuang's more than 450 Mogao Caves, as they are also known, were among the first Chinese sites recognized by the United Nations' World Heritage Center in the 1980s.

But tucked away on the edge of the Gobi Desert, more than



1,100 miles from Beijing, they are not the easiest place in China to get to today.

That wasn't the case from the 4th to the 14th centuries, when the Silk Road was teeming with travelers during the millennium when the caves served as a key rest stop, marketplace and shrine.

"I think we all have romanticized notions about the Silk Road and people moving from the east in China all the way to the Mediterranean," Whalen said as he and Marcia Reed, the Getty Research Institute's chief curator, reviewed dozens of paintings, drawings, sculptures, silk tapestries, and handwritten and printed documents in one of the galleries.

"But people were moving back and forth," he continued. "There are documents here of Jewish prayers and Christian prayers."

Also displayed are sculptures of European-looking people, a travel document carried by a monk from India and numerous artistic depictions of the Buddha.

Perhaps the most priceless item on display is a scroll of Buddhism's "Diamond Sutra," commissioned and dated in 868 by a man named Wang Jie as a gift to his parents. Discovered in one of the caves in 1907, it is believed to be the world's oldest printed book. **AP**

Landslide buries 33 builders; eight rescued

RESCUERS yesterday searched for 33 construction workers missing in a landslide at the site of a hydropower project following days of heavy rain in southern China. Eight other workers were pulled out alive, officials and state-run media reported.

Rocks and mud with a volume of 100,000 cubic meters buried an office building and the workers' living area at the site in mountainous Taining county in Fujian province around 5 a.m. Sunday, according to a website run by the county's Communist Party's publicity department.

State broadcaster China Central Television later repor-

ted that seven workers were rescued alive, with injuries including broken bones. By evening, rescuers had detected suspected signs of life at three spots, CCTV said. Mudslides and flooding had made some sections of roads impassable, hindering rescuers' efforts to get heavy machinery to the site.

An official at the county department said by phone that the cause of the landslide was still unclear, but that the area had seen rainfall in the past few days.

Heavy rain has affected much of southern China since Wednesday, triggering floods and landslides. **AP**

Gucci quits US anti-counterfeiting group after Alibaba joins

UCCI America has quit the International Anti-Counterfeiting Coalition, the second defection since the Washington, D.C.-based group allowed Chinese e-commerce giant Alibaba to become a member in April.

Michael Kors walked out of the IACC last month, calling Alibaba "our most dangerous and damaging adversary.'

The outrage over Alibaba's membership raises fresh questions about how effective Alibaba has been in fighting fakes as it pushes to take its e-commerce juggernaut global. It has also allowed the deep loathing some harbor for one of China's global champions to burst into view.

Gucci, along with other Kering Group brands like Balenciaga, is suing Alibaba in a New York federal court. They accuse Alibaba of knowingly encouraging and profiting from the sale of counterfeit goods on its e-commerce platforms. Alibaba has dismissed the suit as

By Saturday, Gucci's name had been struck from the IACC's website. "They were not happy about Alibaba joining," said IACC vice-president Can-

Trade shrinks in April in troubling sign for economy

THINA'S trade √shrank in April in a sign government stimulus is failing to jolt the world's second-largest economy out of a prolonged slowdown.

Exports contracted by 1.8 percent from a year earlier to USD172.7 billion, falling back into negative territory after March's temporary burst of 11.5 percent growth, customs data showed yesterday. Imports plunged 10.9 percent to \$127.2 billion after the previous month's 13.8 percent contraction.

Weak demand from consumers in China and worldwide is hampering government efforts to reverse an economic slowdown that dragged growth to a seven-year low of 6.7 percent in the first quarter of the year.

Beijing has eased controls on credit growth and real estate purchases in hopes of stimulating activity

but analysts said the impact was likely to be temporary. They said March's unexpectedly strong trade growth also was a fluke due to comparison with weak numbers last year and the resumption of business after the Lunar New Year holiday in February.

Surveys of manufacturers showed factory activity weakened in April and the number of people employed declined.

The ruling Communist Party is in the midst of a marathon effort to nurture more self-sustaining growth based on domestic consumption instead of trade and investment. But its plans call for trade to keep growing in order to avoid job losses in export-related industries that employ tens of millions of workers.

Economic growth has declined steadily over the past five years. Much of that was intentional but the unexpectedly severe weakness over the past two years has forced Beijing to resort to multiple rounds of mini-stimulus through stepped up bank lending and spending on construction of public works, temporarily setting back its efforts to generate consumerdriven growth.

So far this year, exports have contracted by 7.6 percent compared with a year earlier and imports are down 12.8 percent, according to the General Administration of Customs. That is down sharply from previous years when trade grew by double digits.

Weakness in Chinese imports has hurt its Asian neighbors, for nearly all of whom China is the biggest trading partner and a major buyer of raw materials and industrial components. The impact has been felt around the globe in commodity exporters such as Australia and Brazil.

The country's politically sensitive global trade surplus was \$45.5 billion in April.

The surplus with the United States was \$18.1 billion and that with the 27-nation European Union was \$10.2 billion. AP

Turbulence injures 17 on Indonesia-Hong Kong flight

SEVENTEEN passengers and crew were injured when a Hong Kong Airlines' flight ran into severe turbulence early Saturday on the way from Indonesia's resort Bali island to Hong Kong.

The Airbus A330-200 with 204 passengers and 12 crew returned to Bali about 2 ½ hours into the flight and landed safely at 4:34 a.m. (2034 GMT Friday), said Trikora Harjo, general manager of Bali's Ngurah Rai airport.

The plane encountered the turbulence above Kalimantan, Indonesia's part of Borneo, he said.

Most of the injuries were head bruises and there were no serious cases, Harjo said. Three crewmembers and eight passengers were brought to a hospital while six others were treated at the airport clinic, he

He said there was no damage to the plane, but an inspection was underway. Ninety-five passengers






der Kim Jong Un said his country will not use its nuclear weapons unless its sovereignty is invaded and announced a five-year economic plan at a milestone congress of North Korea's ruling party, which entered its third day yesterday.

Kim said he is ready to improve ties with "hostile" nations, and called for more talks with rival South Korea to reduce misunderstanding and distrust. He also urged the United States to stay away from inter-Korean issues.

"Our republic is a responsible nuclear state that, as we made clear before, will not use nuclear weapons first unless aggressive hostile forces use nuclear weapons to invade on our sovereignty," Kim said in a roughly three-hour speech shown yesterday on the North's Korean Central Television. Kim is believed to have delivered the speech at Pyongyang's April 25 House of Culture the day before, but its content wasn't made public until early Sunday.

At the congress, Kim also announced a five-year plan starting this year to develop the North's moribund economy, and identified improving the country's power supply and increasing its agricultural and light-manufacturing production as critical parts of the program. He also said the country must secure more electricity through nuclear power.

It was first time North Korea has announced a five-year plan since the 1980s and detailing it in such a public way demonstrated that Kim is taking ownership of the country's economic problems, something his father, Kim Jong Il, avoided as leader.

Kim stressed that the country needs to increase its international trade and engagement in the global economy, but didn't announce any significant reforms or plans to adopt capitaliststyle marketization.

th Korea, in large part because of its economic crisis and famine in the 1990s, which made it impossible for the government to provide its citizens with the necessities they had come to rely on and forced many to learn how to fend for themselves. But while the realities on the ground have shifted, officials have been reluctant to formally embrace significant reforms as state policy.

Kim said that North Korea "will sincerely fulfill its duties for the nonproliferation of nuclear weapons and work to realize the denuclearization of the world."

The North is ready to improve and normalize ties with countries hostile to it if they respect its sovereignty and approach it in a friendly manner, he said.

Despite the talks about more diplomatic activity, Kim also

made it clear that the North has no plans to discard its "byongjin" policy of simultaneously developing its nuclear weapons and its domestic economy.

In a speech published by the North's Rodong Simmun newspaper, Kim described the twin policy as a strategy the party must permanently hold on to for the "maximized interest of our revolution."

Many outside analysts consider the policy unlikely to succeed because of the heavy price North Korea pays for its nuclear program in terms of international sanctions that keep its economy from growing.

North Korea carried out its fourth nuclear test in January and followed with a satellite launch in February that was seen by outside governments as a banned test for long-range missile technology and brought tougher U.N. sanctions.

The North responded to the punitive measures, and also the annual U.S.-South Korean military drills in March and April, by firing a series of missiles and artillery into the sea. It also claimed advancements in developing nuclear weapons and long-range missiles, and combined them with threats of pre-emptive nuclear strikes on Washington and Seoul.

South Korea has taken a hardline approach to North Korea following its nuclear test and long-range rocket launch, shutting down a jointly run factory park in a North Korean border town that had been the last remaining symbol of cooperation between the rivals and slapping Pyongyang with its own economic sanctions.

Seoul has also been in talks with Washington on deploying

a sophisticated U.S. missile defense system in South Korea.

Kim said "fundamentally improving" inter-Korean relations was an urgent matter for his government and also called for the South to "hold hands" with the North as a "companion" for unification, KCNA said.

He urged the need for more talks with the South, and in particular called for a meeting between military officials of both sides to reduce border tensions.

But he stressed that the South must first employ practical measures to improve ties and throw out laws and institutional systems that have hampered them. He also said that the United States should no longer be involved with matters on the Korean Peninsula, and that if enemy forces "ignite the fire of war," the North was ready to mercilessly punish the aggressors and accomplish the "historical feat" of unification.

Kim called for Seoul and Washington to stop their military drills and also said the United States must withdraw its 28,500 troops stationed in South Korea as a buffer against possible aggression from the North.

South Korea's Foreign Ministry had said ahead of the congress that the priority of any future talks with the North would be its denuclearization. **AP**

PHILIPPINES

Candidates make final push for votes as campaigns end

PHILIPPINE presidential candidates made a final push for votes in rallies on Saturday that drew thousands of supporters two days before the tightly contested election.

All five contenders held their final rallies in the capital, Manila. By 7 p.m. local time, police said about 300,000 supporters of front-runner Rodrigo Duterte, the firebrand mayor of Davao city, had gathered at Luneta Park, where Pope Francis delivered his Mass last year.

A recent opinion poll from Social Weather Stations puts Duterte, 71, in the lead with 33 percent of the votes in Philippines' first-past-the-post system. He is ahead of Senator Grace Poe with 22 percent and Mar Roxas, a former interior secretary endorsed by outgoing President Benigno Aquino, with 20 percent.

Duterte's tough talk,

including calling for the extra-judicial killing of criminals, has been criticized by human rights groups, but his populist rhetoric to combat crime and deal with infrastructure backlogs has won him support among Filipinos.

Aquino made a last-ditch



effort this week to get rival candidates, Roxas and Poe, to agree on a united front to prevent Duterte from winning. Roxas said on Saturday he'll continue with his campaign after failing to convince Poe to combine forces against Duterte. **Bloomberg**



THE images are ones of devastation — scorched homes, virtually whole neighborhoods burned to the ground. And Canadian officials say they expect to fight the massive wildfire that has destroyed large parts of Alberta's oil sands town for months.

There's fear the growing wildfire could double in size and reach a major oil sands mine and even the neighboring province of Saskatchewan.

The Alberta government said the massive blaze in the province will cover more than 200,000 hectares (494,211 acres) by Sunday and continue to grow because of high temperatures, dry conditions and high winds. Chad Morrison of Alberta Wildfire said it's not uncommon to fight such an inferno in forested areas for months.

"In no way is this fire under control," Alberta Premier Rachel Notley said.

Officials had hoped to complete the mass evacuation of work camps north of Fort McMurray on Saturday. Thousands of displaced residents got a drive-by view of some of the burned-out neighborhoods as convoys continued. No deaths or injuries have been reported since the fire started last Sunday.

Notley said about 12,000 evacuees have been airlifted from oil sands mine air fields over the past two days, and about 7,000 have left in highway convoys escorted by police. She said the goal was to complete the evacuation from northern work camps by Sunday.

The fire could reach the edges of the Suncor oil sands facility, about 15 miles (25 kilometers)

north of Fort McMurray. Nonessential staff have been evacuating and efforts to protect the site were underway.

Notley, however, said that the facility was highly resilient to forest fires. Oil sands mines are cleared and have no vegetation.

Morrison said the fire wasn't expected to reach the oil sands mines north of Suncor.

The fire and mass evacuation has forced a quarter or more of Canada's oil output offline and was expected to impact an economy already hurt by the fall in the price of oil. The Alberta oil sands have the third-largest reserves of oil in the world behind Saudi Arabia and Venezuela. Its workers largely live in Fort McMurray where

some neighborhoods have been destroyed.

Police said many parts of smoke-filled Fort McMurray are burnt and visibility is low. Officers wore masks as they checked homes to make sure everyone was out.

More than 80,000 people have left Fort McMurray in the heart of Canada' oil sands, where the fire has torched 1,600 homes and other buildings. Gas has been turned off, the power grid is damaged and water is not drinkable. Officials said there is no timeline to return residents to the city, but the Alberta government has begun preliminary planning, though it stresses fighting the fire is still the first priority. AP

Militants kill eight Egyptian police in Cairo suburb

MILITANTS opened fire on a microbus filled with plainclothes police in a Cairo suburb early yesterday, killing eight of them, including an officer, in an attack claimed by a local Islamic State affiliate.

The attack was the deadliest in the heavily policed capital since November, when gunmen attacked a security checkpoint, killing four policemen. That attack was also claimed by the local IS affiliate.

Egypt's state-run MENA news agency said the policemen were inspecting security in the south Cairo suburb of Helwan early yesterday when four gunmen in a pickup opened fire on them.

Interior Minister Magdy Abdel-Ghaffar, in charge of police, ordered an investigation into the attack.

"These are the heroes whose blood mixes with the nation's soil every day," Abdel-Ghaffar told state television at the end of a brief military funeral for the eight policemen.

"We are determined to continue our march against terror and anyone who seeks to undermine the nation's stability," he said, as black-clad female relatives of the policemen wailed in grief. The coffins of the eight, wrapped in the Egyptian flag, were placed atop red fire engines that led a procession of several hundred mourners, including other policemen.

An IS affiliate claimed responsibility for the attack in an online statement, saying it killed everyone in the vehicle. It identified the officer and said the fighters seized light weapons from the police before they fleeing the scene unharmed.

It said the operation was to avenge women jailed in Egypt. The claim could not be independently verified, but the statement's language and the nature of the attack suggest it is authentic

Militants have been targeting security forces in

While most of the unrest has been confined to the northern Sinai, there have been attacks in the mainland as well, mainly smallscale bombings targeting police, the frequency of which had declined in recent months.

An IS affiliate claimed responsibility for the attack in an online statement

the Sinai Peninsula for years, but their attacks have grown more deadly and frequent since the 2013 military overthrow of Islamist President Mohammed Morsi. An IS affiliate based in the Sinai is now spearheading the insurgency.

the Egyptian Journalists Syndicate following the arrest last week of two reporters who had taken refuge inside the syndicate's building in downtown Cairo. The syndicate's board says the ministry did not give it advance warning and has demanded that AbdelGhaffar be fired.

Several newspapers have protested by not mentioning the minister by name and by only publishing altered photos of him designed to look like negatives. It was not yet clear how they would cover his response to yesterday's attack.

Rights groups have accused Egypt's police of widespread abuses, including the torture of dissidents, with some likening their tactics to those used during the rule of President Hosni Mubarak, who was overthrown in a 2011 uprising.

The Interior Ministry has denied any systematic abuses, and is likely to point to attacks like the one carried out on yesterday to argue that it is defending the country against Islamic militants who have sown chaos across the region. AP

London's new mayor Sadig

London's newly elected Muslim mayor, Sadiq Khan, has joined an annual memorial to the millions of Jews slain in the Holocaust as his first official act in office.

Khan made Sundav's appearance at a north London ceremony following a racially charged election campaign during Conservative Party which opponents sought to portray him as an apologist for Islamic extremism and to highlight cases of alleged anti-Semitism

within the ranks of Khan's Labor Party.

The event inside a rugby stadium brought together thousands from London's Jewish community, including more than 150 Holocaust survivors and a combined choir from five Jewish elementary schools.

London's previous Labor mayor, Ken Livingstone, was suspended last month from the party after he claimed that Adolf Hitler supported the Zionist aim of establishing Israel.



1979 EL SALVADOR CATHEDRAL **BLOODBATH**

At least 18 demonstrators have been killed and many wounded after police opened fire on anti-government protesters outside the Metropolitan Cathedral in San Salvador, capital of El Salvador.

The protest in the Central American country was organized by the left-wing group known as the Popular Revolutionary Bloc.

Witnesses said the steps of the cathedral were littered with bodies. Freelance photographer Ken Hawkins told the Los Angeles Times there had been no warning from government forces before the shooting started.

"There was a continual burst of very heavy fire for about two and a half to three minutes," he said. "People started screaming and running to the church but many were hit before they could get there."

The left-wing group is currently holding a number of hostages at French and Costa Rican embassies in the city. The Costa Rican ambassador, Julio Esquivel, was released yesterday but France's ambassador, Michel Dondenne, and seven others are still held hostage. It is demanding the release of five of its leaders but

the military government, under Gen Humberto Romero, claims it is holding only two.

Violent clashes between police and protesters are an all-too-familiar sight in El Salvador.

Trouble peaked some 50 years ago when a peasant revolt, in protest of the abject poverty many were forced to live in, led to the killing of 30,000 people and came to be known as La Matanza (the Slaughter).

Two years ago, Gen Romero came to power in what was widely regarded as a rigged election.

Anti-government demonstrators gathered in the capital's main square and were fired on by government troops who killed about 50 people. Since then, left-wing groups such as the People's Revolutionary Army have carried out murders and bombings killing dozens of policemen.

Altogether 24 people were killed in the cathedral shootings. Later that year, Gen Romero was ousted in an army-led coup.

During the 1980s, El Salvador was ravaged by a bitter civil war between right-wing government "death squads" and leading left-wing group

The war left around 70,000 people dead but it also precipitated important political reforms

In 1992 a United Nations-brokered peace agreement ended the civil war, but no sooner had El Salvador begun to recover than it was hit by a series of natural disasters.

The most notable of these was Hurricane Mitch in 1998 and a number of earthquakes in 2001. These left at least 1,200 people dead and more than a million others homeless.





Moritz Hartmann pulled one back with another penalty conceded by Alonso — before the break but Bayern never looked in danger of missing out on its record 25th Bundesliga title, and its 26th German championship overall.

"The team played a brilliant season. We had the best challengers in Bundesliga history," Bayern forward Thomas Mueller said after winning his own fourth consecutive title. "It's extraordinary, we don't need to play it down."

Germany coach Joachim Loew added his congratulations.

row is testament to the great quality, the sheer will, and the unbelievable consistency of Bayern over the last years," Loew said.

Pep Guardiola, who is leaving for Manchester City after the German Cup final against Dortmund, became the first Bundesliga coach to win three titles in his first three seasons.

"I'd like to share this title with Jupp Heynckes. We've achieved something remarkable," Guardiola said in tribute to his predecessor.

Borussia Dortmund's 1-0 loss at relegation-threatened Eintracht Frankfurt meant even a defeat would have been enough for Bayern, which was eight points clear of Dortmund with one round remaining. Dortmund's 77 points were already a record for a second-place team since the Bundesliga began in 1963.

Stefan Aigner's early header proved enough for Frankfurt to climb out of the relegation zone, one point above Werder Bremen in the relegation playoff spot after its scoreless draw at Cologne.

Frankfurt was fortunate Mats Hummels' equalizer before the break was ruled out for offside. Video replays showed the Dortmund captain was onside at the time.

"The way the team has played in the last weeks shows that survival is possible," Frankfurt coach Niko Kovac said after the side's third successive win.

Stuttgart gave away a 1-0 lead and lost 3-1 at home to Mainz to move a step closer to relegation. Stuttgart was three points below Frankfurt, with Wolfsburg next away.

"I'm speechless. I'm sorry for the fans," said Stuttgart defender Kevin Grosskreutz, who was close to tears.

Stuttgart fans stormed the pitch after the game. The side needs a favor from Bremen, which hosts Frankfurt for a relegation showdown on the last day of the season.

"It's not yet over," Stuttgart coach Juergen Kramny said.

"Sometimes in football you need a miracle though."

Darmstadt secured survival in its first season back in the Bundesliga with a 2-1 come-frombehind win at Hertha Berlin that ended the home side's Champions League hopes. Sandro Wagner scored the winner late against his former club, five minutes before he was sent off.

Andre Hahn scored twice as Borussia Moenchengladbach came from behind to beat Bayer Leverkusen 2-1 and all but secure the Champions League playoff spot. Charles Aranguiz's first goal for Leverkusen looked to extend the visitors' seven-game winning streak, but Hahn equalized before the break and sealed it late.

Schalke was one minute away from a 1-0 win over Augsburg to stay a point behind 'Gladbach after Klaas Jan Huntelaar's 82nd-minute strike. Then Daniel Baier scored in the 89th for a draw to leave Schalke three points adrift of 'Gladbach, and behind Mainz and Hertha on goal difference. Augsburg was safe for another year.

"It's very, very bitter," said Schalke coach Andre Breitenreiter, tipped to make way for Augsburg counterpart Markus Weinzierl next season.

Also, Wolfsburg won at Hamburger SV 1-0, and already-relegated Hannover defeated Hoffenheim 1-0 at home. Both Hamburg and Hoffenheim secured survival despite defeats. **AP**

Leicester fans continue to celebrate their improbable title

Agrowing number of broken beer bottles crunched beneath their feet as thousands of Leicester supporters continued singing past midnight on the city's High Street yesterday.

"Champions of England," the chant went, "we know what we are."

Few around the world will not know. Singing it perhaps reminds Leicester fans that the past year is real and not some improbable sporting fantasy.

It was little surprise that Leicester Royal Infirmary reported twice the usual number of patients being admitted during the Saturday night revelry, mostly for minor injuries or alcohol-related incidents.

People were urged to avoid seeking medical attention unless it was urgent, with the hospital tweeting that it is "feeling the effect of the [Leicester] game yesterday. If you don't need to come to A&E please don't."

The solid silver Premier League trophy, topped by a golden crown, was presented the previous evening to the Leicester players after they overwhelmed Everton in a 3-1 win with a display that showed they are taking the final two games of the campaign seriously. **AP**

FIVE YEARS TO UPGRADE MACAU

Macau's first five-year plan is out and open to public debate and suggestions during the so-called consultation period. This is a superbly ambitious and comprehensive roadmap as it gives both the guidelines to upgrade MSAR to a world hub for tourism and leisure and at the same time inspires and encourages our society to engage and take a far more proactive role.

The actual draft has been prepared from the preliminary plan disclosed late last year (incorporating Central Government ideas on Macau's role in the Pan-River Delta Region). Despite re-arranging the seven major targets plus delivering a heavy infrastructure brief of four major areas (strategies, people's life, development and good governance) CE advisor Lei Ngan Leng revealed the plan to be only a "semi-completed version."

Lei Ngan Leng's evaluation apparently proposes to underline the preparedness of the Committee for Development for Tourism and Leisure to consider and eventually integrate suggestions emanating from the community.

However, this candid invitation to contribute to a completed version, or more complete, at least, can be easily misunderstood through a pair of twisted interpretations. On one hand, the five-year plan somewhat duplicates the yearly government sectorial guidelines, minus the budget... implying, if not duplicity, clear redundancy... in terms of policy. On the second hand, the plan's sketchy scope and its five-year span imitates a patchwork quilt.

For example, it is immaterial if the five-year plan calls unequivocally for land and urban planning. There is no Urban Master Plan, and until MSAR has one, life goes on as a patchwork of cases perfectly legal, like the outrageous 100-meter tall Coloane Hill project. No wonder that the plan outlines a call to the government in order to reform the old quarters and also build new urban areas. Do they care that there is no urban master plan? Is it possible to go ahead and do it? Yes.

The patchwork factor is not the exclusive domain of the construction industry. The five-year plan also mentions the level environmental protection as an important feature of a city with modern living conditions. In 2015, according to Statistics Bureau, demographics (population density) increased by more than 20 thousand per Km2, domestic and commercial waste grew by 4.6% and 1.3%. The incineration plant burned another 11% of solid waste. Cars and other vehicles kept piling up... but believe it or not, in terms of air quality, the roadside station of Rua do Campo registered an additional 84 days of "GOOD" air quality compared with the previous year, up to an amazing 221 good-air quality days.

However, the Environmental Protection Bureau took the opportunity presented by the Earth Day to disclose an obligatory survey about environmental awareness and environmental satisfaction.

E pur si muove! The Environmental Bureau report acknowledges that air quality increased slightly, and announced they will prepare a comprehensive regulation to address the air quality.

Finally, as an example of the patchwork way of doing things, we should consider odd that Secretary Chan believes the legislation on the extradition treaty with the Hong Kong SAR will be applied retroactively, together with other surgical interventions. When the time comes to sow the loose pieces of law and regulation unto a nice patchwork, then it will be possible to have a new glimpse of the bulk of the legislation.

One final note dedicated to a little something that could change the landscape. The Sports Bureau and the Tourism Department are about to introduce recreational water vehicles on the Nam Van Lakes: Pedal Boats.

AFGHANISTAN: 52 DEAD AFTER BUSES COLLIDE WITH TANKER

Two buses and a fuel tanker collided yesterday on a major highway in Afghanistan, killing 52 people, officials said. Another 73 people who had been on the buses were wounded in the accident, which set all three vehicles ablaze.

Records show the two buses were carrying a total of 125 passengers. The collision happened

at 7 a.m. on the main highway linking the capital, Kabul, to the southern city of Kandahar. The buses were traveling one behind the other from Kabul to Kandahar when the accident happened, according to Mohammadullah Ahmadi, director of the provincial traffic department. He blamed the crash on reckless driving.

Thai authorities arrest dissident's mom for online inaction

THE authorities in Thailand, who previously declared that marking a potentially illegal Facebook post with a "Like" could be cause for arrest, have charged a dissident's mother for failing to rebut a Facebook message that allegedly defamed the country's royal family.

Police on Saturday sought to defend the arrest of Patnaree Chankij for allegedly violating the law on lese majeste — defaming the monarchy — and the Computer Crime Act. They told reporters they had other evidence against her, but would not give details.

The group Thai Lawyers for Human Rights, which is defending both Patnaree and her son, said Friday that the police allege that the 40-year-old widow and mother of three failed to condemn a message she was sent by a man recently charged with lese majeste, which is punishable by three to 15 years in prison.

Patnaree's son, Sirawith Seritiwat, is a leader of a small group of activists who have repeatedly staged demonstrations against Thailand's repressive military junta, which took power in May 2014 after toppling an elected government. He has been detained and arrested numerous times.

His mother's arrest was widely seen as a way of pu-

tting pressure on him. The complaint against Patnaree was filed with police by the military.

"The Thai junta has sunk to a new low by charging an activist's mother under the 'insulting the monarchy' law, which has been systematically abused to silence critics," said Brad Adams, Asia director at Human Rights Watch. "Prosecuting someone for her vague response to a Facebook message is just the junta's latest outrageous twist of the lese majeste law."

The police charge sheet, posted by her lawyers, alleged that in an online dialogue that allegedly touched on the monarchy, Patnaree — under the name "Nuengnuch Charnkij" — used the Thai word "ja," which commonly would be understood as an acknowledgment ra-

ther than an endorsement.

The police alleged that her use of the word showed that she agreed with the post, which police declared "can be harmful to the Kingdom's security and stability ..."


"If Nuengnuch disagreed with his post, Nuengnuch should condemn or stop him from posting such a message. Instead, she replied 'Ja' to him, which means that she agrees with him."

Thai media reported that Patnaree's home in a Bangkok suburb was raided early Saturday afternoon and computers were taken away.

Her arrest is the latest in a series that began last month for people who posted online material critical of the country's ruling junta and its policies. Several arrests have also been based on texts sent privately over Facebook Messenger, causing alarm that users' privacy is being violated.

Users are also disturbed that Facebook has blocked a site that allegedly mocked the monarchy, the first time it appears to have done so in Thailand. The page redirects to an announcement that it is blocked to be in compliance with Thai law. In response to the Facebook issues, several activists have started a campaign to stop using the huge social network in favor of a competitor. **AP**

INDONESIA Seventeen passengers and crew were injured when a Hong Kong Airlines' flight ran into severe turbulence early Saturday on the way from Indonesia's resort Bali island to Hong Kong.

IRAQ Officials say multiple attacks in and around Iraq have killed at least 12 people. Police say the deadliest in yesterday's attacks was in Baghdad's western suburb of Abu Ghraib when a suicide bomber blew up himself outside a funeral tent for the wife of a local official, killing three policemen and two civilians. At least 16 others were wounded in that attack.

EGYPT Gunmen opened fire on a minibus filled with plainclothes policemen south of Cairo, killing eight and undercutting the government's efforts to stamp out violence and revive investment. The attackers stopped the police van in the city of Helwan, then sprayed it with bullets before fleeing the scene. More on p14
