Macau, Turkey sign air services agreement



aeronautical authorities of Macau and the Republic of Turkey met in Montreal on Saturday to discuss

and sign a bilateral Air Services Agreement (ASA). According to the Aviation Authority's (AACM) statement, the agreement is one of several aimed at encouraging foreign airlines to operate services to and from Macau. During the 39th ICAO Assembly in Montreal, the president of AACM, Simon Chan, and the directorate general of Civil Aviation of Turkey, Bilal Eksi, took the opportunity to sign the agreement on behalf of their governments. The Minister of Transport, Maritime Affairs and Communications of the Republic of Turkey, Ahmet Arslan, attended the signing ceremony. The memorandum of understanding states that the two parties can enjoy multiple designations of airlines, and the designated airlines can enjoy zero capacity restrictions in their operation of scheduled passenger and all-cargo flights.

Local director nominated for Taiwan film awards

"Crash," a short film by Macau director Hong Heng Fai, has been nominated in the category of Best Live Action Short Film for the 53rd Golden Horse Awards in Taiwan. Hong is the first director from Macau to be nominated in this award ceremony. The director, who is currently an independent producer, explained that the movie was entirely filmed in Macau, with all cast and crew members being Macau residents. The movie was supported by the Macao Cultural Centre. The final results will be revealed during the Golden Horse Awards Ceremony, which will take place November 26.

Fake bomb alert at local hotel

Last Wednesday, a mandarin-speaking man reported to the police he had planted a bomb in the lobby of Galaxy JW Marriott hotel. The suspect told the police the bomb would explode 30 minutes after his call. Explosive ordnance disposal officers and the fire squad were sent to the hotel to search for the bomb, but nothing suspicious was found. The police force later confirmed that the man had faked the incident. This information hours after the police completed the search. The police authorities have been placed under fire due to delayed reports to the media. However, the police claims that all reporting procedures have been conducted in accordance with the current reporting system. According to the police, the crime scene was not blocked off during the search for the bomb, which proved they evaluated the scene as safe.

China needs to promote cultural diversity

Atthough China's Yone Belt, One Road,' (OBOR) scheme is expected to bring vital economic and technological developments in China, a scholar believes that the country still lacks the initiative to deepen its understanding of different

The principle of OBOR is to promote regional and crosscontinental connectivity between China and Eurasia.

Hence, Feng Da-Hsuan, director of Global Affairs and special advisor to rector of the University of Macau explained that the East Asian country ought to promote knowledge about various histories and cultures of different countries in its region.

According to him, only three out of 3,500 institutions in China, are with scale-down efforts in learning about South Asia. "There are efforts now, you see a little, but too little, too few," he lamented.

The centerpiece of China's economic diplomacy may create new economic opportunities, however he questioned whether it could be a platform for a mindset transformation for the millennium.

Speaking on the sidelines

of the monthly French Macau Business Association's breakfast meeting held last week, the scholar recalled that universities in the renaissance period welcomed a "new cultural ambience," which then attributed to developing a cultural bridge between the Middle Ages and modern history.

Thus the expert believes that if current institutions in

the "supercontinent" were to be opened to different traditions, similar revolutions may occur.

"These great giants in the neo-renaissance [...] armed with an amalgamated cultural background, will surely propose breakthrough thinking and methodologies to overcome humanity challenges," he affirmed.

Feng argued that OBOR is a great opportunity for China to transform itself at this point in time. "Before it was too poor, too disorganized. Finally, China is organized as a serious nation but then they need to think of how can China, as a nation, help humanity and not just for itself," he explained.

"For China to rethink this

transformation, it needs to set a new level of humility, which it never had," added the expert.

The scholar is confident that China is capable of promoting various cultures to its peoples, however he doubted whether it has reached the point of wanting to promote this yet.

According to him, the most demanding task for China is how it could preserve its robust culture, while attempting to introduce and understand other philosophies.

Meanwhile, Feng said that Macau is one of the few places in Asia which understands the importance of cultural diversity, adding that the peninsula has a vast history which could influence OBOR 'enormously.'

"OBOR cannot just be an economic and technological development. It will be development of China transforming its own thinking in the 21st century and Macau actually did that in the last 500 years," he told the Ti-

Further, he noted that higher education in the region has been improving significantly. He said that the local government probably realized that a great university would first be needed to diversify the economy.

SSM discloses monthly data on infectious diseases, more cases reported

THE Health Bureau (SSM) has ▲ disclosed the latest data related to infectious diseases in the region. In August there was a higher incidence of infectious diseases when compared both month-to-month with July and year-on-year.

Toping the list are the Norovirus infections (9 cases), chickenpox (34 cases) and bacterial food poisoning (21 cases), that according to SSM, had registered a notable increase in the number of cases

compared to the same period last year and the month of July 2016. Adding to this, 8 cases of scarlet fever were also recorded as well as 150 cases of Enterovirus infections and seven cases of contamination by Salmonella bacteria.

Pulmonary tuberculosis that recorded 34 cases this August. A single case of AIDS was reported while the infection of HIV raised to three cases on year-on-year.

Currently, there is a list of 44 disea-

ses that require a compulsory declaration from both public and private health care institutions or individuals. The data collected is used by the SSM to adopt and/or update preventive and control measures.

From now on, information on infectious diseases will become available on a monthly basis in order to comply with the regulation for the control of such illnesses and avoid any epidemic impact as much as possible. RM

ACAU'S gaming swelled revenue more than estimated in September, with new casino projects from the local units of Las Vegas Sands Corp. and Wynn Resorts Ltd. helping draw recreational gamblers.

Gross gaming revenue rose 7.4 percent to MOP18.4 billion (USD2.3,billion), according to the Gaming Inspection and Coordination Bureau. That followed a 1.1 percent increase in August, after a 26-month slump, and compares with the median estimate for a 4 percent advance in a Bloomberg survey of nine analysts.

Macau is in the process of transforming itself into a tourist destination after Chinese President Xi Jinping ordered the city to diversify its economy from gambling in late 2014. In response, casino operators have been building resorts with more non-gambling features in Macau's Cotai Strip. These include Wynn Palace, which opened in August, and Sands's Parisian which debuted last month.

"In September we had the benefit of recent openings such as Wynn Palace and the Parisian," Aaron Fischer, an analyst at CLSA Ltd., said before the data was released. "There's been a shortage of hotel rooms and the new properties are adding

to capacity."

The casino industry is bracing for a visit in October by Premier Li Keqiang, with analysts warning that the nascent recovery may be threatened by his

appearance in the former Portuguese colony to attend a conference of ministers of the China and Portuguese-speaking countries. Bloomberg stated.

A visit by Li "could potentially

result" in gaming revenue returning to negative growth in October, said Grant Govertsen, a Macau-based analyst at Union Gaming. The impact is expected to be felt "exclusively

at the high-end of the market," he said.

Accumulated gross revenue from January to September fell 7.5 percent from a year ago period, DICJ said. MDT/Bloomberg

Ian Coughlan appointed as Wynn Macau president

TAN Coughlan was appointed as pre-**⊥**sident of Wynn Macau, replacing Gamal Abdelaziz, who resigned, the Las Vegas-based company said Friday in a filing. Coughlan will be responsible for all operations and development at the Wynn Palace, as well as the Wynn Macau resort, the company said. The Palace opened on Aug. 22, and the part that caters to mass-market customers has been lackluster in its first weeks, analysts said.

According to Bloomberg, Mr Coughlan joined Wynn Macau in January 2007. He has over 30 years of hospitality experience with leading hotels across Asia, Europe and the United States. Before joining Wynn Resorts, Limited, he spent ten years with The Peninsula Group, serving as a general manager of Peninsula Hong Kong from September 2004 to January 18, 2007.

Gamal Abdelaziz led the development of its new USD4.2 billion Wynn Palace resort and served as president of Wynn Macau since 2007. His "departure should be an indication that the post-opening ramp of the Palace has been disappointing," Harry Curtis, an analyst at Nomura Securities, wrote in a note Friday. "It will take a long time to build a mass presence at the Palace, which was built more for premium players."

Wynn Resorts plans to release opening numbers for the resort at an unspecified time, the company said Friday in an e-mail.

The Palace opened following a two-year a slump in gambling in Macau. Gambling rose 1.1 percent in August and 7.4 percent in September. Analysts are now warning that gaming may take another hit when Chinese Premier Li Keqiang travels to Macau in October to attend the Forum Macau's ministerial conference.

"Historically, visits to Macau by highlevel PRC officials have had short-term negative impacts on gross gaming revenue and we expect this same dynamic to occur in October," said Grant Govertsen, a Macau-based analyst at Union Gaming.

Curtis at Nomura noted that once Macau's new light-rail system is operational, the Palace could achieve a 10 percent return on invested capital, though he said initial gains should be closer to $mid\text{-}single\ digits.\ \textbf{MDT/Bloomberg}$

Pokémon Go available in Macau

Pokémon Go fans in Macau can now download the app from Google Play or iTunes. The news was announced recently by Niantic, the game developer, a software development company based in San Francisco.

Besides Macau, the game also became available in Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Macedonia and Serbia on the same day. The next day, six more countries - Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, and Mongolia - were able to access the game. On July 6 of this year,

Pokémon Go was initially released in Australia, New Zealand, and the United States, followed soon after by its release in Germany, the United Kingdom, Italy, Spain, and Portugal. By July 16, the game could already be played in 26 countries in Europe. On July 25, the game became available in Macau's neighboring region, Hong



Kong, the second city a distracted driver who in Asia to welcome the was playing the game famous game.

While the game had yet to become available in the city, hundreds of reports of robberies, traffic accidents and other mishaps taking place abroad worried both the public and the government.

The game encourages its players to go to real locations in the city in order to catch the virtual Pokémon creatures, which in some cases has resulted in crimes and accidents occurring more frequently.

In August, a woman was killed in Japan by while driving.

In addition to the accidents, there were also a few bans on the game. Earlier, the Hong Kong Police Force, the city's Hospital Authority, religious centers and even the People's Liberation Army announced that players should distance themselves from their buildings' vicinities.

According to a report by South China Morning Post, Hong Kong's Pokémon players are required to leave the area if they are trespassing and will even be arrested if they ignore police warnings. JZ

In a prompt response from the government, the office of the Secretary for Administration and Justice, Sonia Chan, issued a statement reacting to the demonstration: "The event is about a conflict of interest between the owners and the promoter company and it can only be solved by the law, which includes court actions in case the situation can't be solved through negotiations," the statement read, reaffirming the "attention" of the government to the situation and its clear intentions to act in accordance with the Land Law.

But Pearl Horizon protesters were not the only ones on the streets last Saturday. There were also other groups urging the government to take action in support of their cause. Among them was a group calling for restrictions and tighter supervision on imported labor in order to better protect the interests of local residents.

According to the PSP, all of the demonstrations took place in an orderly manner without any reports of conflict. **RM**

During a backstage media visit last week, the tour director explained that the show's music is entirely live. The music is performed by six musicians who work behind the stage.

The show will be playing in the city until November 13 at the Parisian Theatre.

Among the performers, one of the cast leads is Cleo Higgins. As told by Higgins, this is her first time doing a live show in Asia. "Of course, I am excited," she said, adding that travelling to Macau has been an exciting and

enjoyable trip.

According to Higgins, Macau is the second place in Asia where the group performs. "We travelled pretty much everywhere around the world, but the only place that we managed to touch in Asia was Japan," she noted.

When asked about the reason that inspired her to join the show, Higgins mentioned Michael Jackson. "To be fair, I have done this job because Michael Jackson is my biggest inspiration," she said, adding that Michael Jackson's music really

grew on her.

This might be the last stop for Higgins on the Thriller Live tour. "I am ready to kind of, stop now. So Macau is my last stop on Thriller," she announced.

Higgins was the lead singer of the 90s R&B pop sensation group Cleopatra, who had five hit singles in the UK.

Phil Watts, tour manager of the Thriller Live, said that the artists are trying to give the audience the same experience they might have had during one of Michael Jackson's concerts. "We try to keep it from not

being a tribute show," said Watts. "What we try to do is to show people how multi-talented Michael Jackson was, what a fantastic singer and dancer he was."

According to Watts, the show here in Macau is a faithful and complete replica of what could be seen in the back stage of the West End.

Thriller Live features Jackson's timeless songs and signature dance moves, and it has been performed more than 5,000 times and seen by four million people in more than 30 countries around the world.

Japan wins fireworks contest

Former Radio Macau director Alberto Alecrim dies at 84

FORMER journalist and Radio Macau director Alberto Alecrim passed away yesterday morning, falling victim to a long-term illness.

At the age of 84, Alecrim was a resident of Macau for over 50 years. He was appointed as Radio Macau director in 1978. He was also a contributor to local newspaper Clarim and worked in the

Government Information Bureau.

Alecrim arrived in the territory in 1965 some years after the invasion of the then Portuguese colony of Goa by the Indian army, which left him arrested in an internment camp for a while. In Macau, Alecrim continued his work as a radio broadcaster, which he had begun earlier in Goa.

Many of his friends have expressed their sorrow for his death and remember him for his sense of humor. President of the Macanese Association Miguel Senna Fernandes said to Radio Macau, "Macau lost an 'institution.' A man that made himself Macanese by his unconditional love for this land that become his own." He added that Alecrim

was a man "of strong values but also of a lot of 'savoir-faire,' essential characteristics [to have to succeed] in Macau."

Another of his friends, the lawyer and former lawmaker António Correia, commented to Radio Macau, "near him there was never sadness – that's Alecrim's trade mark," and recalled the friend as a "living encyclopedia of what this land is." RM

Chow Tai Fook's honorary chairman dies

HENG Yu-tung, a gold-shop apprentice who married his boss's daughter and helped develop the world's largest jewelry retailer, has died. He was 91.

Cheng died peacefully with his family at his side Thursday night, his family said in an e-mailed statement.

Like fellow billionaire Li Ka-shing, Cheng was among Chinese refugees who fled from Japanese invaders and made it big outside of the mainland. Cheng, the third-richest tycoon in the city on the Bloomberg Billionaires Index, had an estimated net worth of USD12.7 billion through his holdings in Chow Tai Fook Jewellery Group Ltd. and New World Development Co.

He was "a born entrepreneur," Raymond Or, a friend and former vice chairman and chief executive officer of Hang Seng Bank Ltd., said in a September 2012 interview. Cheng's business and investment decisions were "aggressive yet they hit the spot even in tough times," Or said.

Cheng was honorary chairman of Chow Tai Fook Jewellery, which operates more than 2,000 outlets in China and Hong Kong, and whose revenue was more than 70 percent larger than that of New York-based Tiffany & Co. in the latest fiscal year. The jewelry-chain operator has struggled recently in Hong Kong as mainland Chinese tourists skip the shopping mecca for other destinations.

Profit for the year ended March 31 fell by 46 percent, slumping to the lowest since 2010. The chain is now looking to new strategies such as operating art galleries merged with malls in China, and selling diamonds wholesale to U.S. retailers to diversify away from its retail business.

Besides Chow Tai Fook, there's New World Development. In February 2012, Cheng announced his retirement as chairman of the company, which was founded in 1970 and operates in businesses including property, energy, bus services and department sto-

Henry Cheng, who succeeded his father as chairman, said the patriarch's death won't affect New World's operations as the billionaire had been in his sick bed in the past four

The elder Cheng was born

on Aug. 26, 1925, in Shunde, a city in Guangdong, the southern Chinese province adjoining Hong Kong. In 1940, he fled to Macau to escape China's war with Japan.

At the age of 15, Cheng got his first job as an apprentice at the gold shop of family friend Chow Chi Yeun, who had founded Chow Tai Fook in 1929. Three years later, Cheng married Chow's daughter, Tsui Ying, in a marriage arranged by their fathers.

In 1946, Cheng moved to Hong Kong from Macau to open a store. The jewelry chain expanded as Hong Kong's population doubled to almost 1.5 million with mostly displaced refugees. By 1950, the city's population swelled to more than 2 million as Chinese fled Communist China, and Cheng used the profits from selling gold to fund his property purchases.

"In the late '50s, early '60s, I was in the jewelry industry when some friend told me property is better," Cheng said in a 2009 interview with analysts at CLSA Asia-Pacific Markets. "I was not very knowledgeable about properties so I tried out with some small projects in Wanchai," he said, referring to a commercial district.

Cheng expanded his property business in May 1967, when the Cultural Revolution in China spilled over into Hong Kong. Pro-Communist demonstrators rioted against the British rule, leading to 51 people killed and 800 injured. Real estate prices plunged 71 percent. Cheng bought property in the aftermath. He started the New World Centre, a retail-hotel-residentialoffice complex in Kowloon, followed by the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Center in the mid-1980s.

As his businesses took off, he would visit jewelry stores unannounced to check on them, and eat with his workers at the company canteen. He wore Nike running shoes with business suits.

Cheng was a major philanthropist in Hong Kong. In April 2012, he spoke at a groundbreaking for a building that was named after him at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. In 2008, Cheng pledged a HK\$400 million gift to the University of Hong Kong.

"Because I've lost my chance to go to school, I want to help the future generations of our nation to be educated," the Standard reported him saying at the time.

Cheng took Chow Tai Fook public in December 2011, raising \$2 billion in a Hong Kong share sale. Two months later, he announced his retirement from that business.

Last December, Cheng transferred some of his stock holdings to family funds and agreed to sell \$3.2 billion of Chinese property projects in a move seen as an effort to put his affairs in order.

Cheng and his wife had two sons, Henry Cheng and Peter Cheng, and two daughters, Amy Cheng and Cheng Lai Ha. Bloomberg

Trump had USD916m loss in '95, cutting taxes, NYT Says

ONALD Trump was facing renewed pressure to release his personal tax information after a New York Times report that he recorded a USD916 million loss on his 1995 income tax return, a deduction that might have allowed him to cut his federal income tax for several ensuing

The Times, citing tax analysts, reported on Saturday night that based on Trump's 1995 income tax documents, he might have been able to reduce his tax bills for as many as 18 years. The newspaper posted to its website three documents, which purported to be from state tax returns in New York, Connecticut and New Jersey. It received the documents in the mail last month, the newspaper said.

Trump's campaign said in a statement that he "has paid hundreds of millions of dollars in property taxes, sales and excise taxes, real estate taxes, city taxes, state taxes, employee taxes and federal taxes." It also said the tax documents -- which it referred to as an "alleged tax document," had been "illegally obtained."

"I know our complex tax laws better than anyone who has ever run for president and am the only one who can fix them," Trump said Sunday on Twitter.

Departing from roughly 40 years of tradition for presidential nominees, Trump has declined to release his tax returns. He says they are under an Internal Revenue Service audit and that he won't release them until that audit has concluded. There's no law preventing people from releasing their tax returns, even if they're under audit. But tax advisers say that doing so would subject the returns to public scrutiny that might surface issues auditors had missed.

Democrat Hillary Clinton's campaign, which has repeatedly faulted Trump over the lack of transparency, seized upon the Times report, calling it a "bombshell" that reveals

both Trump's past business failures and his tax avoidance.

Clinton campaign press secretary Brian Fallon tweeted that the story showed "just how lousy a businessman he is AND how long he may have avoided paying any taxes."

During their debate on Monday, Clinton had speculated that Trump was trying to hide politically embarrassing in 1978 and 1979.

Trump responded: "That makes me smart." In its statement Saturday, Trump's campaign said he "has a fiduciary responsibility to his business, his family and his employees to pay no more tax than legally required."

The Post's report was based on returns Trump had filed with the New Jersey Casino

information by withholding his returns -- including that he doesn't want the public to know "that he's paid nothing in federal taxes." She cited previous reports, including one by the Washington Post, which showed that he had paid no federal income taxes Control Commission in 1981. For 1978 and 1979, Trump took advantage of a tax-code provision popular with developers that allowed him to report negative income, according to the Post. He told the newspaper, "When you're in the real estate business, you

do have certain tax advantages." Developers can depreciate the value of real estate to reduce their taxable income.

In Saturday's report, the New York Times cited a \$916 million loss and noted "the financial wreckage" he left behind in the early 1990s through mismanagement of three Atlantic City casinos, his ill-fated foray into the airline business and his ill-timed purchase of the Plaza Hotel in Manhattan.

Several Republican operatives who worked for Trump's opponents in the primary elections predicted the news would weigh heavily on the nominee in the Nov. 8 election, arguing that voters will see his tax avoidance as a matter of fairness.

"Most Americans know you can't avoid two things: death and taxes," said David Kochel, who was former Florida Governor Jeb Bush's chief strategist before Bush quit the presidential race.

Trump has in the past criticized people who he says don't pay their fair share of taxes. In September 2015, he tweeted: "The hedge fund guys (gals) have to pay higher taxes ASAP. They are paying practically nothing. We must reduce classes for the middle class!"

The New York Times's story capped one of the most tumultuous weeks yet for Trump, following what was widely perceived as a dismal performance at the first presidential debate. He has faced a barrage of attacks for his continued abrasive rhetoric against former Miss Universe pageant winner Alicia Machado, including a series of early morning tweets suggesting, without any evidence, that she had a sex tape. He has also repeatedly threatened to make Bill Clinton's past infidelities a central issue of his campaign, to the consternation of several of his closest advisers.

If genuine, the 1995 documents that the Times released Saturday revolve around "net operating losses" - which under federal tax rules allow a business to apply losses from any one year to future years - reducing taxable income in those years.

In 1995, taxpayers could "carry forward" such losses for 15 years, the Times reported, and apply them for three years retroactively. The rules are meant to smooth out fluctuations in taxable income over time.

While the \$916 million loss is substantial - and it would have helped cut future taxes to be sure - it's unclear precisely how such a loss would have affected Trump's tax liability going forward. That's because his taxable income in subsequent years is unknown. Bloomberg



Singapore home prices slide by most in more than 7 years

SINGAPORE home prices dropped by the most in more than seven years as developers offered discounts amid signals from the government that it won't roll back property curbs initiated in 2009.

An index tracking private residential prices fell 1.5 percent in the three months ended Sept. 30 from the previous quarter, the biggest decline since June 2009. Prices fell for the 12th straight quarter, the longest streak of quarterly losses since prices were first published in 1975, according to preliminary data from the Urban Redevelopment Authority yesterday.

The head of Singapore's central bank, Ravi Menon, said last month that the city-state doesn't plan to ease property curbs anytime soon, even as home prices have fallen 11 percent from a peak in September 2013 and sales have halved. That's increasing the pressure on developers to offer discounts, payment programs and other incentives to stoke sales.

"The haemorrhage continues for home prices," said Nicholas Mak, an executive director at SLP International Property Consultants in Singapore. "The prices could be taking into account the delayed discounts offered in creative marketing by developers, which could be coming in with a lag."

For example, developer OUE Ltd. offers four payment plans for its Twin Peaks condominium project off the prime Orchard Road shopping belt. The most popular of those is the deferred payment program where the home buyer pays a small amount upfront and the rest over the next two years, according to its website.

The existing stock of unsold homes may take three years to sell, according to Augustine Tan, President of the Real Estate Developers' Association of Singapore. In addition to the oversupply, home vacancy rates are at their highest in more than 11 years, Tan said last month.

The residential curbs have included a cap on debt-repayment costs at 60 percent of a borrower's monthly income and higher stamp duties on home purchases, after low interest rates and demand from foreign buyers raised concerns prices had risen too far too fast.

Apartment prices fell 1.8 percent in prime districts in the three months ended Sept. 30, reversing a 0.3 percent gain in the previous quarter, yesterday's data showed. Those in the suburbs slid 1.2 percent, while areas near prime districts declined 1.3 percent from the previous quarter.

Still, Singapore remains a high-end housing market in Asia. The city was ranked the most expensive to buy a luxury home after Hong Kong in the region, according to a 2016 Knight Frank wealth report. **Bloomberg**

Singapore says Chinese newspaper 'fabricated' report

INGAPORE accused a nationalist Chinese state-run newspaper of fabricating details in a news report that it said falsely depicted the city-state's conduct at a recent summit in Venezuela.

The Global Times report, published on its Chinese-language website, said that Singapore requested that the final document of the 17th Non-Aligned Movement summit include an endorsement for an international arbitration panel's July ruling favoring the Philippines in its dispute with China over the South China Sea. The report cited unnamed sources it said "had knowledge of the

situation."

The report said that most of the countries objected to the Singaporean delegation's request, angering the delegation. The newspaper said the delegation also spoke rudely to those countries' officials.

The report triggered an unusually public dispute between Singapore's ambassador to China and the chief editor of the tabloid newspaper, which is published by the ruling Communist Party's mouthpiece

People's Daily. The outspoken paper targets a domestic audience for whom nationalistic appeals resonate strongly.

In an open letter to the Global Times' editor-in-chief, the ambassador, Stanley Loh, said that the report "attributed actions and words to Singapore which are false and unfounded."

In the letter, Loh said that "the proposal to update the Southeast Asia paragraphs in the NAM Final Document was not done at the last minute nor

by any single ASEAN country. There was a common and united ASEAN position."

It said that Singapore was "disappointed that an established newspaper published this irresponsible report replete with fabrications and unfounded allegations with no regard for the facts," and noted that Singapore was represented at the summit, while China was not.

The editor-in-chief of the Global Times, Hu Xijin, stood

his ground against Loh's accusations, saying that the report "was based on a serious and reliable source who attended the summit," according to the newspaper.

The ambassador wrote a second letter aimed at refuting Hu's response.

Singapore doesn't have any claims to disputed islands in the South China Sea and its officials say it is interested in safeguarding the stability of the region's waterways. AP

THE Chinese units of a former meat supplier for McDonald's and KFC China have been fined more than USD3.6 million for selling expired meat in a fast food safety scandal that erupted two years ago.

It's the latest fallout for OSI Group after a Shanghai TV station reported in 2014 that the company repackaged old beef and chicken under fresher expiration dates.

In a notice posted on its website, the Shanghai Municipal Food and Drug Administration said Monday that district market regulators fined Shanghai Husi Food Co. about

17 million yuan (\$2.5 million).

Husi parent OSI Group's China office was hit with a separate fine of 7.3 million yuan (\$1.1 million).

Husi and OSI will also face tighter scrutiny from the regulator, though specifics weren't given.

No one answered the phone at OSI and Husi offices in China, where Monday was the start of a weeklong holiday. Calls to the regulator's offices also went unanswered.

The penalties come after a Shanghai court's ruling in February that two local units of Aurora, Illinois-based OSI sold the tainted meat and fined them a total of 2.4 million yuan. The court also sentenced 10 employees to prison, one of them Australian.

The company appealed the ruling, but the regulator's notice said the appeal was rejected

in July.

Food safety remains a concern for Chinese consumers despite promises from the government to step up enforcement. Other recent high-profile scares include tainted baby formula, fake meat and fruits and even seafood pumped with gelatin

After the report by Shanghai's Dragon TV aired, Husi customers in China including McDonald's Corp., Yum Brands Inc.'s KFC and Pizza Hut restaurants and Burger King Corp. stopped using its products. The company was forced to lay off 340 workers and the chairman apologized. AP



North, South Korea trade threats over pre-emptive strike

INCE North Korea's latest nuclear test, Pyongyang and Seoul have been openly trading threats of decapitation strikes and annihilating capitals populated by millions of civilians. And the talk of how each side might throw that first pre-emptive punch has become more detailed than ever.

Seoul and Pyongyang are now making a point of claiming they are justified, and capable, of striking hard if an attack by the other appears imminent: North Korea with its rapidly developing nuclear arsenal, Seoul with conventional missile attacks and commando operations explicitly aimed at killing Kim Jong Un and his top commanders.

Swings of tension from crisis levels to business as usual, with the white noise of bellicose rhetoric always in the background, have been a fact of life for decades on the divided Korean Peninsula. But with pre-emptive strike scenarios now coming out in the open, there may be new cause for real concern.

Here's a look at why, from the perspectives of the North, the South and the United States:

PYONGYANG DOUBLES DOWN

Since assuming power in late 2011, Kim has made major strides toward making his country a credible nuclear threat.

This year alone, the North has conducted two nuclear tests, its latest and biggest on Sept. 9. It has test-launched several long-range missiles, including at least one from a submarine, and generally demonstrated it's moving toward a stealthier, deployment-ready nuclear and missile arsenal.

Pyongyang may now be capable of launching a nuclear attack on Seoul, which is only about 60

kilometers south of the Demilitarized Zone, and on the roughly 28,000 U.S. troops deployed in the South. Also possibly within striking distance are Japan, home to another 50,000 U.S. troops, and even the U.S. territory of Guam, a key Pacific military hub about 3,000 kilometers away.

It's closer than ever to having nuclear-tipped missiles able to reach the U.S. mainland.

Having the weaponry and being able to successfully use it are two different things. Experts have mixed opinions on whether the North can actually mount nuclear weapons on its long-range missiles, and on how reliable either would be.

North Korea has effectively held Seoul hostage for decades with dug-in, well-hidden artillery that could cause massive damage on the crowded South Korean capital and its suburbs. But the immediate U.S.-South Korean counterattack would be devastating

But by introducing nuclear weapons into the equation, Pyongyang is trying to strengthen its hand — in deterrence, in an actual contingency or at the negotiating table should meaningful talks with Washington resume.

It's a risky, costly and extremely

dangerous gambit, and North Korea appears to be doubling down.

In March, its state media reported that Kim personally supervised a drill simulating an attack on the Blue House, South Korea's presidential residence. Late last month, the North's military issued a statement threatening to use nuclear weapons to reduce Seoul to ashes and "sweep Guam, the base of provocations, from the surface of the earth." This week, state media again warned the North is ready to act at the "slightest sign of intrusion."

SOUTH KOREA PREPS TO TAKE OUT KIM

Obviously, a "decapitation strike" scenario aimed at North Korea's leadership is something the South would quietly consider — that's what military strategists are paid to do. North Korea attempted one against South Korean President Park Chung-hee in 1968; it was a disaster.

But Seoul is now showing its

South Korean media started talking about them in August 2015, when a South Korean defense official said "beheading operations" would be part of a new joint wartime plan. U.S. and South Korean troops reportedly

conducted such training during joint exercises in March. Some military experts say such exercises aren't new, but the reports outraged Pyongyang.

Seoul's rhetoric is now even more pointed. Shortly after last month's nuclear test, its Joint Chiefs of Staff announced plans to strengthen its ability to conduct pre-emptive strikes. And it said a "Korea Massive Punishment and Retaliation" system would use special forces, the Hyunmoo-2 ballistic missile and the Hyunmoo-3 cruise missile now under development — to, as one South Korean newspaper put it, "obliterate areas where Kim Jong Un and the rest of North Korea's leaders are located."

Kim Dae Young, a military expert at South Korea's Korea Defense and Security Forum, questioned whether the South could pull off a pre-emptive strike without nuclear weapons.

"Pyongyang's subways run 100 to 150 meters deep. South Korea could fire all of its cruise missiles and ballistic missiles onto Pyongyang and it would still be difficult to break the tunnels," he said. "If you're able to take out Kim Jong Un on the first try, good. But if you fail, then you come under a nuclear attack."

Conservative lawmakers, scholars and media agencies are calling for South Korea to develop its own nukes and ask the U.S. to reintroduce tactical nuclear weapons into South Korea. Officials say they have no plans for such changes, which would infuriate neighbors China, Russia and Japan and fly in the face of longstanding U.S. military policy.

PATIENCE AND WORRY IN WASHINGTON

With presidential elections just over a month away, Washington has been sticking to President Barack Obama's longstanding policy of "strategic patience" — keeping Pyongyang at arm's length, building regional alliances and isolating the North's government.

It has recently flown B-1B bombers over the Korean Peninsula and is moving ahead with the deployment of its top-of-the-line THAAD missile defense system in South Korea, though China sees THAAD as a threat to its own defense.

Assistant Secretary of State Daniel Russel, the top U.S. diplomat for East Asia, assured Congress last week the U.S. has plans in place for "de-escalating and defusing" a crisis. He said South Korea's official statements on pre-emption did not show it has any intent "to take precipitous or provocative action."

Even so, some in Washington view the escalation as disconcerting.

"Discussions of things like preemption in public obviously add a troubling element to peninsular dynamics," said Evans Revere, a former State Department official and East Asia expert.

Revere blamed Pyongyang for its rapid nuclear and missile buildup. He said Seoul's logic in allowing stories about exercise scenarios to leak out is to "maximize the deterrent message" and to reassure South Koreans.

That, too, is a risky game.

Democratic Sen. Ed Markey, also at last week's Senate hearing, warned that if North Korea believes the South intends to use pre-emptive force to kill its leaders, Kim Jong Un would be under pressure to delegate control over nuclear weapons to front-line military commanders. If the North believes Seoul plans to pre-emptively take out its nuclear weapons, he added, that could also create pressure to "use them or lose them in a crisis."

"Both of those pressures could drastically increase the risk of inadvertent nuclear war on the peninsula," he said. **AP**

Police officer Syed Javeid Mujataba Gillani said earlier that it was not immediately known whether the militants tried to enter the camp in the garrison town of Baramulla, 50 kilometres northwest of Srinagar, the main city in Kashmir. The camp is the local headquarters of a counterinsurgency military unit.

The paramilitary soldiers hit by gunfire were also stationed at the camp, a police officer said on condition of anonymity as he was not authorized to talk to reporters.

Sunday's attack came three days after the Indian army said it had carried out a "surgical strike" in the region and destroyed "terrorist launching pads" used by the militants with support from Pakistan.

The Indian assault followed a deadly rebel

attack on another Indian base in Kashmir. On Sept. 18, suspected rebels using guns and grenades sneaked into an army base in Uri, a town in Indiancontrolled Kashmir, and killed at least 18 soldiers.

India accuses Pakistan of arming and training insurgents fighting for Kashmir's independence from India or its merger with Pakistan, a charge Pakistan denies.

Kashmir is divided between India and Pakistan. The longtime rivals have fought two wars for control of the Himalayan territory since British colonialists left in 1947. Both claim it in its entirety. **AP**



Colombia in unchartered territory with peace deal's defeat

stunning referendum defeat for a peace deal with leftist rebels leaves Colombians with no Plan B to save an accord that sought to bring an end to a half century of hostilities.

Instead of winning by an almost two-to-one margin on Sunday as pre-election polls had predicted, those favoring the accord with the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia lost by a razor-thin margin, 49.8 percent to 50.2 percent for those against the deal.

Both President Juan Manuel Santos and leaders of the FARC, after four years of grueling negotiations, vowed to push ahead, giving no hint they want to resume a war that has already killed 220,000 people and displaced 8 million.

"I won't give up. I'll continue search for peace until the last moment of my mandate," Santos said in a televised address appealing for calm.

But it's not clear how the already unpopular Santos can save the deal after the stunning political defeat. He has ordered his negotiators to return to Cuba yesterday to confer with FARC's top leaders, who watched the results with disbelief after ordering drinks and cigars at Club Havana, once Cuba's most exclusive beach club.

"The FARC deeply regret that the destructive power of those who sow hatred and revenge have influenced the Colombian people's opinion," the FARC's top commander, a guerrilla known as Timochenko, told reporters.

The loss for the government was even more shocking considering the huge support for the accord among foreign leaders, who have heralded it as a model for a world beset by political violence and terrorism. Many heads of state as well as U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry were present when Santos and Timochenko signed the deal less than a week ago in an elaborate, emotion-filled ceremony.

Norway, which along with Cuba co-sponsored the talks, said it would be willing to further facilitate peace talks.

"I am very disappointed, and the result shows a very polarized and split Colombia," Norway's Foreign Minister Borge Brende told the NTB news agency.

"We have told both parties that we will be at their disposal and are available," he said. "We must also involve the opposition who say they want peace and hear what they think might be the solution."

With the outlook uncertain, all eves are on Santos' former boss and chief rival: Alvaro Uribe, the powerful former president who led the grass-roots campaign against the accord. With none of the government's huge PR machine, an angry Uribe gave voice to millions of Colombians, many of them victims of the FARC like him, who bristled at provisions in the 297-page accord sparing rebels jail time if they confessed their crimes and

instead reserved them 10 seats in Congress.

Uribe, in prepared remarks from his ranch outside Medellin after the results were in, called for a "big national pact" and insisted on "correctives" that guarantee respect for the constitution, respect for private enterprise and justice without impunity. But he didn't specify whether he would join Santos in trying to salvage the deal, and took more swipes at the FARC, demanding it end drug trafficking and extortion.

"The entire accord was full of impunity," said Ricardo Bernal, 60, celebrating the victory for the "no" side in a Bogota neighborhood where opponents were gathered. "We all want peace but there have to be adjustments made."

Across town, hundreds of supporters of the peace deal who had gathered in a hotel ballroom for what they expected would be a victory party with Santos wept in despair.

The FARC's 7,000 guerrilla fighters are unlikely to return to the battlefield any time soon. For now, a cease-fire remains in place.

One option for Santos would be to reopen negotiations, something he had ruled out

previously and his chief negotiator said would be "catastrophic." The president, who has a little under two years left in office, could also seek to bypass another popular vote and ratify the accord in Congress or by calling a constitutional convention, something both the FARC and Uribe have previously favored.

"I've always believed in a wise Chinese proverb, to look for opportunities in any situation. And here we have an opportunity that's opening up, with the new political reality that has demonstrated itself in the referendum," Santos said Sunday night at the presidential palace.

But bringing Santos and Uribe together might be harder than achieving peace with the FARC. Santos served as Uribe's defense minister, when they worked together with the U.S. to drive the FARC to the edge of the jungles, but the two haven't spoken for years and frequently trade insults.

One of the reasons for the surprise defeat was low turnout, with only 37 percent of the electorate bothering to vote, a further sign to some analysts that Colombians' enthusiasm for the ambitious ac-

cord was lacking. Heavy rains from Hurricane Matthew especially dampened voting along the Caribbean coast, where the government's electoral machinery is strongest and the "yes" vote won by a double-digit margin.

While urban voters who were being leaned on to pay for the peace largely voted against the accord, the areas hardest hit by the conflict overwhelmingly endorsed it. In the town of Bojaya, where a FARC mortar attack on a church killed dozens of civilians in 2002, the 'yes' vote won with 96 percent of the vote.

The campaign exposed deep rifts in Colombian society, dividing many families and making clear the road to reconciliation would have been long and torturous even had the accord passed. Colombians overwhelmingly loathe the FARC, which the U.S. considers a terrorist group, and many considered the accord an insult to victims of the long-running conflict.

"In the end, hate toward the FARC won out over hope for the future," said Jason Marczack, an expert on Latin America at the Washington-based Atlantic Council. AP

Georgieva: UN would be inclusive with Eastern Europe woman chief

EUROPEAN commissioner Kristalina Georgieva, a latecomer to the race to be the next secretary-general, says being the first U.N. chief from Eastern Europe and the first woman to be the world's top diplomat would demonstrate the inclusiveness and universality of the United Nations.

But the Bulgarian diplomat and former World Bank vice-president said in an interview with The Associated Press ahead of her hearing in the General Assembly yesterday that it's the skills and determination she would bring to the job that count most.

"I am very clear in defining directions," Georgieva said. "I look forward with clarity. I am able to convince. I have my own convictions and I am able to carry people with me. And I have very strong managerial skills, proven, that I can get a job as hard as it may be, done."

The 63-year-old grandmo-

ther said there was "an element of surprise" when Bulgarian Prime Minister Boiko Borisov asked her to enter the race after deciding to drop the country's support from UNESCO chief Irina Bokova, a fellow Bulgarian who came in sixth of nine secretary-general candidates in the fifth informal poll in the U.N. Security Council on Sept. 26 which was led by former Portuguese Prime Minister Antonio Guterres.

"I gave it some thought becau-

se I recognized that it's so late in the process," Georgieva said. "But then, I also thought, 'If I don't run, how would I know if I have a shot or I don't?' To find out, I have to run."

Georgieva is currently vicepresident of the European Commission and its commissioner for budget and human resources. She formerly held the post of European commissioner for international cooperation, humanitarian aid and crisis response. Georgieva is currently VP of the European Commission and its commissioner for budget and human resources

Under the U.N. Charter, the secretary-general is elected by the General Assembly on the recommendation of the Security Council. In practice, this has meant that the five permanent council members with veto power — the U.S., Russia, China, Britain and France — have the final say. Ten candidates are vying to succeed Ban Ki-moon whose term ends on Dec. 31.


Since Borisov announced Georgieva's candidacy last week, there have been diplomatic rumblings about her late entry and the fact that Bulgaria now has two candidates.

Both Georgieva and Bokova will be on the ballot in the next informal poll tomorrow which is considered the most important so far. That's because it will be the first using different colored ballots to distinguish between the five permanent council members who have veto power and the 10 non-permanent members who don't.

As a late-comer to the contest, Georgieva acknowledges she is at a "disadvantage" because she has less time to introduce herself.

"My job is to put my best foot forward, and hope that I will be judged on merits and not on length of campaigning," she said in Saturday's interview during a break from preparing the question-and-answer session in the 193-member General Assembly, a hearing all the other candidates have gone through already. AP

INDONESIAN POLICE INVESTIGATE PORN ON PUBLIC VIDEO SCREEN

Police in Indonesia's capital are investigating the operator of a public video screen after it displayed a porn movie instead of advertising to passing traffic.

Ten people, including employees of the company operating the electronic billboard, have been questioned, Jakarta police spokesman Awi Setyono said yesterday. Police can't yet name a suspect, he added.

Twitter in social media-mad Indonesia was abuzz with news of the incident, which occurred not long after Friday prayers last week in the Muslim-majority country.

Many users posted clips of the billboard as it displayed a Japanese porn movie playing in an internet browser.

Adrian Wiedarta, a manager at PT Transito Adimanjati, which operates the advertising screen, blamed the incident on a hacker who he said seized control of the system, allowing the porn film to play for about five minutes.

Police assisted by nearby vendors shut off power to the giant video screen as drivers and pedestrians watched the movie. Setyono said the police's cybercrime unit has analyzed several computers seized from the company.

Jakarta police chief Muhammad Iriawan said the perpetrator could be charged under either the Electronic Transaction Law, which carries a maximum prison sentence of six years and a fine of 1 billion rupiah (USD77,000), or the Pornography Law, which carries a prison sentence of up to 12 years.





Scientists predict the metal sphere will eventually burn up in the atmosphere but they hope it will send important data back to Earth before doing so. The Soviet Union and the USA have both commit-

ted to launching satellites for research as part of the International Geophysical Year (IGY). Delegations from both countries' IGY commit-

tees were at a reception at the Russian embassy in Washington when news of Sputnik's launch came through.

The chairman of the American IGY committee, Dr Joseph Kaplan, congratulated the Russians on a "remarkable achievement".

The leader of the Russian delegation, Dr A A Blagonravov, who is believed to have been closely involved with the preparations for the launch, described Sputnik as "the simplest kind of baby moon".

He attributed its weight - 180lb (83.5kg) - largely to heavy batteries.

The satellite's weight has led some American experts to speculate that the rocket which launched it might also be capable of carrying a nuclear weapon thousands of miles.

The fact that Sputnik is expected to fly over the US seven times a day has also caused unease. There have already been calls for an immediate re-

view of US defences, given the implications of the technological leap ahead by a political enemy. But Dr Blagonravov said no-one had anything to

fear from the Soviet satellite programme. "It will keep everyone too busy watching the instruments to think about anything else," he said.

President Eisenhower has been informed of the Russian success. But he said the news would not lead the US to ac-

celerate its own satellite programme.

The first US launch is expected next month.

Sputnik transmitted information via radio signals to Soviet

scientists for three weeks The signals fascinated both radio enthusiasts and Western

Sputnik II was launched in November 1957 with a passenger aboard - a dog called Laika. The flight allowed Russian scientists to learn much about the prospects for human space

The Soviet authorities said Laika died painlessly after a week in orbit but in 2002 new evidence revealed the dog died from over-heating and panic just a few hours after take-off. In December 1957 the US programme suffered a setback when a rocket carrying a test satellite into space exploded.

Finally, in February 1958, the US successfully launched its first satellite, 'Explorer'. In 1961, the Soviet Union put the first human, Yuri Gagarin,

into space.

Tottenham hands Man City first loss in EPL; United frustrated

ANCHESTER City's winning start to the English Premier League is over—and the title favorites might just have seen close up their biggest rival for the trophy.

Producing a clinic in high-octane pressing, Tottenham hounded City into submission in a 2-0 victory at White Hart Lane that consigned Pep Guardiola to his first loss in 12 games. Six of those matches had come in the Premier League, and had been won at a canter.

It was the kind of all-round performance that Spurs produced for large spells of last season under Mauricio Pochettino before collapsing late on in their pursuit of eventual champion Leicester.

That was the first time Spurs contended for the league title in a generation and they are proving it wasn't just a one-off.

After seven games, secondplaced Tottenham is the only unbeaten team in the Premier League, still hasn't conceded a goal in open play and is now just one point behind City.

In a dominant first-half display, Tottenham went ahead through Aleksandar Kolarov's own goal in the ninth minute before Dele Alli added a second as City's defense was overwhelmed by the home team's energy and movement.

It could have been worse for City: Erik Lamela had a secondhalf penalty saved for Spurs in the second half.

City's much-lauded attack failed to score for the first time this season and its defense looked suspect, like it did in the 3-3 draw at Celtic in the Champions League. There are finally some cracks in City's teams for its title rivals to cling to.

Manchester United couldn't take advantage, only drawing 1-1 at home to struggling Stoke, but Arsenal scraped a 1-0 win at Burnley thanks to a scrambled goal with virtually the last touch of the game.

MAN U 1, STOKE 1

After opening with three straight victories, United has won only one of its last four games in the league and is already playing

catch-up.

Joe Allen earned a point for Stoke, scoring an 82nd-minute equalizer following a rare mistake by David de Gea. The United goalkeeper fumbled a long-range shot, Jon Walters scooped the loose ball against the bar before it bounced down for Allen to smash home from close range.

United took the lead in the 69th through Anthony Martial's curling strike, two minutes after he came on as a substitute. United is sixth with 13 points, five behind City at the top.

Stoke is still waiting for a first win of the season, but has ended its 13-game losing streak at Old Trafford stretching back 36 years.

BURNLEY 0, ARSENAL 1

The two minutes of injury time had almost elapsed at Turf Moor when Alexis Sanchez received a short corner and sent over a cross that Theo Walcott flicked on. Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain appeared to get a touch to the ball, which reared up off the hand of Laurent Koscielny — unintentionally — and squeezed over the line.

The match marked 20 years since Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger officially took charge of Arsenal, and a fifth straight league win lifted his team to third place — two points behind City.

LEICESTER o, SOUTHAMPTON o

It might all be about the Champions League for Leicester this season.

This draw meant Leicester has won just two of the opening seven games of its Premier League title defense. In their first-ever Champions League campaign, the Foxes have won both of their games — the latest coming against two-time European champion Porto on Tuesday.

Southampton created the better chances at King Power stadium, with in-form striker Charlie Austin hitting the post early on and wasting a one-on-one chance in the second half. **AP**

Zidane scrambling for answers after Madrid's early struggles

REAL Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane goes into the long international break with a lot of thinking to do.

While the hiatus leaves fans having to mull over the team's struggles a little longer, Zidane will be able to use the extra time off to find ways to get his squad back on track after four straight draws.

"It's my responsibility to look for solutions because we've got to change things. We can't carry on like this," Zidane said. "I'm not happy, that much is clear."

Madrid was held to a 1-1 draw by Eibar at the Santiago Bernabeu Stadium yesterday [Macau time], leaving the field jeered by fans. The team had already failed to beat Las Palmas and Villarreal in the Spanish league, as well as Borussia Dortmund in the Champions League. Its last win was at Espanyol on Sept. 18.

"We need to look for ways to improve and we'll do that after the international break by working hard. I believe in the work and the quality of this

team. I don't think attitude is the problem but something is wrong," Zidane said. "We've got 10 days without the players and when they come back we'll have to start working at 100 percent, not only physically but tactically as well. We need to work together."

Zidane said it's too early in the season to talk about a crisis, but admitted the team has to turn things around when it resumes playing in two weeks.

"After the start we had to the season, this is tough to take," he said. "I'm not going to lose my head but it's tough. We need to work harder and show more intensity at the beginning of games like we've done very often, but we're struggling to replicate that lately."

Madrid lost the league lead

to Atletico Madrid after this weekend's draw. Atletico, which won 2-0 at Valencia, also has 15 points, but leads Madrid on goal difference. Sevilla is third with 14 points, one more than Barcelona, which lost at Celta Vigo 4-3.

Zidane said he may have to "bring more intensity to the training sessions" to get his players playing hard from the start

Zidane has not been able to count on some players during the winless stretch, including left back Marcelo and defensive midfielder Casemiro, who are injured.

To add to Zidane's problems, playmaker James Rodriguez sustained a muscle injury while warming up the game against Eibar, and midfielder Luka Modric will be out for a while after undergoing arthroscopic surgery on his left knee.

Madrid's next chance to snap its winless streak is Oct. 15 at Real Betis, a team which has yet to lose at home. Madrid then hosts sixth-place Athletic Bilbao. AP **MOTORSPORTS**

Michael Shank's No. 60 wins Petit Le Mans

MICHAEL Shank Racing's No. 60 Honda-powered Liger sports car won the season -ending Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta this weekend, and the Action Express Racing's No. 31 Chevrolet Corvette Daytona Prototype took the season title.

John Pew, Oswaldo Negri, Jr. and endurance driver Olivier Pla teamed to win the 10-hour race, with the 60-year-old Pew making his final series appearance in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship.

"It's the best way to go out, but it also makes it very hard to go out," Pew said. "It makes it hard to quit. You really try to talk yourself into leaving and then something like this happens and you think, 'Maybe not.' I'll take a little time to reflect. It's been a fantastic 10 years, a lot with Ozz, and all with Michael Shank."

Dane Cameron, Eric Curran and guest driver Simon Pagenaud, the current Indy-Car champion, finished fourth to win the season title. Theyt beat their No. 5 Action Express Racing teammates, Joao Barbosa and Christian Fittipaldi,



who won the last two championships.

"It's truly unbelievable," Curran said. "It hasn't really sunk in yet. It's going to take some time. The whole team and Dane and I worked so hard all year. We came so close last year, but we pulled it together this year. It feels amazing, all the guys that work hard on the Action Express team, and the pit stops were unbelievable. Most importantly, it was a tough day today, but we got through it."

In the GT Le Mans class, the No. 62 Risi Competizione Ferrari 488 GTE of Giancarlo Fisichella, Toni Vilander and James Calado won the race, and the championship went to the No. 4 Chevrolet Corvette C7.R of Oliver Gavin, Tommy Milner and Marcel Fassler. **AP**

Umbrellas in the House

It looks like a kind of swampy unease has been spreading among Macau civil society. And it has been affecting everybody, indeed, from the traditional Legislative Assembly-based democrats, to the New Macau young democrats, labor representatives - not excluding the conservative pro-Beijing apparatus. The actual source of this (and I repeat) unease comes from not fully coping with the political standoff that took (and pardon us the generalization) eight Umbrella Movement seasoned activists from the road to the benches of the Hong Kong Legislative Council. The old guard of the Hong Kong pro-democracy activists and organizations, despite being sheltered under the cover of an umbrella - the pan-democrats umbrella - fear being on the fast track to obsolescence. The fact is that at the end of the hard fought civic campaign to further political rights - including the introduction of universal suffrage -, asked to show the goods, they just have the "same" 70-member quasi-parliament split of 35 from geographic constituencies and 35 from the functional constituencies: the "rotten borough" some would call it with assumed democratic disdain. The former are directly elected by the almost 4 million registered voters, while the special-interests' seats are chosen by almost 240,000 individuals, corporate or businesses. That is 6% of the population.

Anyway, from now on, Hong Kong politics, including moderate democrats, will be challenged by a generational shift towards a more confrontational stance, apparently immune to all the antics of co-optation that Beijing usually manipulates to maintain a tight leash on the political development chez HKSAR. The Nathan Law and friends show is just about to begin!

Back to Macau, the pro-democracy movement is trying its own way to digest the asymmetry between their Hong Kong counter-parts' political game (localism, complete autonomy, selfdetermination, and Basic Law forbid independence) and the corresponding measures the establishment takes to fight the activists and their demands of political concessions, and the equivalent panorama in the Macau Special Administrative Region.

Despite the mellow (Legislative Assembly will keep on having the same composition for the next five years) situation in Macau, Scott Chiang, Jason Chao and Co have a lot to complain about the government, the law enforcement, the law and so on. They learned their lessons from the civil referendum, and later from the panda cubs' naming referendum.

Imagination and cooperation seem to be the key for those who have been showing respect for democratic values. Macau Civil Servants Association is about to launch what they call a "public survey" to question residents about the performance of the Chief Executive and the need to increase the number of additional directly-elected legislators from two to four for the 2017 elections. However, it is not an open consultation, since it restricts itself to a closed universe of 3000 phone calls, thus not incurring in any breach of the Data Protection provisions. Pereira Coutinho did it again.

Finally, two notes on gaming and reading. With not such a great omen offered by MGTO's visitor forecast during the Golden Week, Citigroup has degraded the September GGR forecast. But we should highlight two situations: a fresh case of side betting and disturbance in a VIP room, calling attention on the possibility of the financing and profit distribution to be diverting from the traditional pro rata basis; and the first steps DICJ Paulo Chan is taking to curb the entrance of croupiers to the gaming floor... to gamble themselves.

As to the reading, the New Central Library threatens to replace the Hotel Estoril as the urban narrative of the day. But we can have a two in one: lawmaker Tommy Lau has suggested replacing the Old Court building by...the Hotel Estoril.

CHINA, DENMARK PROJECTS AMONG ARCHITECTURE AWARD WINNERS

A children's center in China, a bridge in Iran and a park in Denmark are among the six winners of the Aga Khan Award for Architecture.

The winners were announced yesterday in the United Arab Emirates city of Al Ain. The awards are handed out once every three years and are meant to celebrate architecture that serves and embraces Muslim culture.

The network is headed by Aga Khan, the spiritual leader of millions of Ismaili Muslims who belong to an offshoot of the Shiite sect.

Two projects from Bangladesh also won the award — a community center and a mosque. The sixth winner was a university building in Lebanon by the firm of Iraqi-British architect Zaha Hadid who died earlier this year.

PHILIPPINES The Asian Development Bank has signed an agreement with the Swedish International Development **Cooperation Agency** (SIDA) on a risk-transfer scheme under which SIDA will guarantee USD155 million out of ADB's \$455 million basket of five loans to India a first for a sovereign loan portfolio for any multilateral development bank, the ADB announced yesterday.

VIETNAMESE authorities say they've seized 309 kilograms of elephant tusks illegally imported from Nigeria. A customs official says the tusks were seized at Hanoi's airport on the weekend. The official said yesterday that the cargo had been declared as glass.

TURKEY announced that it is extending a three-month-long state of emergency, declared after the country's failed military coup, by a further three months as it presses ahead with a massive crackdown on a movement led by U.S.based cleric Fethullah Gulen.
